Chevs Cop Hard Fought Services Held for Game at Horicon, 84-76 Mrs. Charles Prost

The second place Kewaskum Chevs are still hot on the heels of league leading Thiensville as the result of an 84-76 win at Horicon Saturday night in a hard fought battle. The Chevrolets, with a 5-1 record, are only half a game behind Thiensville which team made it 5-0 with a win over Fox Lake.

Kewaskum has only one game left to play in the first half and that is against last place Fox Lake on Jan. 3, while Thiensville has two remaining against Slinger and Mayville. One of these must knock off Thiensville if the Chevs hope to tie for or win the first half crown.

The contest at Horicon was the usual torrid one between these teams and the Chevs had to have one of their hottest nights of the season to come out on top. Kewaskum was exceptionally accurate on their shots in the first half and this gave them a lead they had to hang onto for dear life in the second half. The play was hard and rough at times with a total of 52 personals being called. A couple of run-ins between the players and officials resulted and even Manager "Cisco" had a technical called on him as the verbal battles ensued. Two Kewaskum players were ejected on fouls and Horicon had five team members with four personals.

The Chevs, shooting very well, went ahead 27-21 in the first quarter and increased the lead to eight points, 45-37, at halftime. Horicon bounced back with a good third period, scoring 21 points to the Chevs' 16, and cut the lead to three points, 61-58. The last quarter was a barn burner with the teams matching baskets until the closing minutes when Kewaskum pulled away to an 8-point victory.

Don Meisenheimer was the scoring ace for the winners with 26 points but was second best to Horicon's shooting artist, Forward Taylor, who totaled 29 points for the evening. He seldom misses. George Hanrahan also had a big part in the win with 19 points, while Frank Krueger chipped in 11 and Bob Stenman 10. Second best scorer for the losers was Center Schmidt with 14 points.

Kewaskum will be idle over the holidays, the next tilt being with Fox Lake on Jan. 3.

CHIMNEY FIRE AT DORNACKER HOME

The fire department answered a chimney fire call at the E. Dornacker rural home at St. Bridgets in the town of Wayne Monday afternoon shortly before 2:30 p. m. No damage resulted.

Mrs. Charles Prost, 82, nee Amelia Kirchner, a resident of the village for the past 23 years, where she made her home with her son Charles, died at her home on Forest ave. on Friday morning, Dec. 19, following a lingering illness.

She was born in the town of Wayne on Dec. 3, 1876, a daughter of the late Henry and Ernestina Kirchner. Her marriage to Charles Prost, a prominent farmer, took place on May 21, 1895, at St. Peter's Lutheran church, town of Wayne, and the couple made their home on the Prost farm in the town of Kewaskum now occupied by her son, Clarence and family. Twenty-three years ago they retired and moved to this village. Mr. Prost predeceased her in October, 1940.

Surviving are four sons, Albert of the town of Auburn, Charles of this village, Clarence of the town of Kewaskum, and Edward of the village; three daughters-in-law, seven grandchildren, two great-grandchildren, a sister, Elizabeth (Mrs. William Guth) of Kewaskum; a sister-in-law, Mrs. August Kirchner, of the town of Kewaskum, and a brother-in-law, William Guth, of Kewaskum.

The body was in state at Miller's Funeral home from 1:30 p. m. Sunday until 11 a. m. Monday and at the Peace E and R church from 12 noon until the time of services at 2 p. m. Monday. The Rev. C. F. Hammen officiated and burial was in the Peace cemetery.

MARVIN MARTIN AWARDED CIVIL DEFENSE CERTIFICATE OF MERIT

Village President James D. Reigle, Chief of Police Roland Pledl, Gottlieb Walz and Eugene La Marche attended a civil defense awards dinner at the Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing Co. clubhouse, 1135 S. 70th st., Milwaukee, on Monday night, Dec. 15. Some 240 persons attended the dinner, given by the metropolitan Milwaukee target area, which includes Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Washington, Waukesha, Racine, Kenosha and Walworth counties.

Washington county persons awarded civil defense certificates of merit included Robert Hintz, West Bend, welfare services; Marvin Martin, Kewaskum, civil defense director, and Clem Mueller, Hartford, police service.

Senator Wm. Proxmire (Democrat, Wisconsin) spoke at the meeting and said that he approved a 500 million dollar federal appropriation for civil defense.

Maj. Gen. Ralph J. Olson, Madison, state director of civil defense, said Wisconsin already had 34 emergency hospitals of 200 beds, and that he had been told it would receive 19 more. The hospitals cost \$27,000 each.
