New Chauffeurs' Law For Drivers to Go Into Effect Jan.

REQUIRES THOSE EMPLOYED AS VEHICLE OPERATORS TO SECURE LICENSE

Chief of Police Roland Pledl is sued a reminder this week to all persons employed as motor vehicle operators in the state of Wisconsin that Chapter 684, Laws of 1957, became effective on Nov. 21, 1957. This law requires every person who s employed as a chauffeur or vehicle driver on Jan. 1, 1958 to secure a chauffeurs' license.

"Chauffeur" means every person including the vehicle owner, who is employed FOR THE PRINCIPAL PURPOSE OF OPERATING A MO. TOR VEHICLE, and every person who operates a motor vehicle while in use as a public carrier or persons or property for hire, except that a person is not a chauffeur Nohr, Patsy Haug; Accordian Duet, within the meaning of this paragraph solely because:
