Thieves Get \$1000 From **Bowling Alley**

Cash loot of approximately \$1,000 was taken from the King Pin Bowl. ing Alleys at Campbellsport early Friday morning by burglars who broke open a rear door to enter the establishment. It was the second major burglary at the place since Aug. 10.

According to Sheriff George J Lemieux of Fond du Lac county the burglars carted off a threefoot-square safe from the office, taking it into a field between Campbellsport and Kewaskum. There the burglars punched out the bottom of the safe and stole the contents-\$980 in cash.

Before leaving, the thieves also broke open the coin containers in the juke box, cigaret and pin ball machines, taking money which raised the loot to \$1,000 or more, according to an estimate by Steve Salaja, who operates the alleys.

The state crime laboratory staff was called in by the sheriff to help investigate, and the safe was to be taken to Madison for analysis by lab specialists.

The dial on the safe had been damaged, the sheriff reported. It had been broken off by burglars who entered the place on Aug. 10. At that time, the loot consisted of \$250 worth f snap-on tools, \$110 worth of cigarets, cigars, cognac and whiskey, and money from the juke box and other coin machines,

The intruders apparently deemed the safe too heavy to cart away at that time. The safe was kept on top of a table in the office. The sheriff and an assistant lifted the safe to determine whether two men could carry it and found that it was all two men could do to lift it.
