## Newly Built Wigwam Drive-In Here Re-Opens

The completely rebuilt Wigwam Drive-In on South Fond du Lac ave., managed by Dick Edwards, opened for business last week end, although finishing touches are not yet completed on the beautiful new building.

Both car hop and inside service are available. At present the drive-in is open from 11 a. m. until midnight daily and Edwards intends to remain open for longer hours as soon as arrangements can be made. A complete menu, including breakfasts and lunches, is planned.

The 46 by 109 foot building includes a well-lighted canopy that can cover 14 cars. The roomy 17 by 46 foot dining room has a 12-stool counter plus a table seating capacity for about 40 persons.

The building is constructed in a rustic pattern to conform with the Kettle Moraine area atmosphere with knotty pine outside paneling and comfortable, homey interior decor.

Dick and members of the Edwards families invite the public to come in and see the new Wigwam at any time.

## Local FHA Members to Attend State Meeting

JUDY OELHAFEN TO RECEIVE STATE RECOGNITION

Eight hundred members and advisors of the Wisconsin Association of Future Homemakers of America will attend the annual convention which will be held at the American Baptist Assembly, Green Lake, June 6 to 9. They will represent 11,965 members in 231 chapters in the state. The state FHA association is sponsored by the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education. Miss Kathryn Gill, Madison, serves as state advisor.

The Kewaskum chapter will be represented by Jolene Miller, Betty Lynn, Cathy Herriges and Bonnie Butzke. The delegates will be accompanied by Miss Mary Alice Weber, chapter advisor.

President Romona Attenberger, Waupun, and her 16 state officers have planned a program based on the convention theme, "FHA in Focus." Convention objectives include developing leadership and sharing ideas for planning local programs of work. FHA members will preside at all general sessions, will participate actively in 12 discussion groups, and will present four special programs on activities engaged in by local chapters.

John D. Davies, speech department, Mary D. Bradford, High school, Kenosha, will address the convention during the opening session on "The Miracle of Influence." The Rev. Reed Forbush, pastor of the Community church, Middleton, will speak on "Discovering Myself in My World," and will direct a panel of two FHA members who will discuss questions from the audience.

Special activities include a recreational session led by Mr. and Mrs. John J. Gardner, Green Bay; a state chorus of 80 voices and a Vesper service.

Seventeen state officers will be elected during the business meeting. Candidates for state president are: Charolene Tullberg, Clintonville; Bonnie Nelson, New Richmond, and Nancy Frisch, Middleton.

The highest state recognition for outstanding contributions to school, home and community through FHA activities will be awarded to 25 members.

Three \$100 scholarships will be awarded to senior girls who have been outstanding members of FHA and who plan to continue education in home economics. 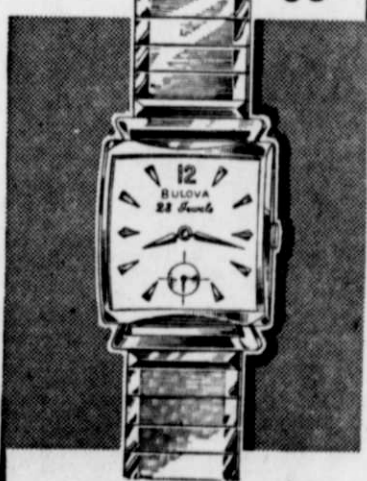
## ENDS GERMANY TOUR
