

# **Couple Passing 2 Bad Checks Here Arrested**

### YOUNG MARRIED PAIR CASHES \$1,000 IN WORTHLESS CHECKS IN TWO COUNTIES

A young married couple from Holy Cross, R. 1, Belgium, in Ozaukee county, both former residents of this community, were arrested Tuesday afternoon on charges of passing worthless checks, two of which were cashed in Kewasleum stores.

The couple, Mr. and Mrs. Burke Weston, both 18, are the parents of two boys, one six weeks old and the other 13 months. They were arrest. ed following a determined effort by the sheriff's department to round them up. Undersheriff Al Schmidt was waiting at the couple's home with one of the victims of the bad checks to identify them when the couple was picked up in West Bend after their car was spotted there. The work of Traffic Officer David Backhaus of Kewaskum was instrumental in solving the forgeries. Confronted with the evidence, the couple admitted passing worthless checks totaling approximately

\$1,000 in Washington and Ozaukee counties. The checks ranged in amount from \$50 to \$75. The couple said they turned to passing bad checks when they got involved in financial difficulties beyond their ability to pay.
