Record Vote Expected Tuesday, Nov. 8, for Presidential Election

Indications during the last week of campaigning point to Three in One Family a record vote in Washington county for the presidential and general election next Tuesday, Nov. 8. A very large vote is also anticipated in the village of Kewaskum, with the possibility that a new high may be established.

Voting in the village will be done at the municipal building and the polls will be open from 9 am. until 6 p. m. Town of Kewaskum balloting will be at the Labor Center in this village and the polls there will be open from 9 a. m. to 5:30 p. m.

Voters in the village need not register in advance to cast their ballots. Their name will be registered at the time they vote. But they must be residents of the village at least 10 days before the election to be eligible to vote. Absentee ballots can be obtained from the village commissioner and must be marked no later than Monday. Nov. 7, the deadline for absentee voting.

Interest in the election has been mounting steadily, not only on the national level but in the state and county contests as well, as the time for voting approaches. Apparently this year's election has stirred up the most excitement, enthusiasm and discussion
