## 384 in High School, 376 in Grades Set All-Time High Enrollment of 760 Students

### Enrollment 34 Over Last Year; 104 Freshmen

The Kewaskum Community High school and grade schools opened on Tuesday with another all-time record enrollment of 760 students, which total exceeds last year's figure of 726 by 34 pupils.

The enrollment in high school is 384, which exceeds last year's total of 368 by 16 people. Enrollment in the grades is 376 pupils, 18 over last term's figure of 358. The freshman class this year numbers 104 students, one over the 103 who started high school last term.

The 760 enrolled in the public schools, added to the 253 children attending Holy Trinity school, a total of 1,013 pupils attending school in Kewaskum this year. This is the first time this number has gone over the 1,000 mark. The staffs of teachers in the schools were mentioned in previous issues.

More students may have enrolled after the opening day, when the above figures were taken. Six students who enrolled last May with the freshman class did not enter school as expected.

Names of the kindergarten and new elementary school pupils, as well as the freshmen and transfer students in the high school will be published in the next issue, which allows sufficient time for a complete listing of pupils who may have entered school after opening day.

### Holy Trinity School Opens With Gain in Enrollment to 253

Holy Trinity Catholic school opened on Wednesday morning with another increase in enrollment to 253 pupils, a gain of nine over last year's total of 244. On Wednesday there was only a half day of school, classes being dismissed at 11:15 a. m. The enrollment of 253 consists of 139 boys and 114 girls.

Thirty-five children started school in the first grade, an increase of six over last year's number of 29. There are also ten new pupils who transferred here from other schools.

### Jane Thorn, 4, Fatally Hurt in Fall from Hay Wagon; Skull Fractured

Jane Marie Thorn, four-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Thorn of the town of Auburn, R. 2, Campbellsport, residing near New Fane, about five miles northeast of Kewaskum, died Sunday afternoon of a skull fracture suffered when she fell off a hay wagon on her parents' farm.

According to Frank Decker, Fond du Lac county coroner, the girl was riding on top of a load of hay on a wagon when the vehicle passed under a tree branch, knocking part of the hay and the girl from the wagon. She apparently struck her head on a hard object. Jane was rushed to a Kewaskum physician's office where she was pronounced dead on arrival.

Jane Marie was born Nov. 17, 1955 at West Bend. Her parents lived near Hartford before coming to the town of Auburn six years ago. Besides her parents, she is survived by four brothers, James, 19, John 16, Raymond 11 and Michael 9.

The body was in state at Miller's Funeral home after 2 p. m. Tuesday. Funeral services were held at 9:30 a. m. Wednesday at Holy Trinity church, the Rev. John T. Budde officiating. Burial took place in the new parish cemetery.

#### WANBULI INDIAN DANCERS, TROUT FISHING CONTEST AMONG ATTRACTIONS

The Kewaskum Kiwanis club will sponsor its eighth annual Live Turkey Shoot on Sunday, Sept. 18, at the Bar-N Dude Ranch, 6 miles northeast of Kewaskum on County Trunk GGG, the beautiful Kettle Moraine Drive.

Patterned after the historic turkey shoots which were so popular in frontier days, this fascinatingly interesting annual event has become an outstanding attraction. Thousands of men, women and children from all over the state attend as participants and spectators.

The turkey shoot is handled as follows: Large live turkeys are protected behind an earthen bunker at the end of the rifle range with only their heads exposed to the marksman. For a fee of \$1.00 for three shots, (four shots for a dollar on advance sale tickets) the marksman attempts to hit the turkey's head from the firing line, using a .22 rifle. The turkey he hits is the turkey he gets for the family larder. Rifles and ammunition are furnished.

A live trout fishing contest is another popular attraction. It offers fine sport for the pro and amateur alike. The angler keeps all the fish he catches. Additional prizes are offered for those catching the largest fish.

Other events include trap and deer rifle target shooting. Sportsmen desiring to enter these events bring their own shotguns, rifles and ammunition. An authentic cross-bow direct from Switzerland will be used in a target event. Here's an opportunity for Robin-hood admirers to test their skill. In addition, there are games for every member of the family to enjoy. Shelter, hot and cold food and beverages will be available.

The Wanbuli Indian Dancers will perform throughout the day. The Wanbulis are a group of 50 students of Indian lore who have studied the customs, clothes and rituals of many North American Indian nations. Their dances and costumes are authentic to the last detail and are thrilling to both young and old.

The shoot is sponsored by the Kewaskum Kiwanis club and all profits go to the Kewaskum Youth and Community Benefit funds.

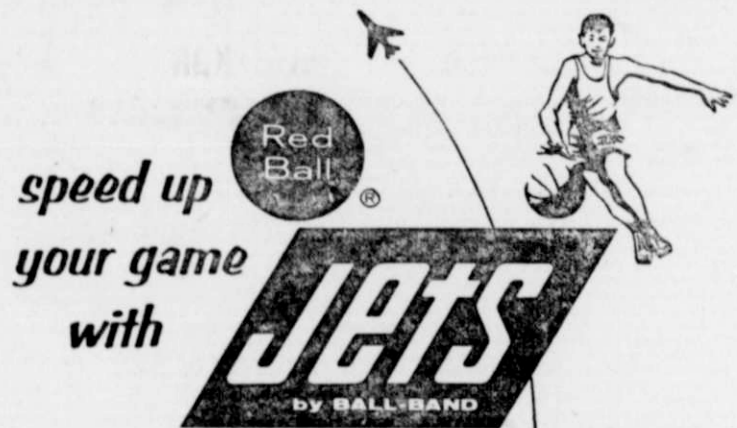

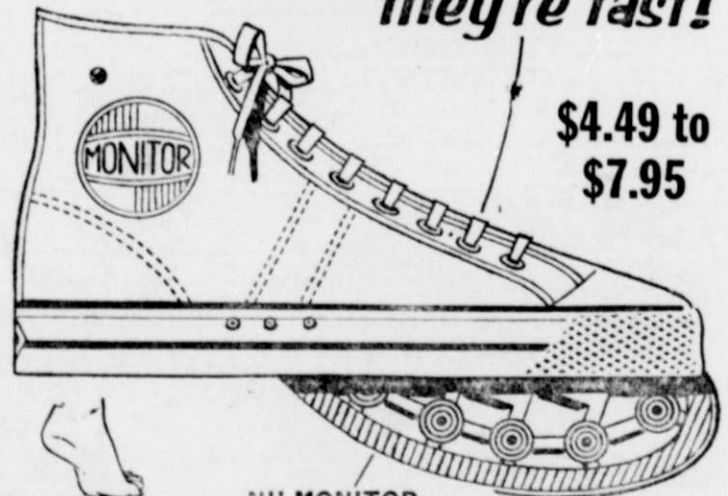
