MAIL THOSE CHRISTMAS PARCELS

The Defense Department says Christmas parcels for members of the armed services overseas should be mailed between October 15th and November 15th.

In addition, the Defense Department makes certain recommendations for those who intend to send large packages. All boxes addressed to Army or Fleet post-offices must not exceed seventy pounds in weight.

For air parcels, the Department says they are not to exceed two pounds, or thirty inches around.

1 tablespoon butter
3 cups whole pitted cherries
1/2 cup sugar

Mix flour, baking powder and salt. Cut in shortening. Add milk. Pat out 1/2 inch on floured board. Pour into greased casserole, dot with butter. Cover with dough. Press well against sides. Cover casserole. Steam 45 minutes. Serve hot with hard sauce.
