> The hauling will necessitate two separate pickups by Campbellsport village employees but will eliminate spoiled foodstuffs and wastes from being dumped at the Campbellsport dump. Having the garbage burned at Kewaskum is expected to eliminate the rat infestation and strong odors at that village's dump.

Kewaskum has agreed to dispose of Campbellsport's garbage in the local incinerator for a price of \$5.50 per load and it is estimated that about six loads a week will be trucked here.
