

KIWANIS CLUB PURCHASES PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT FOR VILLAGE PARK

Regular Meeting July 6, 1959.

The Village Board of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin, met in regular monthly session with President Reigle presiding and all board members present except Trustee Merwin.

The minutes of the previous meetings were accepted as presented upon motion by C. Wietor, seconded by H. Becker and duly carried.

The verbal request of Marie Dei for refund on a house moving permit was denied.

A representative of the Equitable Insurance Co. presented a group hospitalization insurance plan.

Marvin Martin informed the board that the local Kiwanis club had purchased some playground equipment for the village park. The board indicated the village would provide the labor to install such equipment.

Lester Kohn was granted permission to erect a metal machine shed upon Lot 11 in Block 59.

The recreation director was informed that the recreation program sponsored by the village was for the children of village residents only.

ORDINANCE 59-3

THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF KEWASKUM, WASHINGTON COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 11.01 (19) (C) (3) is hereby amended to read as follows: "No premises for which a retail Class "B" Liquor and Malt Beverages license has been issued shall be permitted to remain open for the sale of liquor or malt bev-

erages or for any other purpose between the hours of 2:00 A. M. and 8:00 A. M. during daylight saving time, and 1:00 A. M. and 8:00 A. M. during central standard time, as said time is adopted by the State of Wisconsin, except on January 1, when the closing hours shall be between 3:00 A. M. and 8:00 A. M."

Ordinance No. 59-3 introduced and its adoption moved by Trustee Wayland Tessar and seconded by Trustee Henry Becker.
