Kewaskum's Indians gained a 3way tie for second place, behind Hartland's unbeaten champions, by racking Germantown in the season's finale here Friday night, 28-10. The win could be termed an upset as Germantown had a 5-1 record going into the game and had not been defeated since the season's opener. The Indians now share the 2nd spot with Germantown and Mayville, all with 5-2 marks. Kewaskum wound up with a fine overall 7-2 record.

Only a few more days and all the campaigning will be over when voters go to the polls on Tuesday, Nov. 7, to cast their ballots on General Eletion Day throughout the state a d nation.

Wisconsin citizens will go to the polls to select a president and vice president, congressmen, state senators, representatives to the assembly and county offcers. There will be no election for state officers who are now elected for four year terms and the incumbents have two more years to go.

Polls in the Village of Kewaskum will be open from a. m. to 8 p. m. and voters will gain cast their ballots in the fire station at the municipal building. Voters of the Town of Kewaskum will vote 'prevent forest fires."
