

(Continued from page 1) for use next school year and the Wayne gym will no longer be needed for classrooms. If the referendum is approved, the portable classrooms will not be moved and classes would have to be held in the gym one more year.

Burckhardt Electric of West Bend was awarded the contract for three room-size air conditioners with a capacity of 10,000 b.t.u's per unit at a total cost of \$700.35. They will be installed in the music rooms at the high school. Though specifications were sent to other firms, there was only one other bid that from Montgomery Ward, West Bend, for \$654.69. Although it was not the low bid, the Burckhardt bid was accepted for reasons of service

Also accepted was a bid from Carroll Haug and Sons, West Bend, to repair a leak in the roof of the main entrance of the high school building at a cost of \$1,640. It was reported this has been a troublesome leak for many years and numerous patch jobs have been attempted. The Haug firm will tear out that portion of the roof that leaks and replace it completely.






