## 2 School Board Positions Open; File by Jan. 23

School Board elections for the Kewaskum School District will be held on April 3, 1973. There are two positions open this year, with the terms of Richard Theusch and Gerald Zimmel expiring.

Residents of the district who are interested in being a candidate must file a Declaration of Candidacy by 5 p. m. on Tuesday, January 23. Forms may be obtained from the school district office or from James Oelhafen, School District Clerk. The completed forms must be filed with James Oelhafen by the above date and time.

This year the state laws provide that a primary must be held if there are more than twice as many candidates as there are openings. If more than five candidates file, therefore, there will be a primary election held.

## County Residents Contribute \$6,754 To 1972 Christmas Seal Campaign

Washington county residents have contributed \$6,754 to the 1972 Christmas Seal campaign which has raised \$592,649 statewide, just under 80% of the \$750,000 goal. Last year Washington county residents contributed \$8,871 according to Charles Chapman, Washington county Special Gifts Chairman.

Because Christmas Seals are traditionally associated with the holidays, the amount raised by the end of the holiday season usually represents 80% of the final total for the campaign. Christmas Seal campaign officials remained guardedly optimistic however, that the goal can still be reached before the end of the fiscal year on March 31.

"This year's campaign has already surpassed last year's total of \$573,121," campaign officials said, "however, last year's campaign was a financial disaster. Some of the needed programs curtailed last year are already being implemented. More than 4,000 requests for information on smoking and lung diseases have been an-

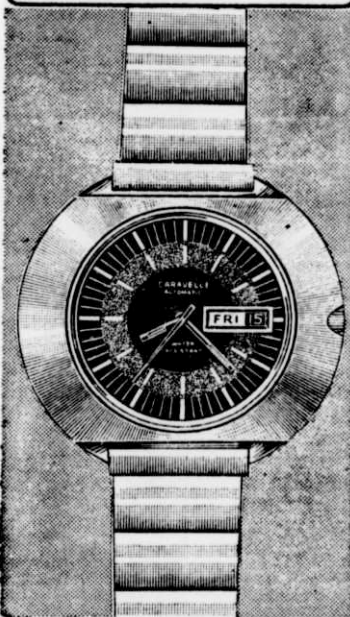

**NOTICE FOR REQUEST FOR LOCATION APPROVAL OF THE MILWAUKEE TO GREEN BAY ROAD SAUKVILLE TO BELLEVUE INTERCHANGE SECTION INTERSTATE HIGHWAY 57 OZAUKEE, SHEBOYGAN, MANITOWOC AND BROWN COUNTIES**

All interested persons are hereby given notice that the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Division of Highways, has on December 21, 1972, requested approval from the U. S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration, for the location of about 82 miles of new Interstate Highway 57 in Ozaukee, Sheboygan, Manitowoc and Brown Counties. Corridor public hearings were held on December 1, 1970, at Plymouth; December 2, 1970, at Reedsville; December 15, 1971, at Manitowoc and December 16, 1971, at Kohler.

Corridor "G", as presented at the 1971 hearings, is the corridor for which location approval is being requested. Corridor "G" begins at the Ozaukee interchange near Saukville in Ozaukee County; then proceeds northeasterly 31 miles (over the presently approved Highway 141 freeway location) to the Highway 42 interchange in Sheboygan County; thence northeasterly 20 miles (in a mile wide corridor parallel to Highway 141) to Highway 151 at Manitowoc; then northwesterly 31 miles to the proposed Bellevue Interchange, about two miles south of the City of Green Bay in Brown County, Wisconsin.

After analyzing the social, economic, and environmental effects of the alternatives and after giving consideration to the views of interested citizens, the Division of

Highways is requesting approval of the location depicted by Corridor "G" presented at the public hearings.
