## Village, School Board Candidates Forums March 29

Candidates Forums for the Kewaskum Village Board and the Kewaskum School Board will be held on Wednesday, March 29 at the Kewaskum High School. These forums are co-sponsored by the Kewaskum Junior Woman's Club and the Washington County League of Women Voters.

The Village Forum will start at 7 p. m. in the cafeteria. Six of the seven candidates for the three positions open will be present to express their views and answer written questions from the audience. Following the forum there will be time to speak to the individual candidates and have refreshments.

Mrs. Marvin Perkins, president of the Junior Woman's Club will act as moderator assisted by Mrs. James Feiten of the League as timekeeper.

The candidates as they appear on the ballot are Raynor Herges, Gregor A. Nigh (incumbents), Daniel S. Schmidt, Robert A. Staehler, Alvin H. Wiesner, Elmer Yoest, (incumbent), and Richard E. Zarling.

The School Board Forum will begin promptly at 8:15 p. m. in the multi-purpose room. Ten of the eleven candidates for the three positions open have indicated they will attend. Written questions from the audience will be answered by the candidates with approximately two minutes allotted for each question. Afterwards there will be opportunity for informal conversation with the candidates and refreshments.

Moderator for the School Board Forum is Mrs. Daniel McKinney, president of the League of Women Voters with Mrs. James Feiten acting as timekeeper.

## Young Man Dies Of Crash Injuries Paul Hoffmans Observe 50th Anniversary

Steven J. O'Loughlin, 21, of 911 Birchwood Drive, West Bend, died at 9 a. m. Saturday, March 18, at St. Joseph's Community Hospital, West Bend, of multiple injuries he suffered in a two vehicle crash on State Hwy. 144 at the Wallace Lake Road north of West Bend Friday evening about 6:15 o'clock. He was the husband of the former Mary Jane Reysen, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Reysen of Adell, formerly of R. 1, Kewaskum.

Circumstances surrounding the crash were still under investigation this week. Also injured in the collision was an occupant of the other car, Mrs. Arthur (Marvel) Marquardt, 40, of R. 6, West Bend. She also suffered multiple injuries but her condition was reported improved early this week.

While few other circumstances were available, it was learned that the West Bend fire department was called and a fire truck and the rescue squad responded. It was reported that fire broke out in one of the cars but was extinguished by the time firemen arrived. The rescue squad transported O'Loughlin and Mrs. Marquardt to the hospital.

O'Loughlin was born Aug. 6, 1950 at Fond du Lac and was married to Mary Jane Reysen at St. John's Lutheran Church in Sherman Center on May 31 1969. He was employed at the Gehl Co., West Bend.

Surviving are his wife and a son, Mark; his step-father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. William Kirschenstein of West Bend; his father, Joseph O'Loughlin, of Fond du Lac; his father-in-law and mother-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Ray Reysen of Adell; two sisters, Kay and Sherry of West Bend; three brothers, Michael, Joseph and Dean of West Bend, and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at 2 p. m. Tuesday at Good Shepherd Evangelical Lutheran Church, West Bend, with burial in Forest Cemetery in the Town of Forest, Fond du Lac County. Visitation at the Techtman-Myrhum Funeral Home was from 4 p. m. Monday until 11 a. m. Tuesday and at the church from 12 noon until the hour of services. The Rev. Wilbert Gawrisch officiated at the funeral.

Jaeger, who was fortunate to have a compatible donor, has had a full and active life since his operation. He is now a full time employee of Old Ironsides Battery Works at Campbellsport. He designs and makes various molds and machines as well as keeping everything functioning properly.

Jaeger is also finishing his home and raising rabbits. He has help with these after school when all of his ten children are at home. The family also raises chickens and pigs on their one and two-thirds acres near Campbellsport. His ten children, ranging in age from 16 years to 1½ years, necessitate a new addition. Two of the children were born since the transplant.

More than 115 persons in Wisconsin have been listed as in need of po-

tential kidney transplants. The purpose of the Gift of Life program is to provide organs for these people.

The President of the United States has proclaimed the month of March as "Kidney Month" and volunteer marchers throughout the state will be distributing uniform donor cards.

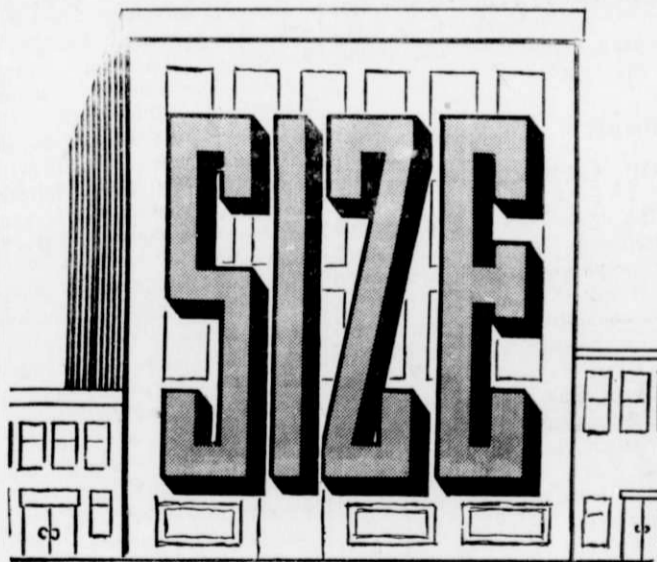

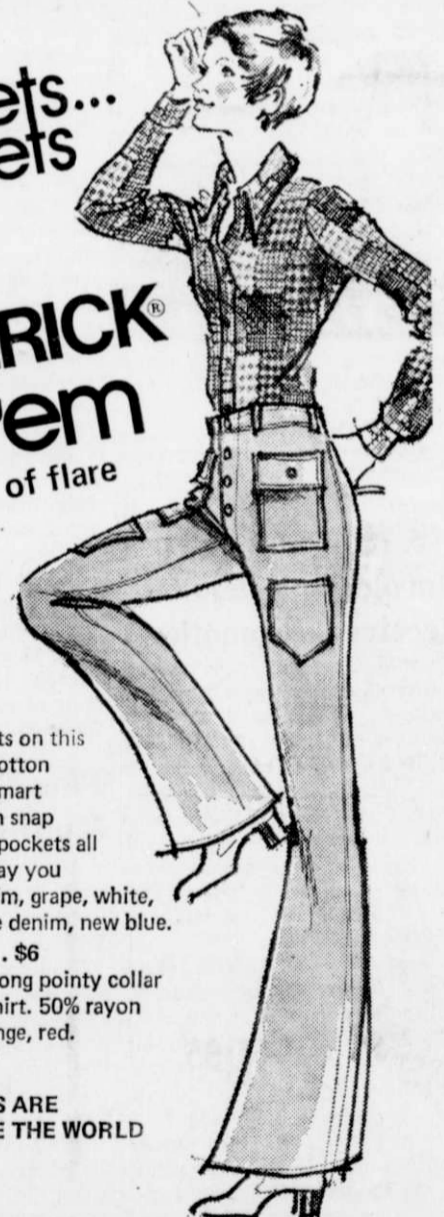

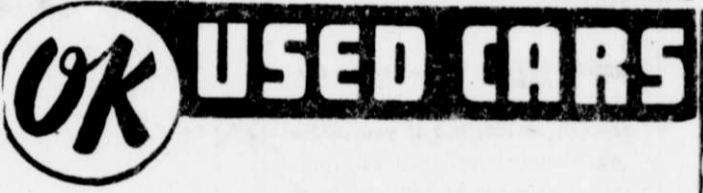
