## Chevs Handed First Loss at West Bend in Upset; Tied for Lead

A victory that would have clinched at least a tie for the first half championship in the Lakes circuit went right out of the window as the Kewaskum Chevs were upset by two points, 76-74, in a close one played on the Lithia floor Sunday evening. The setback was the first one this season for the Chevrolets, who had won seven straight previously to soar into undisputed first place.

The team and fans alike were relieved when the Chevs got past Mayville the week before to move into the lead. The remaining games in this half with West Bend and Horicon were not considered too much of an obstacle but you never know on West Bend's floor, where the Lithias are at their best against Kewaskum and the Chevs usually let down and have a lot of trouble.

The defeat dropped the team into a three-way tie for first place with Mayville and Hartford. Each has won seven and lost one and the race is wide open again. Mayville was idle last week end and Hartford beat Fox Lake to also get into the running. One of these two will be eliminated this week end when Hartford meets Mayville. The winner will then be tied for the first half title with the Chevs if they can win at Horicon Sunday night.

West Bend was a hot team Sunday, five of their players combining to flip in baskets from all angles. On the other hand the Chevs were way off in their shooting, missing a great many shots, lots of them right under the basket. Even Johnny Tessar, who is deadly under the basket, missed a number of layup shots. The poor shooting is born out by the fact that George Hanrahan and Don Meisenheimer, two of the team's other big scorers, could not hit anything. Meisy ended up only two points and big George with five to reach lows for the season.

The Chevs did make a valiant try and put on a sensational rally in the final quarter to almost pull the game out of the fire. Believe it or not Kewaskum was behind by 21 points, 60-39, going into the final period. The Lithias held this advantage about midway through the quarter when the Chevs turned to a pressing game and repeatedly made the Lithias throw the ball away or stole it from them. They suddenly started to hit the basket and crept to within two points of the winners when time ran out with West Bend desperately trying to hang onto the ball. Given another half minute or so the Chevs almost assuredly would have won the contest.

West Bend played a race horse style of basketball and the Chevs, ordinarily a deliberate, set shot outfit, tried to keep pace with them. Had they slowed down the pace to their desired speed or started, the pressing, rushing game earlier they would have won without a doubt. The Lithias got off to a sizable 20-10 lead in the first quarter but Kewaskum closed the gap to 33-29 at the intermission. The Lithias then ran wild in the third stanza to swish in 27 points while a bewildered Kewaskum five was held to 10. This gave the winners their 21

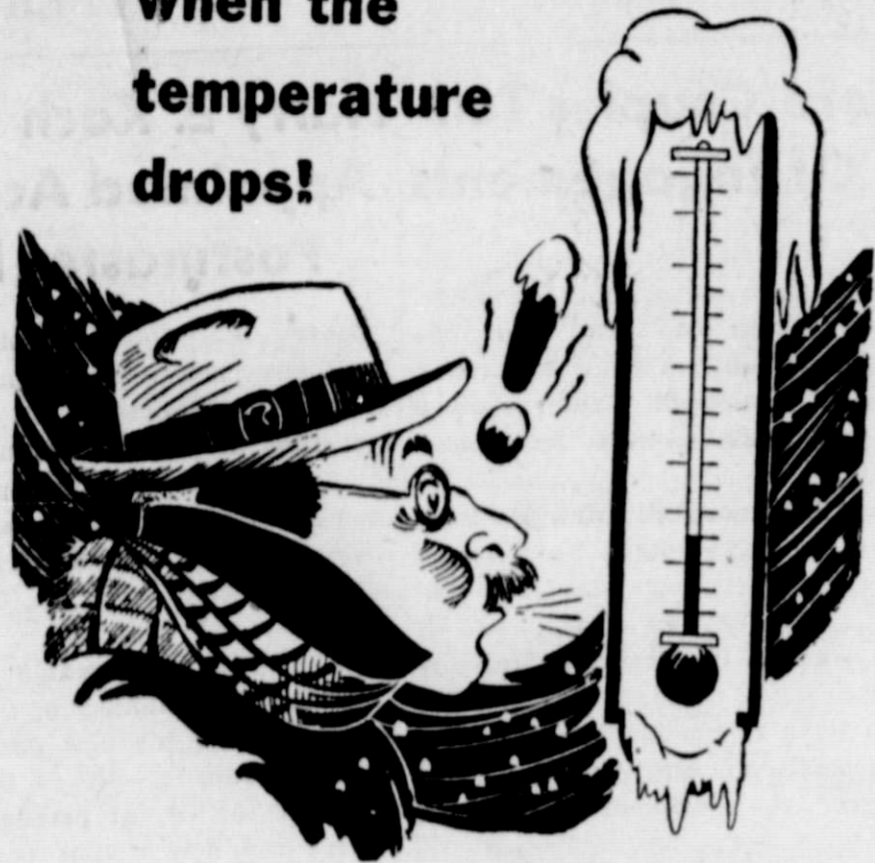

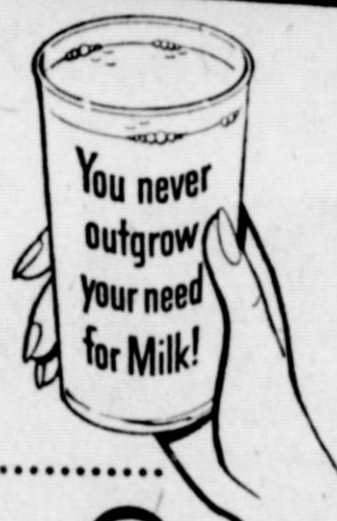
