## Big Slinger Team Hands Indians 1st Loss, 14-6

Instead of going around and over them the Kewaskum Indians made the mistake of trying to go through the giant Slinger team at the Owls' homecoming Friday and the outcome was a 14-6 Slinger victory. The defeat, a mild upset, was Kewaskum's first of the season and the Owls' points were the first scored against the Indians so far. Slinger now has taken over the lead in the Scenic Moraine conference.

The Indians have a big team but looked comparatively small aside of the huge Slinger 11, which appears like a college squad. Kewaskum pounded away at the Owl's line but was unable to penetrate it. With the Indians running, the Slinger ends moved in tight and the line stood up like a stone wall. A mixture of more end runs, short passes over the line and forward passes might have loosened up the Owl defense and kept them honest.

Surprisingly Campbellsport, which lost to Slinger by only one touchdown, had a hard time coming from behind to eke out a 13-7 win over North Fondy, which team Kewaskum trounced 25-0.

John Machacek's passing arm provided the Owls with the victory over the Indians. He passed to Bob Boll on the second play of the game and Boll scampered 78 yards for the touchdown. Machacek then added the point after touchdown.

The Indians had an opportunity to tie the score in the second quarter when Back Norm Rodenkirch gambled on a fourth down situation and raced 39 yards for a TD. With fourth down coming up and 15 yards to go, Rodenkirch broke into the clear and went all the way. Slinger's Ed Wolf blocked the try for the extra point, his fourth straight against opponents this year.

The score remained at 7-6 through the third quarter. Dick Ellis set up the second Owl score in the fourth period when he intercepted a Rodenkirch pass on the Kewaskum 44 yard line. Ellis carried the ball for two yards on the first play, and with second down and eight to go, Machacek unleashed a long heave to Don Kirsch, who fell into the end zone for the second TD. The play covered 42 yards. Machacek again ran the extra point.

Tonight, Friday, the Indians entertain Campbellsport. Both have one and one records and are tied for second place. Next Friday, Oct. 17, North Fondy will be Kewaskum's homecoming opponent.

## Annual Kiwanis Live Turkey Shoot At Bar-N Sunday

1958 EVENT FEATURES LIVE  
TROUT FISHING CONTEST  
FOR FIRST TIME

The Kewaskum Kiwanis club will sponsor its sixth annual live turkey shoot on Sunday, Oct. 12, at the Bar-N Dude Ranch, 6 miles northeast of Kewaskum on County Trunk GGG, the beautiful Kettle Moraine drive.

Patterned after the historic turkey shoots which were so popular in frontier days, this fascinatingly interesting annual event has become outstandingly popular. Thousands of men, women and children from all over the state attend as participants and spectators. Last year almost 3,000 shooters participated and nearly 300 turkeys were taken home. The turkey shoot is handled as follows:

Large live tom turkeys are placed in protected crates at the end of the rifle range with only their heads exposed to the marksman. For a fee of \$1.00 for three shots, (four shots on advance sale tickets) the marksman attempts to hit the turkey's head from the firing line, using a .22 rifle. The turkey he hits is the turkey he gets for the family larder. Rifles and ammunition are furnished.

For the first time the 1958 event will offer a live trout fishing contest. Prizes will be offered to those catching the largest fish.

Other events include trap and deer rifle target shooting. Sportsmen desiring to enter these events bring their own shotguns, rifles and ammunition. In addition, there are games for every member of the family to enjoy. Shelter, hot and cold food and beverages will be available.

The shoot is sponsored by the Kewaskum Kiwanis club and all profits go to the Kewaskum youth benefit and community benefit funds.
