Dreher's Return to Alaska After Visit

Mr. and Mrs. Earl "Patty" Dreher, Jr. and 6 mos. old son Ricky of Anchorage, Alaska, left Tuesday to return to Alaska after spending the holidays with their families in Kewaskum and West Bend. The Dreher's are driving, via the Alcan highway, back to Anchorage, where they have resided the past two years.

Dreher is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Dreher, Sr. of Kewaskum and his wife Blanche is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Stowers of West Bend.

The Alcan highway is the only ground link between the U. S. and Alaska, our 49th state. They are traveling the 3,750 miles equipped with snow tires, chains in the trunk and survival gear consisting of food, clothing and white gas stove and heat, which is standard equipment for motorists in northern Canada and Alaska. Service stations are about 150 miles apart.

Patty, who first was sent to Alaska to serve with the U. S. Army, is now employed by the American Roofing and Inspection Co. and Blanche has taken a job as a typist with the Alaska Title and Trust Co. Anchorage now is a city of close to 40,000 population, plus about the same number of government and military personnel. The Dreher's live in a double insulated trailer home, which cost \$2,000 to ship to Anchorage. Patty reported that Anchorage was warmer and had less snowfall than we did in Wisconsin last winter. However, the coldest was 52 below and the warmest day in July was 78 degrees.

Surviving are two sons, Walter of the town of Kewaskum and Harvey of Kewaskum; one daughter, Lorinda (Mrs. Orin Kirchner) of the town of Kewaskum; five grandchildren, Dorothy (Mrs. Ralph Duffrin), Lloyd and Loran Butzlaff and Lucille and Diane Kirchner; three sisters, Mrs. Ella Schaefer of West Bend, Mrs. Alvina Efflandt of Milwaukee and Mrs. Amanda Mueller of Barton, and one brother, Arthur Butzlaff, of the town of Kewaskum.

The body is in state at Miller's Funeral home since 2 p. m. Thursday and will be shown at the Peace E and R church from 12 noon until the time of services at 2 p. m. today (Friday). The Rev. C. F. Hammen will officiate and burial will take place in the parish cemetery.

Hot Horicon Quint Whips Chevs, 87-73
