## Thieves Get \$1000 From Bowling Alley

Cash loot of approximately \$1,000 was taken from the King Pin Bowling Alleys at Campbellsport early Friday morning by burglars who broke open a rear door to enter the establishment. It was the second major burglary at the place since Aug. 10.

According to Sheriff George J. Lemieux of Fond du Lac county the burglars carted off a three-foot-square safe from the office, taking it into a field between Campbellsport and Kewaskum. There the burglars punched out the bottom of the safe and stole the contents—\$980 in cash.

Before leaving, the thieves also broke open the coin containers in the juke box, cigaret and pin ball machines, taking money which raised the loot to \$1,000 or more, according to an estimate by Steve Salaja, who operates the alleys.

The state crime laboratory staff was called in by the sheriff to help investigate, and the safe was to be taken to Madison for analysis by lab specialists.

The dial on the safe had been damaged, the sheriff reported. It had been broken off by burglars who entered the place on Aug. 10. At that time, the loot consisted of \$250 worth of snap-on tools, \$110 worth of cigarets, cigars, cognac and whiskey, and money from the juke box and other coin machines.

The intruders apparently deemed the safe too heavy to cart away at that time. The safe was kept on top of a table in the office. The sheriff and an assistant lifted the safe to determine whether two men could carry it and found that it was all two men could do to lift it.

Kahrs will officiate and burial will be in the Dundee cemetery. Military rites will be conducted at the grave.

## Milwaukee Beagle Club Holds Annual Field Trial Here

Kewaskum is gaining a wide reputation as a mecca for beagle hound fanciers of Wisconsin and neighboring states. Recently the Wisconsin Beagle club held their annual four-day field trial and show in Kewaskum and last week end the Milwaukee Beagle club held a four-day trial here. Joe Eberle, president of the Wisconsin club for 25 years, is the genial host to the beagle lovers, who also hold spring derby trials at Kewaskum.

The trial last Thursday through Sunday had an entry of more than 100 beagles from various parts of the country. It was the 11th annual meeting of the club and interest in the trials is increasing each year that the popular hounds, No. 1 favorite of dog lovers, are held. Reasons for the popularity of the beagle are that there still are plenty of cottontail rabbits to run and the dogs require little attention and training.

Eberle, nationally known breeder of prize winning and champion beagles, reports that the Wisconsin club is the oldest in the state. It has been operating since 1929 and has been rapidly growing in popularity.

Records of the week end meet are not available as the "bookkeepers" took the results along home with them. However, Eberle's Lawyer, which took second in the state club trial, also copped second again in the Milwaukee club meet. Lawyer has been a consistent winner although still a young dog of a year and a half. The dog has won three seconds and a first place in the field as well as a state derby championship.
