New Manufacturing Plant, Kewaskum Industries, Inc., Will Locate in Kewaskum

To Employ Many Persons; Lease Schaefer Bldg.

**BEGIN OPERATION EARLY IN
AUGUST; APPLICATIONS
FOR EMPLOYMENT NOW
BEING ACCEPTED**

Official announcement was made this week that a new manufacturing industry will locate in Kewaskum under the firm name of Kewaskum Industries, Inc.

The firm has leased the Schaefer Bros. garage building, now occupied by the Kettle Moraine Sports Center, a subsidiary of the National Woodworking & Boat Co., Inc., at 1245 Fond du Lac ave. It is reported that the Sports Center will move to the Maaske building in Campbellsport for the present time.

It was learned that the new Kewaskum Industries, Inc. expects to employ about 60 persons at the start with the possibility that many more will be employed later when the plant is enlarged. Changes and renovations are already being made in the building and the plant will be in operation early in August.

Applications for employment were received from Monday through Friday of this week from 8 a. m. to 9 p. m. Only men will be employed at the start. Applications were received for inspectors and testers, assemblers and machine operators including borematics, gear hobber, grinders, drill presses and hand miller.

Help wanted notices were sent through the mail late last week throughout the surrounding area.

Interviewers of the firm informed the writer that they were very well pleased with the response received and were surprised with the number of skilled laborers in this area. About 60 applications were already received the first day Monday.

Further information concerning the plant was not revealed for public announcement as yet but a detailed press release will be forthcoming very soon.

Kewaskum Industries, Inc. will give Kewaskum a third sizable industry, the others being Regal Ware, Inc. and Heinemann Dairy.

Local Tavern Changes Hands, Another Closes

One Kewaskum tavern changed hands and another went out of business on Wednesday, July 1, the date when taverns begin operating under new licenses for the year.

Mr. and Mrs. Russell A. Kohl of Adell took over Big Gene's Tap, operated by Gene Gruber the past year at 204 Main st. The Kohls will occupy the living quarters in the same building which is owned by Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Ortman of West Bend who formerly operated the business. Big Gene has no definite plans for the future but expects to take a vacation in northern Wisconsin at present.

Serwe's Tap, operated by Mr. and Mrs. Syl. Serwe at 300 Main st. for the past six years, closed its doors to the public on Tuesday, June 30. The tavern property and buildings, owned by Joe Eberle, who formerly operated the business many years, was sold by him to the Peace E and R church some time ago. Members of the parish will use or dispose of the buildings to suit their needs.

For the present the living quarters above the tavern will be occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Walt Bade and family who will live there until the new home they are building on Clinton st. is completed in the fall. The Bade family will move into the building on Saturday. They have sold their present house on Clinton st. to Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Volm of St. Killian. Mr. and Mrs. Serwe moved into the upper apartment of the Louis Schaefer home on North st. They have no definite plans for the future but intend to take an extended vacation at present.

With the sale of his property, Eberle chose to discontinue the tavern license rather than transfer or sell it. Now there are nine remaining taverns in the village.
