Mrs. D. M. Rosenheimer Dies; Active in Club, Church Work

Mrs. David M. (Lena) Rosenheimer, 80, of Kewaskum, a civic leader in the community, who was very active in club and church work, and an artist and musician of note, passed away at 4:15 p. m. on Saturday, Aug. 4, at St. Joseph's hospital, West Bend.

Mrs. Rosenheimer was taken ill at her Big Cedar lake home on Wednesday evening and was removed to the hospital at the time. Earlier the same afternoon she had played cards at the West Bend Country club with friends.

Mrs. Rosenheimer observed her 80th birthday last Dec. 12 with an open house for her relatives and many friends.

A charter member of the Random Lake, Cedarburg and Kewaskum Woman's club, she also served as the first president of the Kewaskum club and helped in the organization of the Random Lake and Cedarburg clubs.

She was instrumental in organizing the Cedarburg and Kewaskum libraries and was a member of the library board for a number of years here. One of Mrs. Rosenheimer's paintings hangs in the new Kewaskum library. She took a keen interest and judged local art in the public schools.

Mrs. Rosenheimer directed the senior choir of the Peace E and R church and organized the junior choir in the same parish, which she also directed for many years. Before the regular music curriculum was organized in the local schools, Mrs. Rosenheimer assisted with the school music programs.

The well known woman was a member of Peace church and its Ladies Guild, and served as church organist for many years. She was an officer of the Federated Women's clubs of America, a member of the Eastern Star, the Royal Neighbors of America and the West Bend Country club.

Mrs. Rosenheimer was the widow of David Rosenheimer, who operated the store in Kewaskum which bears the family name. He also organized several banks in the area and was active in other business ventures. He predeceased her about 20 years ago.

A daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Moritz Rosenheimer, she was born on Dec. 12, 1875 in Kewaskum. Her marriage took place on Jan. 25, 1899.

They were the parents of six children, one of whom, Mark David, passed away. Surviving are Elmo L. of Cedar Lake, Ralph M. of Shorewood, Henry B. of Kewaskum, Retha Jane (Mrs. Robert Mason) of Chicago, Ill. and Cumberland, Wis. and Doris Mae (Mrs. Harold Blake) of Kirkland, Ill.

Other survivors include 12 grandchildren, one great-grandchild, and two sisters, Clara (Mrs. Ralph Elmergreen) and Emma (Mrs. Frank Lambeck), both of Milwaukee. A brother, Lehman Rosenheimer, passed away several years ago.

The body was in state at the Miller Funeral home after 2 p. m. Monday. Funeral services were held at 2 p. m. Tuesday, Aug. 7, at the Peace E and R church, the Rev. F. L. Rodenbeck officiating. Burial was in the Rosenheimer cemetery

Local Blood Donors Give at West Bend

In a record-smashing effort that topped the quota of 350 pints, Washington county and West Bend residents came to the aid of their Community Blood donor club Thursday and Friday. The two-day mobile unit, was held in the West Bend High school gym and a total of 354 persons donated blood, including 22 from Kewaskum.

The success of the clinic was vitally important since the reserve in the Community Blood Donor club bank was completely depleted for about a week. The 91 first time donors set a record.

The number of donors from communities besides the 22 from Kewaskum included 199 from West Bend, 70 from West Bend R. R., 35 from Barton, 12 from Allenton, 4 from Jackson, 1 from Slinger, 2 from Campbellsport, 1 from Cascade, 1 from Adell, 1 from Theresa, 1 from Richfield, and 1 from Hartford.

Local Residents Hurt in Mishaps; Youths Arrested

Joseph J. Staehler, 44, of R. 1, Kewaskum, sustained a cut over his right eye Tuesday morning when his truck was struck by a truck driven by Mrs. Elroy Kutz, 20, of R. 3, West Bend. The mishap occurred on Hwy. 28 about a block east of St. Michaels. The crash occurred as Staehler made a right turn into a driveway. Mrs. Kutz was operating a vehicle without a driver's license and her husband permitted an unauthorized person to drive.

Couple Passing 2 Bad Checks Here Arrested

YOUNG MARRIED PAIR CASHES \$1,000 IN WORTHLESS CHECKS IN TWO COUNTIES

A young married couple from Holy Cross, R. 1, Belgium, in Ozaukee county, both former residents of this community, were arrested Tuesday afternoon on charges of passing worthless checks, two of which were cashed in Kewaskum stores.

The couple, Mr. and Mrs. Burke Weston, both 18, are the parents of two boys, one six weeks old and the other 13 months. They were arrested following a determined effort by the sheriff's department to round them up. Undersheriff Al Schmidt was waiting at the couple's home with one of the victims of the bad checks to identify them when the couple was picked up in West Bend after their car was spotted there. The work of Traffic Officer David Backhaus of Kewaskum was instrumental in solving the forgeries.

Confronted with the evidence, the couple admitted passing worthless checks totaling approximately \$1,000 in Washington and Ozaukee counties. The checks ranged in amount from \$50 to \$75. The couple said they turned to passing bad checks when they got involved in financial difficulties beyond their ability to pay.

When apprehended Mrs. Weston had a wallet with \$3.99 in cash in her possession. She was identified by Barney Strobel of Wayne, who was one of the persons victimized by the pair. A description of the couple, their car and a partial description of the license plates on the vehicle led to their arrest.

Following their arrest, the couple was taken to the county jail. Mrs. Weston was later transferred to the Ozaukee county jail for lodging Tuesday night as state law prohibits housing women prisoners in the Washington county jail as it does not meet state standards.

Both Weston and his wife were bound over to county court Wednesday afternoon when they were arraigned before Justice of the Peace Deane Baseom on charges of forgery. They waived their rights to a preliminary hearing and bond was set at \$2,500 each pending their appearance in county court. They will be held in jail as they did not furnish bond.

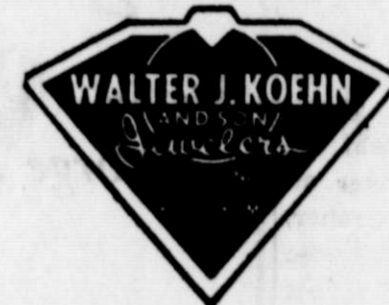

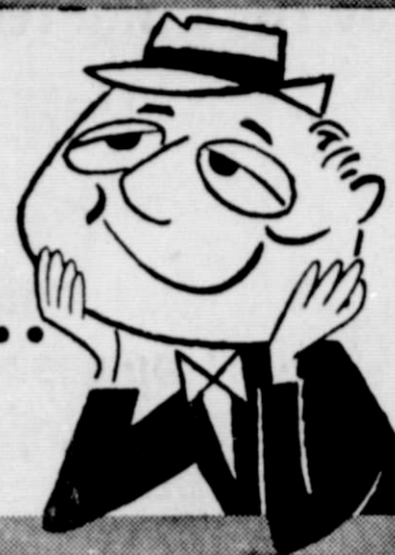
WEST BEND BRAVES BEAT KEWASKUM PUDDLES TEAM
