## PRESENT INFORMATION ON CANDIDATES

### 2 School Board Members to Be Elected Mon.; Referendums to Be Voted On

#### REFERENDUMS ON CHANGING SCHOOL ELECTION DATE, RETURNING POOL MONEY

On Monday, July 26, from 1 to 8 p. m. an election will be held to determine the election of two members for the Kewaskum Community Schools, Jt. School District No. 2 school board. The election will be held at the Kewaskum High School building. The two candidates receiving the most votes, will receive three year terms. All qualified electors in the district are urged to cast their ballots.

In addition to electing school board members, the people of the Kewaskum School district will be asked Monday to vote on a referendum to change the date of school elections, and to cast an advisory vote to the board on whether the money borrowed for swimming pool purposes should be returned.

At an annual meeting two years ago, the voters directed the board to proceed with pool plans. One hundred fifty-five thousand dollars (\$155,000.00) was then borrowed for pool purposes. This money, together with \$75,000.00 from the Kiwanis Club, was planned to construct an indoor pool at the high school. The Kiwanis Club money came from club projects and from donations from individuals and businesses of the area.

When bids were opened, however, the total sum available was not sufficient to build the proposed pool. A subsequent referendum to allow the board to borrow funds sufficient to cover the added cost of \$75,000.00 was defeated. The original amount borrowed of \$155,000.00 is still held by the district, and the \$75,000.00 is still available from the Kiwanis Club.

The advisory referendum, then, is to tell the board what the people of the district wish to do with the pool project. The board could return the money, which would eliminate the pool from any building plans presently being considered. Or, consideration could be given to construction of an outdoor pool, for which there is sufficient money. Or, further efforts could be made to gain more funds for constructing the original indoor pool.

On the referendum the people will be asked whether they wish to return the money and forget the pool project for now, or whether the district should retain the money and continue to explore ways of providing a pool for this area.

The advisory referendum will read as follows:

"I recommend to the Board of Education of the Kewaskum Community Schools that all funds received for purposes of constructing a swimming pool be returned.

The referendum to change the date of school meetings will read:

"Shall School Board Members be elected at the spring elections in the local municipalities in said district rather than on the day of

the annual meeting after July 26, 1971?

The election will be followed by the budget hearing and annual school meeting of the district at 8 p. m.

The following information is presented for the information of the electors with the candidates presented in alphabetical order.

**RICHARD L. EDWARDS** — Mr. Edwards, age 40, a life time resident of the community, resides in the Village of Kewaskum. He is an insurance representative. Mr. Edwards served as President of the Kewaskum Schools' School Board for the past six years. His wife, Arlette, has served as a substitute teacher in the district schools, and is presently President of the local adult chapter of American Field Service. The Edwards' have four children: Anne, a sophomore at Ripon College, Mary, a senior at KCHS, Rick, a sophomore at KCHS and Tom an 8th grader at KES. Mr. Edwards' statement relative to being a candidate is: "The education of our young people is an area in which there can never be a fixed or limited goal either in the quality of education or the buildings and service necessary to provide that education. The method of teaching and manner of financing may and perhaps will change but that does not change our obligation to give our students the background and the opportunity for success in their adult careers. Certainly in the past, the Kewaskum Community Schools have made consistent progress toward attaining and maintaining a high level of quality education for all students of the district. In spite of increasing strain on the family pocketbook, we must move ahead, continuing our existing important programs, strengthening our weaknesses and planning intelligently for the expansion our district faces in the near future. I believe my six years of school board service have given me the insight and experience that is important if the school board is to provide the district with qualified leadership in education.

**THOMAS GUNDRUM** — Mr. Gundrum, age 28, is a resident of the Town of Farmington, living at R. 6, West Bend. He graduated from West Bend High School and the Farm Short Course of the University of Wisconsin, Madison. Mr. Gundrum served on the Kewaskum Community Schools Building Committee, and is presently Director-Secretary of the Boltonville Fire Department. A lifelong resident of the community, he is married and the father of three children. Of his candidacy Mr. Gundrum says, "Today's biggest issue is rising taxes. If elected I don't promise to lower them, which everyone knows is next to impossible, but I will do my best to keep from excess and unnecessary spending while still maintaining good quality education for our children."

**RICHARD A. HENSIK** — Mr. Hensik, age 39, a resident of the

### 18-Year-Olds Can Vote 1st Time at School Elections

The school district elections and referenda, to be voted on on July 26, will provide persons of this area between the ages of 18 and 21 with their first voting opportunity. The recent change in the U. S. Constitution makes this change possible, since that Constitutional Amendment changed the minimum voting age from 21 years to 18 years. Voting takes place between 1 and 8 p. m. in the high school cafeteria.

Since voter registration is not required in any parts of our school district, 18, 19, and 20-year-old residents, who are otherwise qualified, are automatically able to cast their ballots at the school district elections. There are a number of items to be voted on at this election which should be of interest to all residents.

### Indians Win WIAA Regional, Ousted by Port in Sectional

#### BEAT CEDAR GROVE AND MAYVILLE FOR REGIONAL TITLE

WIAA tournament history repeated itself for the Kewaskum Indians in basketball the Indians went on to win the Regional championship, only to lose their opener in the Sectional tournament. Now in baseball, Kewaskum also came through to cop the Regional title and again was ousted in the first game of the Sectional.

The Indians were assigned to the Random Lake Regional, where they defeated Cedar Grove, 5-3, in the first round game last Thursday and then went to win the title by surprising Mayville's Scenic Moraine Conference champions in the finals Saturday evening, 11-10, in a slugfest. Kewaskum thus advanced to the Sectional at Port Washington where they faced Port Wednesday evening and beat themselves, 7-4, by committing 11 errors. Port reached the Sectional by blanking West Bend East, 8-0, in the Regional finals.

All in all it was a very successful season for the Indians. They tied for second place in the Scenic Conference with Slinger, both with 9-5 records, and then continued on to win the Regional crown and 2 out of 3 tournament contests.

In Kewaskum's Regional opener win over Cedar Grove, Rod

#### FIREMEN ANSWER TWO MORE GRASS FIRE CALLS

Kewaskum firemen answered two more grass fire calls last Friday, July 16, which they extinguished. The first call was at 11:20 a. m. along the Chicago & North Western railroad tracks near the intersection of Hwy. 45 and CTH H south of the village. They were next summoned at 3:25 p. m. to a grass fire on state owned land on Kettle Moraine Dr. north of Hwy. 28, east of Kewaskum.

Czerwonka and Tom Theusch each got 2 hits to lead the Indians' 9-hit assault. Theusch was also the winning pitcher, allowing just 6 hits, 2 of them by the losing pitcher, Klos. This was the first game in the long road to the State tournament to be held at West Bend next week.

The Indians' win over Mayville's champs in the Regional finals Saturday at Random Lake was their second one. They also beat the Cardinals once during the regular season. At least Kewaskum eliminated Mayville from advancing to the Sectional meet after winning the Scenic title. Gary Marx was the winning pitcher for the Indians, relieving Theusch in the 7th and holding the Cards scoreless in the 8th for the win. Mayville took a lead in the bottom of the first with 2 unearned runs scored without a hit—on walks, passed balls and wild pitches. The Indians knotted it up in the 4th with Czerwonka and Theusch getting hits. Led by Dan Heim's double, the Cardinals came right back with 3 runs in their half of the same frame to lead 5-2. Kewaskum added 1 run in the 6th but trailed 5-3 going into the last inning. Dennis Smith walked and then Clark Eichstedt hit a towering drive over the left field fence for a home run to tie the score.

score 5 more runs in the inning as Koth, Czerwonka, Luedtke, Theusch and Marx all got hits to go ahead 10-5 and it looked like the game was in the bag. The Cardinals didn't give up but came right back with 5 runs of their own in the last of the inning to tie it again 10-10 and force the contest into extra innings. In the extra inning Eichstedt, hero of the victory, tagged Tony Persha, Mayville's third pitcher, for his second home run, a shot over the centerfield fence. Marx got the Cardinals out in the last of the 8th after one hit and the game was over. Kewaskum won, 11-10 for the Regional title and the right to advance to the Sectional. Coach Neil Denniston, the players and fans were positively elated.

On to Port Washington to meet Port in the Sectional playoff on Wednesday of this week where the bottom fell out. As a result Port is on its way to the State meet at West Bend. The Indians defeated themselves by actually "giving" Port the game on 11 errors. The score was 7-4.

Kewaskum limited Port to one earned run, the other 6 all coming on errors. It was a nightmare for pitcher Theusch, who hurled a 4-hitter, only one of them for extra

bases. Poor field support allowed 3 runs to score in both the 2nd and 4th innings. The Indians collected 8 hits but could come up with only 1 run in the 5th and 3 in the 7th. Czerwonka and Theusch each got 2 hits.

The Pirates picked up a run on 3 errors in the first without a hit. The 2nd inning was even worse as Kewaskum gave up 3 runs on 4 errors. In the 4th Port scored 2 more unearned runs and then finally got their only earned run on a triple and single. The Indians picked up their 1st run in the 5th on Eichstedt's triple and a wild pitch. The 3 runs in the 7th came on Czerwonka's double,

Dave Schacht's double, Theusch's single and an error. The Indians threatened on several other occasions.
