## Annual Firemen's Picnic and Parade Here on Sunday, July 9

BANDS, DRUM CORPS, ETC. TO HIGHLIGHT BIG PARADE

All is in readiness for the annual Kewaskum Firemen's picnic and parade to be held this Sunday, July 9. Plans are completed to make this year's event another outstanding one.

A huge parade at 12:30 p. m. sharp will highlight the picnic and get the affair underway. The parade will feature at least eight bands, drum and bugle corps and baton twirler units, including the Milwaukee Continental Cadet Band, Continental Youth Band, Continental Cub Band, Candettes Drum and Bugle Corps, Chordaliers Drum and Bugle Corps, St. Matthias Drum and Bugle Corps, Militaires Drum and Bugle Corps, all of Milwaukee; Georgie Girls Twirlers of West Bend, and other musical organizations and drill teams. Other parade highlights will include classy Milwaukee Civic Riders Motorcycle Club, orchestras, beautiful floats, baton twirlers, children's specialties, visiting firemen and equipment, Legionnaires, comic entries, ancient cars, riding horses, clubs, organizations, and numerous other units.

Hundreds of persons will participate in the parade, which will continue for approximately one hour. The parade will form at the high school athletic field, parking lot and adjacent streets, from where it will proceed to the park. All participants should be present to line up at noon. Cash prizes will be awarded the best floats and children's entries.

Immediately following the parade there will be exhibitions by drum and bugle corps and other live music in the park. From then on there will be continuous music and entertainment throughout the afternoon and evening. Music will be supplied on the stage and in the popular beer garden by Two Hits and a Miss and Syl's Polka Dots.

The usual water fights will be held at 6:30 p. m. with several neighboring fire departments battling for honors and prize money.

Adding to the entertainment, there will be rides, concessions, games and refreshments, including tasty brats and hamburgers. Ninety-two valuable merchandise prizes will be awarded in conjunction with the picnic. Everyone is invited to come for a real good time at the annual Kewaskum picnic.

## Syl Muckerheide Fatally Injured In Headon Crash

Sylvester N. Muckerheide, 57, of 528 N. Indiana Ave., West Bend, was fatally injured Sunday in a two-car collision in the Town of Barton several miles south of Kewaskum on Hwy. 45. Muckerheide, a native of Kewaskum, was a foreman for the Washington County Highway Department.

According to the sheriff's department accident report, the Muckerheide auto was traveling south on Hwy. 45 when a north-bound car driven by Scott A. Waranius, 22, of 502 Main St., Kewaskum, traveling north, crossed the center line and collided almost headon with the approaching Muckerheide vehicle. The accident report said Waranius apparently fell asleep at the wheel.

Coroner Bob Boltz said Muckerheide drove off onto the south-bound shoulder of the highway in a futile attempt to avoid the other vehicle.

Muckerheide was pronounced dead at the scene, Boltz said. He and Waranius were removed to St. Joseph's Community Hospital, West Bend, by the sheriff's department safety van. Mrs. Muckerheide was taken to the hospital by the Kewaskum Fire Department ambulance.

Mrs. Muckerheide reportedly suffered severe head lacerations, hip and possible internal injuries. Waranius incurred leg injuries and lacerations.

The fatality was the seventh in Washington County this year.

Sylvester N. Muckerheide, Sr. was born Feb. 16, 1915, at Kewaskum. He was married to Lucille Magdelene Pfenning and Elsie Bruhn, who both preceded him in death. He married Lucille Heberer Stenschke on Oct. 3, 1958 in Kewaskum.

He had resided at Boltonville and in West Bend the past 14 years. He farmed in the Kewaskum area and later was employed with the county highway department, where he became a foreman.

Surviving are his wife and children, Bruce (Sandy) Muckerheide of R. 3, West Bend, Sylvester (Sharon) Muckerheide, Jr. of West Bend, Robert (Sharon) Stenschke of R. 5, West Bend, Barbara (Kenneth) Greve of Plymouth; a daughter-in-law, Mary (Stephen) Jansen of West Bend, 13 grandchildren, two sisters, Betty (Tony) Kerry of West Bend and Ode (Neal) Nickelson of Hartford, and a brother, Al (Isabelle) Muckerheide of Kewaskum. A son Patrick predeceased his father.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at 2 p. m. at St. John's Lutheran Church, West Bend, with Rev. George Mumm officiating. Burial was in Holy Trinity Cemetery on Hwy. 28 west of Kewaskum. Visitation at the Techtman-Myrhum Funeral Home, West Bend, was from 2 p. m. Tuesday until 11 a. m. Wednesday and at the church from 12 noon until the hour of services.

His twenty year span of employment with the company has included positions as a Foreman, Chief Inspector and his present position in Quality Control. Also an avid sportsman, Ray's favorite leisure time activity is trout fishing. He makes it a point to travel to Colorado at least once a year to enjoy the excellent mountain trout fishing. Ray claims they bite the hardest out there and plans to move to Colorado within the next year.

Ray and his wife, Mary, have a daughter, Mary Margaret, who is a private secretary to the president of a reality firm in Washington, D.C.

## School Board Votes in Favor Of Referendum

At a special meeting June 29, the Board of Education voted in favor of holding an advisory referendum on whether \$200,000 should be borrowed to build and equip an addition to the Wayne Elementary School.

The vote was unanimous among the five members present. Not present were Richard Theusch and Gerald Secor. District electors will vote on the question July 24, the day of the annual meeting, at Kewaskum Community High School. Voting hours will be announced later.

If the advisory vote is in favor, the board will then proceed to borrow the money. If the vote is not in favor, then the two portable classrooms located at the Kewaskum Elementary School will be moved to Wayne to ease overcrowding there. Moving the classrooms, was approved at a previous meeting.

In other action, a teacher contract was approved for Miss Jeanne Urban for high school physical education. She is a June graduate of the UW - Stevens Point.

## Two Teenagers Killed in Fiery Crash Wednesday

Two West Bend teenagers were killed in a fiery auto crash in the Town of Farmington southeast of Kewaskum Wednesday night when their car crashed into a rocky embankment on the dead end of Orchard Valley Road at County Trunk A.

Killed in the crash were: Michael Arthur Allen, 18, of 634 Madison Ave., son of Clifford and Billie Daniels, and Kathleen Marie Donis, 14, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William H. Donis of 2111 N. Parkfield Drive. Identity of the victims was not confirmed by County Coroner Robert Boltz until after 1:45 p. m. Thursday.

According to the accident report the two teenagers were traveling south on Orchard Valley Road at a high rate of speed and skid marks near the crash scene showed the car braked about 200 feet before the vehicle careened across County Trunk A and struck an embankment, overturned and burst into flames.

The two occupants were pinned in the flaming car. Members of the Fillmore fire department had to extinguish the flaming auto before they could pry the bodies out of the demolished vehicle.

Miss Donis would have been a sophomore at West Bend East High School in fall and Allen would have been a senior at the same high school.

The Kewaskum fire department ambulance transported the two victims to St. Joseph's Community Hospital, West Bend, and they were later transferred to the Schmidt Funeral Home in that city where funeral arrangements were being completed Thursday.

The deaths raised the Washington County highway toll for 1972 to nine. The seventh fatality occurred early Sunday when Sylvester Muckerheide, 57, of West Bend was fatally injured in a two-car headon crash on Hwy. 45 south of Kewaskum. Wednesday night's tragedy raised area highway deaths to three within a four-day period in the county.

## Construction Worker Hurt In 25 Foot Fall

Howard Backhaus of 1550 Riverview Dr., Kewaskum, who is employed as a construction worker with the W & B Corporation of West Bend, was seriously injured about 4 p. m. last Thursday when he accidentally fell 25 feet through an opening in the roof while at work on the Chrysler building addition in Hartford.

Backhaus suffered internal injuries, a broken pelvis, fractured ribs and a broken wrist in the fall. He was removed by ambulance to Hartford Memorial Hospital, where he underwent emergency surgery the same evening.

He will be confined to the hospital for at least one month.
