Blood Bank to Be Held Here June 1; Goal 170 Pints

The Kewaskum blood bank will be held on Tuesday, June 1, from 1 to 7 p. m. in the gym of the high school. The local chairmen, Mrs. Mark Rodenkirch and Mrs. Wayne Rummel, have set this year's goal at 170 pints.

There is no other way. The person needing life-sustaining blood has no alternative. Blood cannot be manufactured. It must come from another human. From YOU. To show a common concern for human worth.

If you are in good physical condition, blood can be donated every 10 weeks from age 18 to the 66th birthday, but no more than five times in 12 consecutive months. A history of jaundice, malaria, diabetes, cancer or heart disease would be cause for permanent rejection. A woman must weigh 110 pounds and a man 126 pounds.

Donating blood is an easy, quick and NO-COST way to help your community.

Local volunteers will be calling all past donors and first time donors are especially needed and urged to call Mrs. Rodenkirch at 626-4021 or Mrs. Rummel at 626-2210 for an appointment.

NOTE: Wisconsin Legislature has been revised to allow persons 18 years of age to donate WITH OUT parental consent.

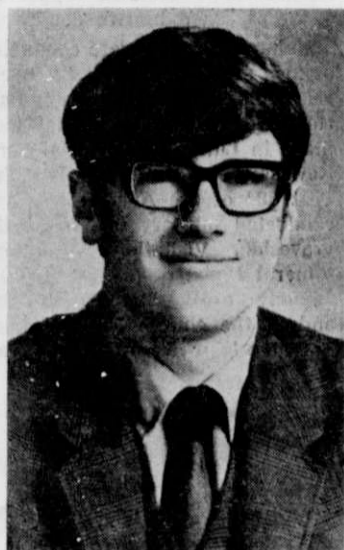

J. O. Reigle Scholarship Winners

Claire Cary and Steve Bremser have been chosen to receive J. O. Reigle \$2,000.00 Scholarships, according to an announcement by Regal Ware, Inc. The 1971 awards will provide each student \$500 per year throughout a four year college course. The awards are offered yearly to the graduating class of Kewaskum Community High School.

Immunization Clinic Here

Family immunization clinic offers smallpox, diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough on May 19 from 6:30 to 8:00 p. m. at the Kewaskum Elementary School Cafeteria. Clinics are open to all Washington County residents wishing to attend. Cost will again be \$1.00 per immunization dose with children under one year requiring written permission from their family physician.

Clinic is sponsored by Dr. R. G. Edwards, health officer, in cooperation with the Washington County Public Health Nursing Service. These are FAMILY clinics, which means adults as well as children can participate. Since parents often forget to keep their immunization status current, they should consider attending clinic if needed. Anyone in doubt about their needs could get the information from their family physician.

Edwin A. Backus, 76, of 418
 Main St., Kewaskum, a rural mail
 carrier out of the Kewaskum post
 office for 33 years before retir-
 ing, passed away unexpectedly late
 Saturday evening, May 8, at his
 summer home at Harshaw, R. 1,
 Long Lake, Wis., near Rhinelan-
 der, of a heart attack.

He was born July 27, 1894 in
 Kewaskum, a son of the late Hen-
 ry and Alvina Bonn Backhaus,
 and was a lifelong resident of this
 village. His marriage to Vinelda

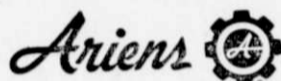

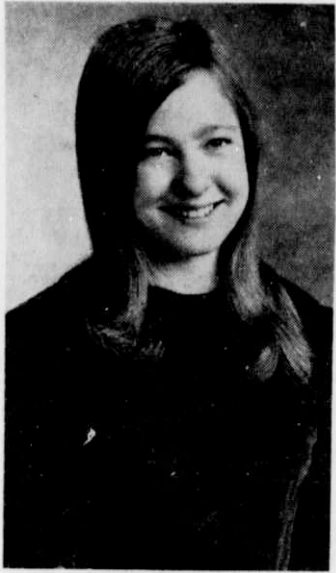
