## Delbert Haack Is Outstanding Senior Ag Student

RECEIVES \$200 SHORT COURSE SCHOLARSHIP GIVEN BY BANK; CARL MEYER ALTERNATE

Delbert Haack, son of Mr. and Mrs. Hilbert Haack, Route 1, Kewaskum, has been chosen the DeKalb winner and with that honor, also has been named the outstanding vocational agriculture senior student, it was announced this week by O. E. Behnke, Kewaskum High school vocational agriculture instructor.

Delbert is the second agriculture student eligible to receive the \$200 short course scholarship given by the Bank of Kewaskum.

Carl Meyer, son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Meyer, Kewaskum, was named the alternate to receive the scholarship in case Delbert is unable to make use of it.

Last year Jerome Nigh was the outstanding senior agricultural student and the first to receive the scholarship. Jerome graduated from the first year short course at the university on March 10, with excellent grades, and is contemplating going back for the second year.

Delbert Haack is the sixth senior student to receive the outstanding award since the department was started in 1951. The others were Jerome Nigh, Carl Koepke, William Haack, Ronald Couiter, and Sylvester Hawig.

## Spring Election On Tuesday; No Contest Locally

Spring election will be held next Tuesday, April 3, and the polls will be open from 9 a. m. to 5:30 p. m.

Only officers to be elected in the village are three trustees. There will be no contest as the three incumbents, Arvin Merwin, Carl F. Schaefer and Marvin Schaefer, are unopposed for re-election.

On the state level, voters will be casting their ballots for a justice of supreme court with Thomas E. Fairchild and William H. Dieterich contesting for the supreme court vacancy.

Four referendum issues will also be placed before voters in the Spring election.

No doubt the most important one is the referendum on an "unlimited term" of office for sheriffs in Wisconsin. At present Wisconsin limits the terms of office of sheriffs to two consecutive terms. The proposed amendment would permit a sheriff to run for office every two years and hold office as often as he can become elected.

Another referendum would amend the present state constitution to permit the payment of increased benefits for retired teachers who are now receiving benefits.

A third resolution would amend the state constitution to permit communities which acquire lands for public purposes or permanent improvements to use such land for other purposes or to return it to the donors.

A fourth referendum would remove further existing restrictions on the use of railroad passes, franks or privileges for former railroad employees and other officials granted such privileges even though they enter political life as public officials.

Voters will also have an opportunity to elect delegates to the national conventions of the Republican and Democratic parties. Two slates of delegates are offered by the Republicans. One is headed by President Dwight D. Eisenhower and the other by John Chapple. On the Democratic ticket Estes Kefauver heads the ticket as the candidate for president with a complete list of delegates-at-large.

## Bird Trucking Co. Sold to Business Firm at Waupun

The Bird Trucking company of Kewaskum was sold recently by Mr. and Mrs. Wm. F. Schaefer to a group of Waupun men. Operations of the company were moved to Waupun where the new group took over on Monday, March 19.

Heading the Waupun company is Wilbert Jeffords as president, Roy Reabe is vice-president and William McRobert is secretary-treasurer.

The office equipment was moved from Kewaskum into the Waupun building at 435½ E. Main st. and will be the headquarters for the company.

The Bird Trucking company had 20 units, including trucks and semi-trailers, with a franchise to haul into Chicago from this area, but not Milwaukee. The company hauled largely canned goods and groceries.

The Schaefers retained the Schaefer and Aunt Nellie trucking business which they also own and operate.

Some 15 drivers and other employees connected with the trucking company are now working out of Waupun. Some of them and their families will probably move to that city.

The theatre will continue to run two shows on Friday at 7 and 9 p. m. and two shows on Saturday at 7 and 9, with a complete change on Sunday with shows at 2, 7 and 9 p. m.

Heiskanen has been a lifelong resident of Milwaukee but will move his family to Kewaskum in July when he expects to keep the theatre open six nights a week. His daughter Judith Nita, 17, and son James Nels, 13, will assist him in the operation.

The new operator has had 17 years experience in managing grocery super markets and six years as salesman and supervisor in wholesale foods. Although his sister owned a theatre he confesses he has much to learn.

Local businessmen have promised to give their full support in helping to boost the Kewaskum theatre. Heiskanen is grateful for everyone's support and looks forward to becoming a member of our fine community.

Heiskanen came to Kewaskum about four weeks ago to look over the theatre operation. He was quite interested and after several week end visits of checking into details with the Kewaskum Theatre Corporation officers, a deal was made whereby he will take over the theatre.

The Village Board of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin met in regular monthly meeting with President James Reigle presiding and all board members present.

The minutes of the previous meetings were approved upon motion by M. Schaefer, seconded by J. Eberle and duly carried.

Upon motion by C. Schaefer, seconded by J. Eberle and carried, the McMahan Engineering Co. were retained to draw the preliminary plans for the proposed possible improvement of U. S. Highway 45 (Fond du Lac Ave).

Purchase of necessary equipment requested by Police Chief Pledl for the Civil Defense Auxiliary Police members was approved upon motion by C. Schaefer, seconded by J. Stelpflug and duly carried.

The McWane Cast Iron Pipe Co. was awarded the contract for the furnishing of 2000 ft. of 6" cast iron Mechanical Joint water main for the quoted price of \$1.89 per ft. upon motion by W. Tessar, seconded by J. Eberle and duly carried.

Resolution No. 56-1, authorizing the sale of a portion of village land lying between the river and Highway "S" (East Water Street) was introduced by Trustee M. Schaefer. Motion was made by A. Marwin and seconded by C. Schaefer that said resolution shall be adopted. Upon roll call, all Trustee members voted "Aye". President Reigle abstained from voting. Said resolution was declared adopted.

Upon motion by J. Eberle, seconded by J. Stelpflug and carried, all bills and wages as approved and recommended by the Finance Committee were allowed for payment.

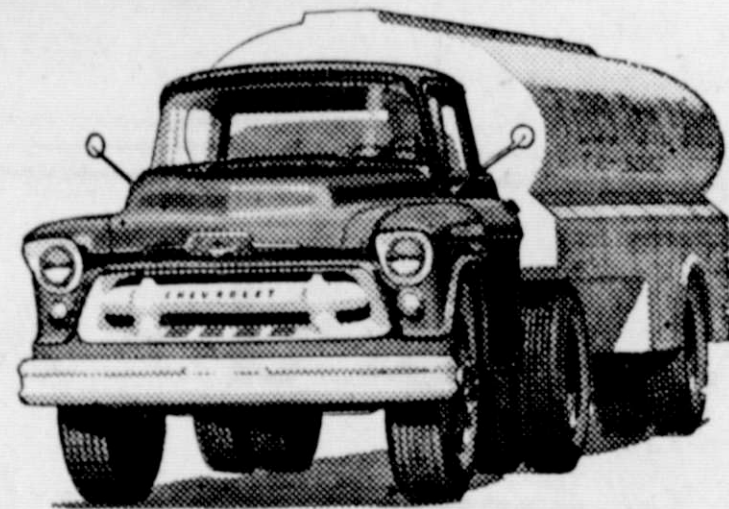

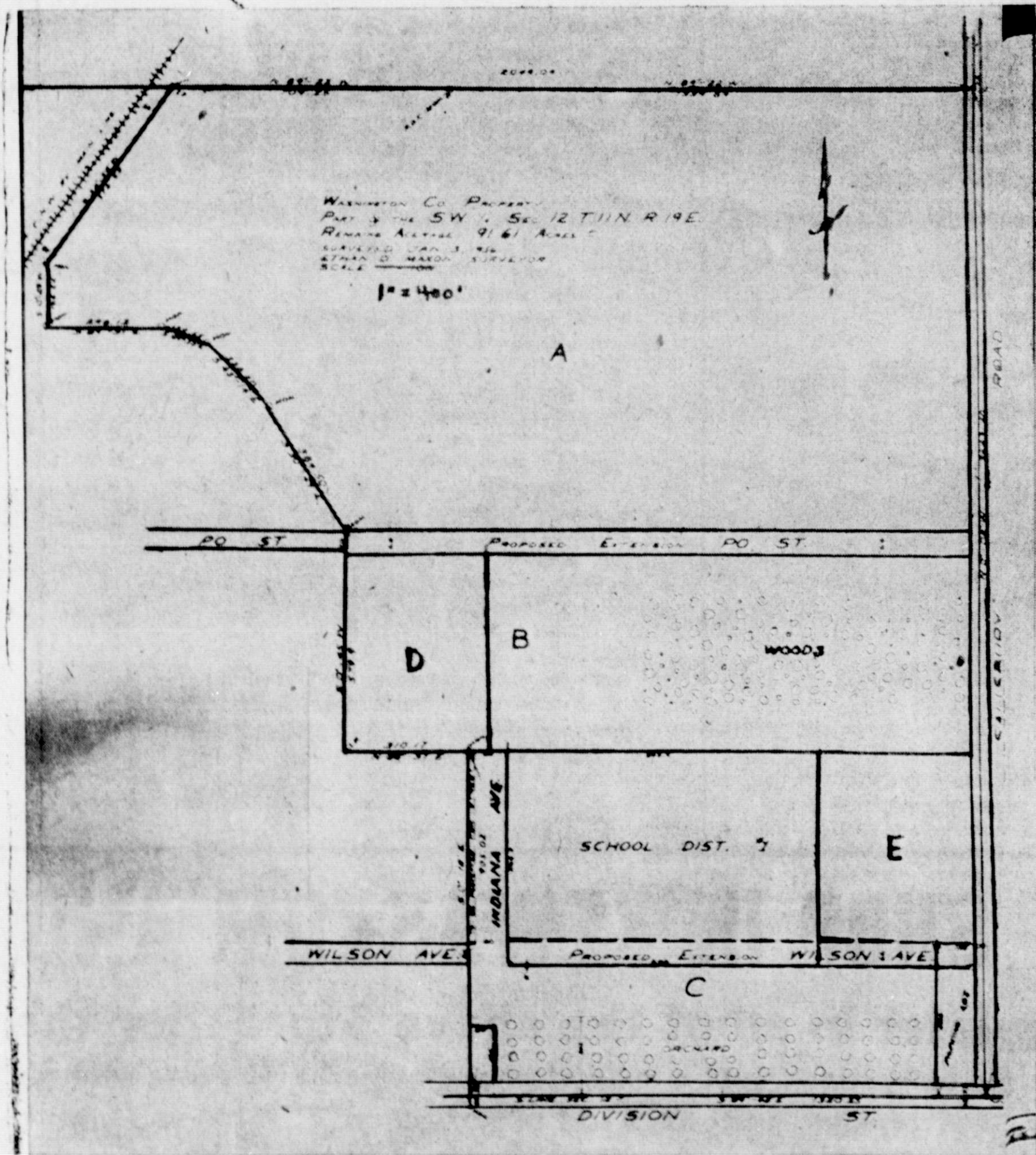

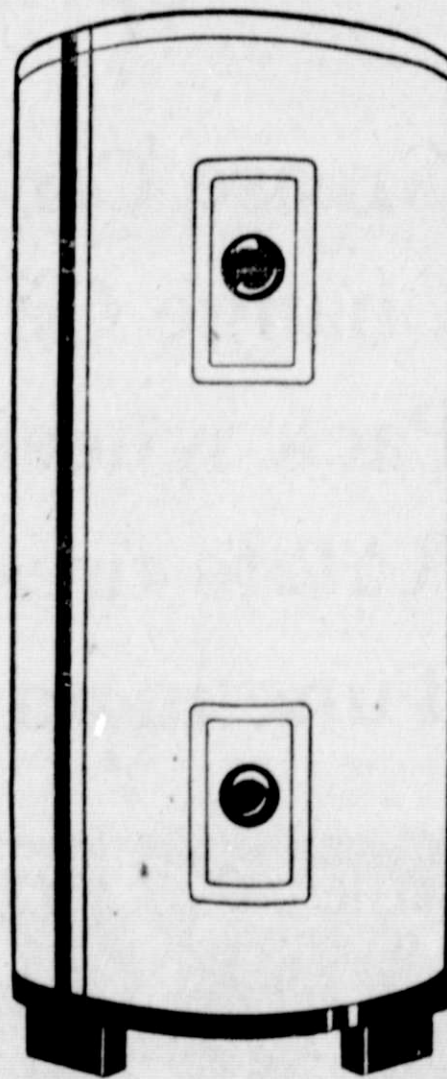
