## Foerster Attending Badger Boys State

Boys State, an American Legion sponsored event, brings boys, selected by their school faculties, to Ripon to form and operate a mythical "49th State." Upon arrival, boys are separated into two mythical parties, "Nationalist" and "Federalist," and from here commence to form city, county and state governments. Boys campaign for the various offices, and upon election, proceed to handle the duties and functions of the various offices.

Climax of the eight-day event was held Thursday evening, June 14, when the newly elected governor was inaugurated. The oath of office was administered by Justice George R. ## Cyclist Critically Hurt in Accident

Donald Klumb, 28, of R. 3, West Bend, suffered a basal skull fracture and broken leg and was still unconscious on Wednesday of this week at St. Joseph's hospital, West Bend, as the result of a motorcycle-auto collision last Thursday morning.

Klumb, who is employed in the machinery department at L. Rosenheimer in Kewaskum, was on his way to work when his motorcycle was struck by a car driven by Wilmer Schmidt, 22, of R. 2, Kewaskum. Schmidt was arrested for not having a driver's license and on a charge that was held open until Klumb's condition could better be determined.

The mishap occurred at 6:45 a. m. Thursday one-half mile north of Kohlsville on County Trunk W. Klumb's motorcycle was coming out of a side road from the east and turning north on W when it was hit by Schmidt's southbound vehicle.

Although Klumb was critically injured, hope is still being held out for his recovery. His motorcycle was demolished.

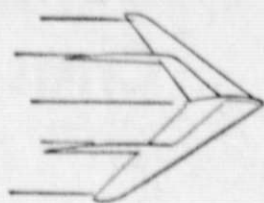
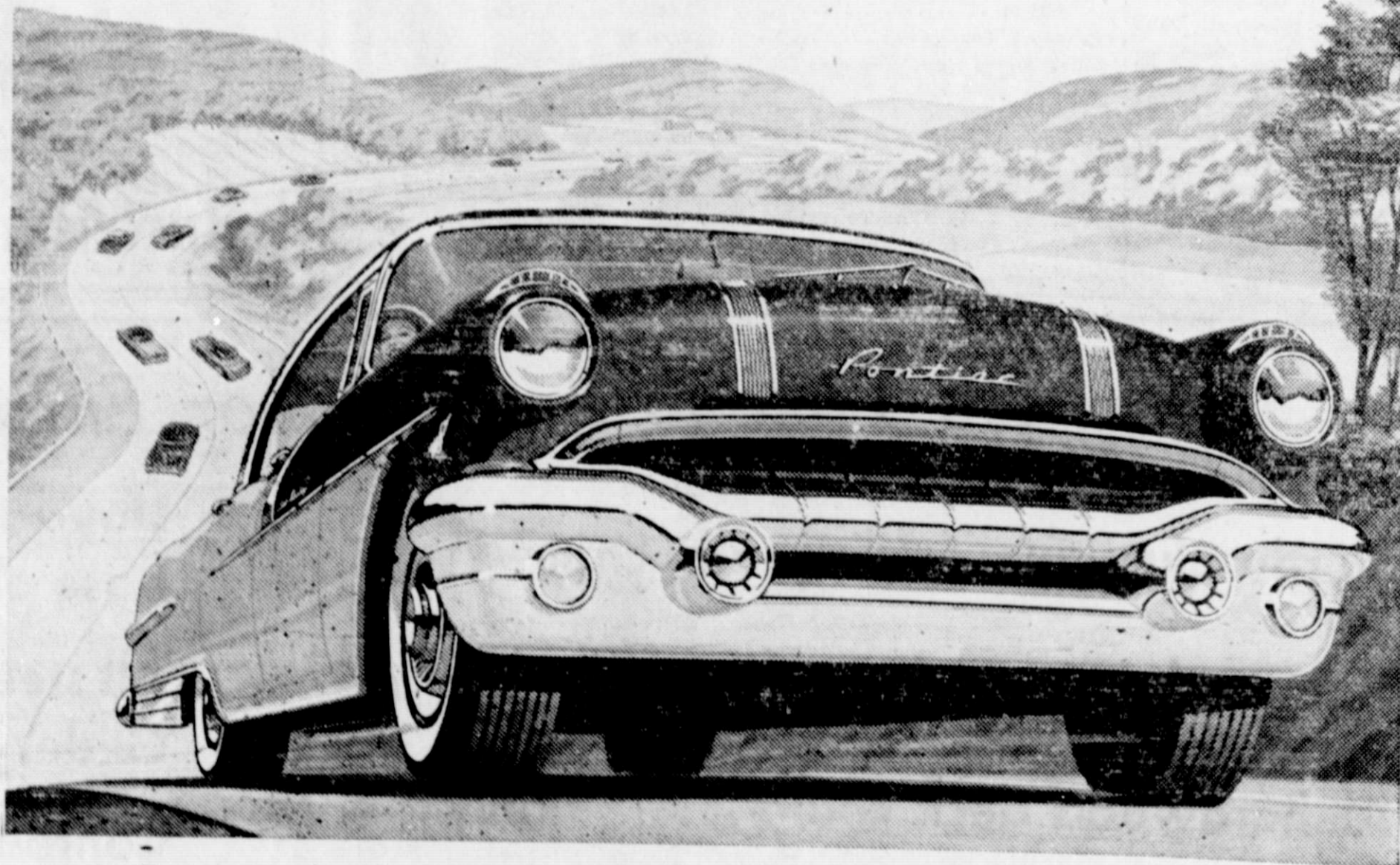

### ACCIDENT EMPHASIZES NEED FOR MODEL PLANE AND KITE FLYING SAFETY

According to G. P. Strodthoff, Wisconsin Electric Power Company manager at West Bend, a near-tragic accident which occurred recently at West Bend provides an object lesson which may save the lives of youngsters in this area who

enjoy flying model airplanes or kites.

On May 21, a 15 year old West Bend youth narrowly escaped electrocution when the model gasoline plane he was flying struck one of the company's high voltage wires. Electricity was transmitted to the youth through a wire he was using to control the model plane. The youth was knocked to the ground and suffered first and second degree burns to his right hand and the bottoms of both feet. The effect of the charge was so great that it actually burned the socks off both feet of the youngster.

Fortunately, the lad is now recovering from his frightening experience but he is lucky indeed that

he escaped death by electrocution. Strodthoff says that the charge could very easily have been a fatal one. He says, "Parents may very well save the lives of their children by insisting that they fly model planes or kites only in areas where electric power lines are not present."

He said that the hobby of flying kites and model airplanes can be enjoyed safely only if four important safety rules are strictly adhered to: 1. Keep kites away from electric wires and television antennas. 2. Use dry cotton string, NOT metal. 3. Never use metal on kites or kite tails. 4. Never climb poles at any time.
