Work Started Tuesday **On \$135,000 Street Improvement Project**

Work was started on Tuesday, July 5, by the contractors on the village of Kewaskum's \$135,334 street improvement project, which will include new sidewalk, curb and gutter, storm sewers, street lights, street work and other improvements.

The contractor awarded the contract for the general construction work was Warren Wieseler Construction, Inc. of 730 West Glendale ave., Appleton, on a bid of \$116 .-584.00. The bid for the street lighting contract was awarded to Household Utilities, Inc., 604 Fremnot st., Kiel in the amount of \$18,750.00.

On Main street new mercuryvapor type street lights will be installed on the entire length of the street, similar to those on Fond du Lac ave. New sidewalk will be built on both sides of the street, curb and gutter, storm sewer and catch basins will be installed. On the east side of the river, Main st. will be graded and graveled between the present pavement and the new curb and gutter.

Other streets on which street, urb and gutter, grade and graveling, sidewalk, storm sewer or catch basin work will be done include Stark, Kewaskum, Highland, River View drive, Parkview drive, Prospect, School, Tower, Second, Clinton, Elm, Roseland drive, Meadow Lane, Midland ave. Western ave. and Hillside drive.

The work was scheduled to start. on River View drive, south of Main st., which is the street leading to the village park but because of the picnic this week end work got underway instead on Park View drive, north of Main st. in order to prevent any interference with the parade and picnic Sunday.
