## Village President Reports to Kiwanians on Village Progress

At Monday evening's meeting of the Kewaskum Kiwanis club, Village President James D. "Jim" Reigle reported to club members on the progress made in our little city during the past few years. His report pointed out reasons why we in Kewaskum should be proud of the progress we have made, of the projects we have completed, of the facilities we have made available, and of the new public buildings we have constructed.

President Reigle's report in part is as follows:

"We have a mighty fine community made up of some very wonderful people, but we need someone, a lot of people in fact, who are willing to talk about Kewaskum every day, day in and day out. To sell our village over and over again. To boost it in every possible way and at every opportunity.

"Unfortunately, it seems that those who are most vocal seem to be the people who can see only the mistakes, only the dark side, only the bad things that happen. We have no hope of eliminating this element completely, however, we can overpower them with the truth, with the honest picture and with the whole story.

"If we will but present the positive side of the picture at every opportunity we can drown out the voice of the grippers and complainers and noninformed.

"Here are a few projects that either had been completed or are in the process right now, all of which will help make the village a finer place in which to live. One, a plat map. The surveying and drawings have been completed. A number of property owners have to sign the map before it can be recorded with the proper county office.

"An official village map or master plan providing for the layout of future streets is in the process of being prepared by the State Planning Division.

"The Fond du Lac Avenue project has been completed with the exception of a few minor details which can be taken care of in the spring.

"Water facilities could produce almost twice as much water as they are pumping today.

"The sewage treatment plant is capable of handling an increased population of approximately 900 people without any changes. If certain changes were made, this figure could be increased.

"School facilities should be adequate for a greatly increased population. We have buildings and lands that any community our size, and a lot larger, would be very proud to have.

"Our municipal building with the fire department and library are outstanding for a community this size.

"The village was completely reassessed about 3½ years ago placing all property owners and taxpayers on an equal basis.

"Numerous local streets have been rebuilt and new ones constructed. This program will be continued as long as streets are needed and as rapidly as the money is available.

"Recreational facilities—we're in

the heart of the Kettle Moraine. Little more need be said except that we have a very fine park within our village limits.

"The community is made up of many, many very civic minded people. Just to mention a few activities; our own Kiwanis Club does so much for our local children, underprivileged children and needy families.

"Boy Scout activities that far exceed the normal amount of programming in a community much larger than ours.

"Our street opening group which was a group of over 50 men representing almost every organized group in the community who joined together to make the project a success. The money that was raised was used to purchase Christmas decorations which have contributed a lot to the holiday atmosphere here in Kewaskum.

"We have all of these and many more positive things to talk about. Signs of the progress. Projects that are helping lead Kewaskum to the recognition and status it should and has every right to hold outside of our community.

"Let's be proud of what we have today; let's work to make it better and let's talk about our village and its many good features at every opportunity."

## Sudden Death of Edward Franzen

Funeral services for Edward Franzen, 57, of West Bend, the father of Priscilla Franzen of Kewaskum, were held at the Techtman-Myrhum Funeral home, West Bend, at 2 p. m. Wednesday, Dec. 11, the Rev. Norman Dechant of Fillmore officiating.

## New Chauffeurs' Law For Drivers to Go Into Effect Jan. 1

REQUIRES THOSE EMPLOYED AS VEHICLE OPERATORS TO SECURE LICENSE

Chief of Police Roland Pledl issued a reminder this week to all persons employed as motor vehicle operators in the state of Wisconsin that Chapter 684, Laws of 1957, became effective on Nov. 21, 1957. This law requires every person who is employed as a chauffeur or vehicle driver on Jan. 1, 1958 to secure a chauffeurs' license.

"Chauffeur" means every person, including the vehicle owner, who is employed FOR THE PRINCIPAL PURPOSE OF OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE, and every person who operates a motor vehicle while in use as a public carrier or persons or property for hire, except that a person is not a chauffeur within the meaning of this paragraph solely because:

He is engaged in operating or employed for the principal purpose of operating a motor vehicle in connection with providing funeral services, a school bus, a farm truck, or a truck having a registered gross weight of not more than 16,000 pounds transporting unprocessed farm products.

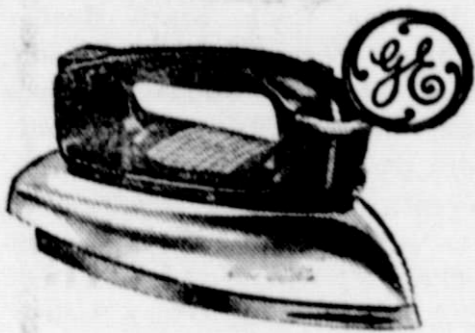

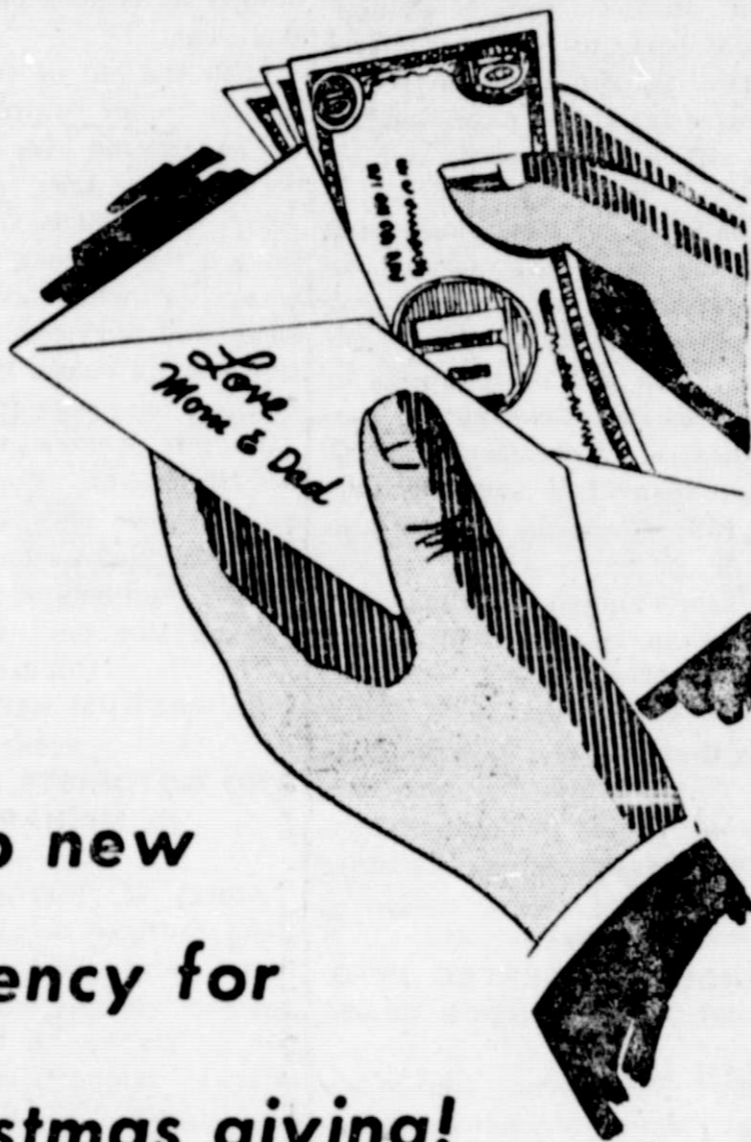

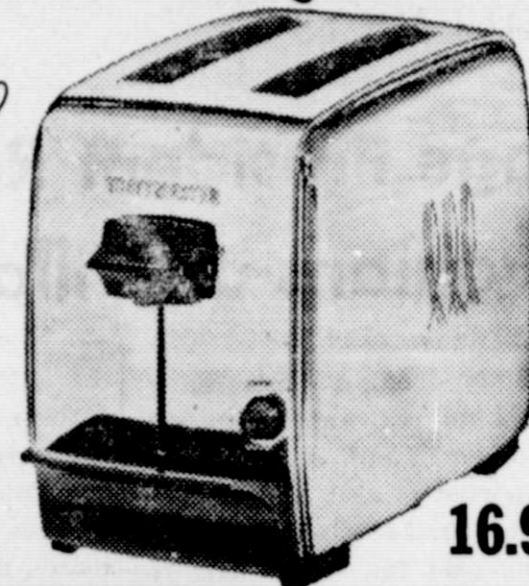

### Indians Tip Brandon in Opener, Lose to Dalers

The Kewaskum Indians broke even in their opening Tri-County conference games the past week. Playing at home last Friday they upset Brandon, 66-43, and at Rosendale Tuesday night they were nosed out in a thriller, 57-52. Lomira, Oakfield and Campbellsport all won their first two games to share the first place spot. Kewaskum and Rosendale are tied for second.

The Indians easy victory over Brandon came as a surprise, not so much the win but the margin by which they did it. Kewaskum's young, inexperienced squad which is in the rebuilding process swamped Brandon by 23 points in a one-sided tilt. They built up a big 17-5 advantage in the first quarter but Brandon came back to cut the margin to 28-24 at halftime. Play was close in the third period, which

ended 44-38. Then in the final stanza the Indians hit a hot streak and poured in 22 points to a mere 5 for the opponents to win going away.

Jerry Opgenorth hit 24 points for the victors. The local sharpshooter flipped in 7 baskets and 10 free throws to take conference scoring honors for the night. Mark Rodenbusch chipped in 16 points. Peter Dahl was top man for Brandon with 22 points.

Kewaskum and Rosendale hooked up in a real barnburner there Tuesday night with the Dalers sneaking past the Indians, 57-52. The winners dominated play the first half but in the second half it was a different story with the teams battling on pretty even terms. Rosendale held a commanding 19-9 lead at the end of the quarter and was in front by only 31-26 at the intermission. By the end of the third period the Dalers were ahead by 6 points, 43-

37, and that's about how it stayed. Leading Rosendale were Jim Marshall and Terry Madigan with 19 points apiece. Opgenorth again was the big gun for the losers with 25

points to take high honors. He did it on 7 buckets and 11 free throws. Games Friday—Oakfield at Kewaskum, North Fondy at Brandon, Lomira at Campbellsport, Rosendale at Hustisford.

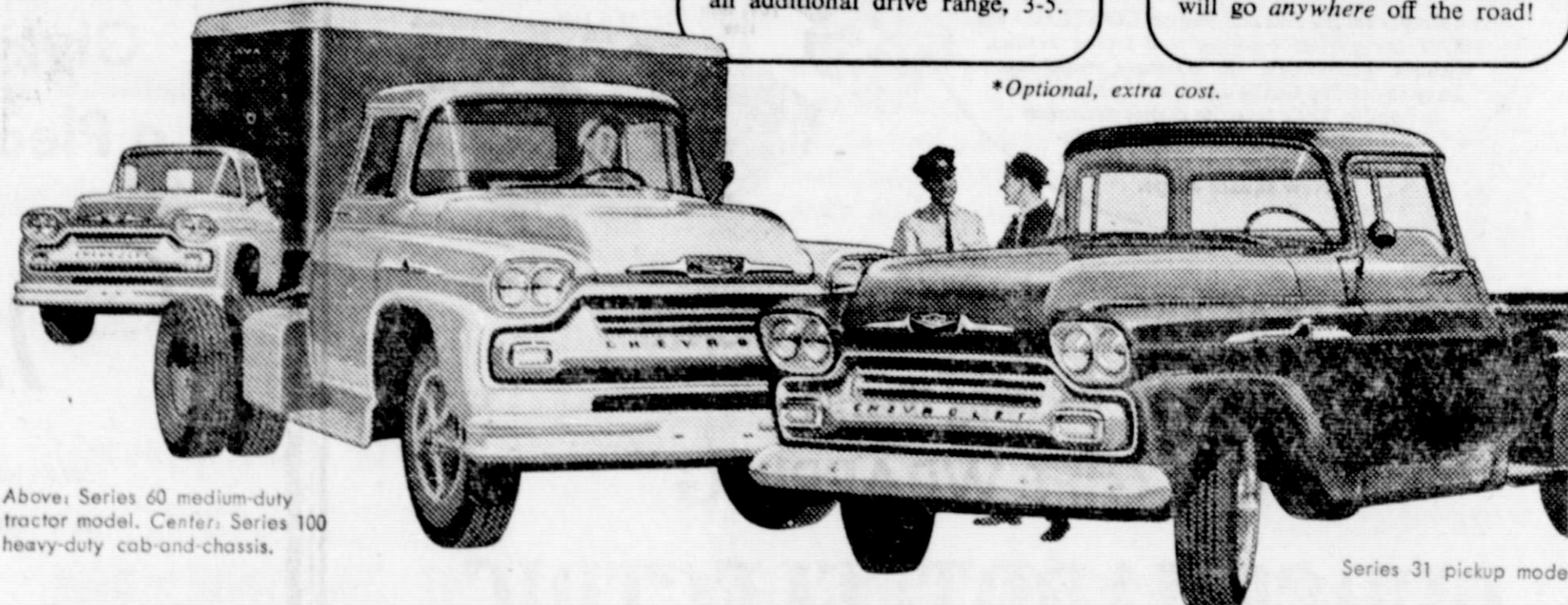

### Chauffeurs' Law

(CONTINUED FROM PAGE ONE)  
Applications filed prior to Feb. 1, 1958 shall be considered as original applicants and shall be accepted without examination for a fee of \$2.00. Applications filed after Jan. 31, 1958 shall not be considered as original applicants and they will be obligated to pass a qualifying examination and pay a fee of \$3.00. Application blanks can be obtained at the Kewaskum police station. Chauffeurs' license will expire annually on the birthdate of the ap-

plicant. They will be renewed without examination for a fee of \$2.00. Every applicant must be at least 18 years of age and must possess a valid Wisconsin operator's license at the time of application.

Demerit points will be assigned against both the chauffeur's license and the private operator's license for offenses committed as a chauffeur. Demerit points for offenses committed while operating under a private license will be assigned a-

gainst the private operator's license only. After 90 days have elapsed after conviction he may then pay a fee of \$5.00 and petition the Motor Vehicle Department for issuance of a limited license.
