## Bells Forfeit Game After Player Is Hit in Head By Pitched Ball

The Campbellsport - Kewaskum Lakes game here Sunday afternoon ended abruptly after only three innings of play when Donald Kohn, 20, of the Bells was hit in the head by a pitched ball thrown by the Chev pitcher, Dave Mertzig. As a result of the injury to Kohn, Campbellsport was short of players and was forced to forfeit the game to Kewaskum, which was ahead at the time, 2-0.

Kohn, a grandson of Mr. and Mrs. Matt Kohn of Kewaskum, was leadoff batter in the fourth inning when he was hit by Mertzig's pitch, which he failed to duck. He turned slightly and the ball struck him above the left ear. Kohn was knocked unconscious and dropped to the ground. He regained consciousness after a few minutes but was not moved from the spot where he fell.

A local physician was called immediately and he examined the injured player, who was then placed in the Kewaskum firemen's ambulance to be taken to St. Agnes hospital, Fond du Lac, for X-rays. When he showed improvement Kohn was removed instead to his home in Campbellsport where a physician from that village treated him. It was reported Monday that Kohn suffered a severe concussion.

Campbellsport had only nine players present for the tilt. When Kohn was removed in the ambulance one of his teammates accompanied him and that left them with seven. Besides neither the Bell or Kewaskum players felt like continuing the contest after the accident happened to Kohn.

The win on a forfeit moved the Chevs back into third place in the standings with a record of 9 wins and 6 losses. They regained third as a result of Random Lake's loss to West Bend Friday night. Mertzig, who had a tryout with the Milwaukee Braves recently, had a shutout going up until the game was called.

The Chevs were scheduled to play Random Lake here Thursday night. They have no game scheduled for this Sunday but the following Sunday, Aug. 18, they will play a night game at home against league leading West Bend. Plan to see this attraction under the lights. The Lithias moved into first place by beating Sheboygan Sunday.

## Three Polio Cases in Area Are Reported

Three cases of polio, the first of the season in the Kewaskum area, were reported on Wednesday by Dr. R. G. Edwards, health officer.

Two of those stricken with polio are the sons of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Erickson of near St. Michaels, in the town of Scott. They are Dennis, 8, who became ill on Monday and his brother, Niles, 7, whose illness was diagnosed as polio on Tuesday.

The third is Michael McCluskey, 8, son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond McCluskey, Milwaukee, who became ill with the disease on Tuesday while vacationing at Forest lake.

All three of the boys were removed to Johnson Municipal Isolation Ward in Milwaukee. Although very ill, none of the three have suffered any paralysis up to this time. This can probably be attributed to the fact that the McCluskey boy had three polio injections and the Erickson lads each had two shots.
