#### FLAVORED BUTTERS FOR VEGETABLES

MINT: To ¼ cup melted butter, add 1 tablespoon chopped fresh mint leaves. Serve on peas, carrots, or a combination of the

ORANGE: To ¼ cup melted butter, add 3 tablespoons orange juice and 1 tablespoon grated orange rind. Simmer for a few minutes over low heat and serve hot over beets.

ALMOND: To ¼ cup melted butter, add 2 tablespoons chopped salted almonds and 1 , tablespoon lemon juice. Serve with green beans, Brussel sprouts or broccoli.
