Parents Voice Objections to Plan For Busing Private School Pupils

About a half dozen parents who have children attending private schools outside the Kewaskum school district voiced objections on proposed bussing plans to the board of education when it met Monday night.

In the group were two women bus drivers who said they had attended a meeting Monday morning called by Johnson Bus Service which begins a three-year contract this school year.

About 40 pupils are involved in being bussed to St. Mary's, St. John's and Good Shepherd Schools in West Bend. Mrs. Faye Nordin said she attended the bus drivers' meeting as a driver and as a parent and learned that these students will ride with senior high students to Kewaskum and be taken to West Bend in another bus later.

Since the high school goes on split shift with classes starting at 7:30 a. m. it will mean the parochial children will be left waiting at the high school until their bus comes to take them to West Bend. Those schools begin at 8 and 8:15 a. m. Mrs. Nordin stated. "Who will supervise our children during the waiting time?" she wanted to know. There will also be a waiting period each afternoon. In addition, these children will be late for classes at West Bend, she said.

Mrs. Nordin said for the past three years she drove a special bus directly to West Bend. She, along with the parents present, liked that schedule and said they would like it to continue.

Supt. Floyd Brenholt said he was unable to make a recommendation as of Monday night because he had been unable to contact bus company officials. He agreed that if the transfer bus has to wait for the elementary busses, the private school students would arrive late at their respective schools.

"Barring the late problem, I would like to suggest we try this new schedule for a few weeks and see how it works. If it can be made to work, it is cheaper on a daily basis than to run one extra route and from an efficiency point of view, the junior and senior high busses are not fully loaded," Brenholt said.

But none of the parents present were willing to try. They contended that it's a long day from 6:30 a. m. when the children board the bus to 4:30 or 5 p. m. when they return and that "there is time for them to get into mischief."

Costwise, it was noted, a shuttle bus will cost \$10 per day compared with \$29 per day for a separate run on a regular route to West Bend.

When the bus contract was awarded, Johnson won it by under-bidding Baumann Bus Service, substantially. This may be a place where Johnson cut corners to cut costs, one parent observed.

Brenholt said he will talk to Johnson officials and get a letter to the board members. "We can hold another meeting, if necessary," he stated.

Mrs. Lloyd Backhaus, who also

drove for Baumann, said she wanted to make the board aware of another possible problem—many children may be walking to pick-up points on main roads from their homes.

Brenholt noted that "we have policies on how far a child shall walk — up to .3 mile for younger children and up to .5 mile for the older students." Student bussing proposals are subject to board approval, he noted and before they are approved, he will have present bus supervisor Kenneth Erickson and former supervisor Roy Esser go over them with him.

Officially, Miss Katherine Konzevic was given a contract for junior high counselor, a newly created position. A graduate of the University of Wisconsin - Superior, she spent two years in the Peace Corps in the Philippines and has taught in Cedarburg.

Standard Oil Co. was awarded the fuel oil contract on a bid of 12 1/2 cents per gallon for 6,000 gallon deliveries in Kewaskum and 13.138 cents per gallon for tank wagon deliveries at Farmington and Wayne Schools.

Milwaukee Woman Killed in T. Wayne Crash

A Milwaukee woman was fatally injured Friday in a two car crash in the Town of Wayne. Killed was Mrs. Audrey Sullivan, 44, of 3700 W. Green Tree Road, Milwaukee.

According to the sheriff's department report, a car driven by Mrs. Geraldine Y. Roecker, 51, of 2415 N. 56th St., Milwaukee, and an auto operated by Miss Susan C. Batzler, 24, of R. 3, Campbellsport collided at the intersection of County Trunk BB and State Hwy. 28 about four miles west of Kewaskum at 2:33 p. m.

The report said the Batzler car was traveling east on 28 when the other vehicle southbound on BB, went through the stop sign and the collision resulted.

Miss Batzler was treated at St. Joseph's Community Hospital, West Bend, and released Saturday. Mrs. Roecker was transferred to St. Joseph's Hospital, Milwaukee. Mrs. Sullivan was a passenger in the Roecker auto. She was pronounced dead at the scene of the crash by Matt L. Goeden, Jr., assistant coroner.

Goeden said Mrs. Roecker and Mrs. Sullivan had been at Lake Louise and were returning when the mishap occurred. Mr. Roecker and a friend, who left the lake in another vehicle after the women, came upon the wreck sometime after the collision.

Miss Batzler and Mrs. Roecker were removed to the hospital in the Kewaskum firemen's ambulance.

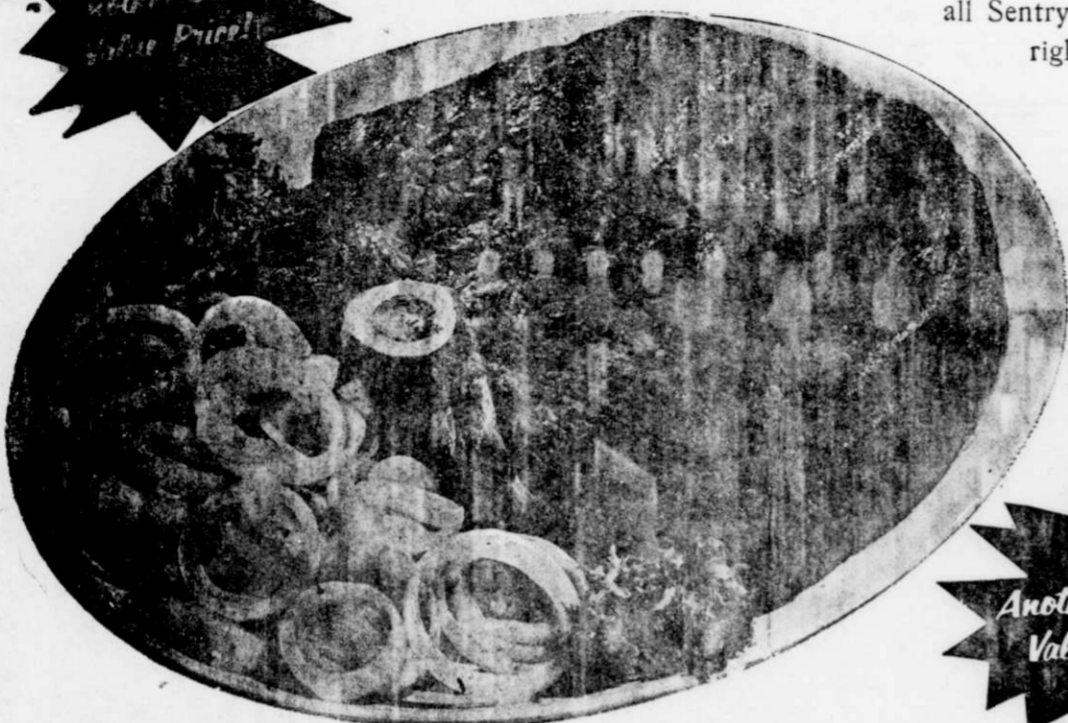
