



DOG ORDINANCE

It shall be unlawful for any person to harbor or permit to re main about his premises any dog for which no license exists and for which one is required.

It shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any dog to permit such dog to enter and roam on the premises of another, unless accompanied by the owner or keeper, and the owner or keeper has obtained permission to enter and trespass on the property.

It shall be unlawful for any person to keep or harbor within the limits of the township any dog which frequently or habitually barks, yells, or howls.

Any person violating any provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than twenty-five (\$25.00). Each day that the provisions of this or dinance or any part thereof or violated shall be and constitute a separate offense hereunder.

This ordinance was passed and adopted on the 25th day of April, 1972 by the Town Board, Town of Kewaskum, Washington County, State of Wisconsin.
