Two West Bend teenagers were killed in a fiery auto crash in the Town of Farmington southeast of Kewaskum Wednesday night when their car crashed into a rocky embankment on the dead end of Orchard Valley Road at County Trunk A.

Killed in the crash were: Michacl Arthur Allen, 18, of 634 Madison Ave., son of Clifford and Billie Daniels, and Kathleen Marie Donis, 14, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William H. Donis of 2111 N. Parkfield Drive. Identity of the






