## Village, Town Officials, School Board Members to Be Elected Tuesday

Next Tuesday, April 3, the general spring election will be held in Kewaskum, Washington County, and throughout the State of Wisconsin. Polls will be open from 9 a. m. to 8 p. m. in the village and area townships. Balloting for the Village of Kewaskum will be at the municipal building and for the Town of Kewaskum at the Labor Center.

To be elected in this area are village and town officials, school board members, state judicial officials, state superintendent of schools, and two referendum questions will be voted on.

In Kewaskum this year, a president and three trustees are to be elected for two year terms. Charles F. Miller, (presently a trustee and county board member) is unopposed for president to succeed Cyril N. Wietor, who is not a candidate for re-election after four years as president and 10 more as a trustee. Five candidates are running for the three trustee posts. They are Alfred Kral (incumbent), Daniel S. Schmidt, Robert Staehler, Roger Strack and John R. Tessar. The other incumbent, Orval Behnke, is not seeking re-election.

Two school board members will be elected in Kewaskum Community Schools, Jt. District No. 2, to succeed Richard Theusch and Gerald Zimmel, neither of which is seeking re-election. There are four candidates for the two positions. They are Gerald Secor, a former board member, Paul S. Berg, David H. Wenzel and Byron W. Gessner.

For state superintendent of schools the two candidates on the ballot are Ernest J. Korpela and Barbara Thompson. There were 15 candidates in the primary election with the field being narrowed down to the two highest.

State-wide for justice of the supreme court, Bruce F. Beilfuss, the incumbent, is being opposed by Robert J. Beaudry.

Two referendums will also be voted on, one that would legalize bingo and the other would give approval to the so-called "Women's equal rights amendment."

In the Town of Kewaskum for chairman, Carl A. Meilahn (incumbent) will be opposed by Mervin Thompson. There are four candidates for the two supervisor posts, namely Jerome Herriges (incumbent), James Andre, David D. Dorn and Edwin A. Seefeld. After 20 years as a supervisor, Arnold Amerling is retiring this year. June Berg and Barbara Fickler Hinz are running for clerk to succeed Alfred H. Seefeldt, who is retiring after 40 years in office. William Bruhn (incumbent) is unopposed for treasurer. For assessor Donald K. Below (incumbent) will be opposed by Raymond Schaefer.

In the Town of Wayne, Chairman John A. Oelhafen is unopposed. Daniel B. Coulter will challenge Merlin Ernise and Leo Zehren, both incumbents, wrong.

for a supervisory slot. There will be a two-way race for town clerk between Gerald Schulz and Orville Kern to succeed retiring Paul Moritz. Treasurer Raymond Kudek and Assessor Alvin Wiesner will be unopposed on the ballot but H. S. "Squeaky" Schwichtenberg will be a write-in candidate for assessor.

In the Town of Auburn, Chairman Roger Schleif will be opposed by Richard Giersch. Running for the two supervisory posts are Hilary Hoepner (incumbent), Richard Dreher, Donald Stoffel and Allen (Buck) Weaver. Edward Kreuzer will oppose incumbent Norbert Gatzke for assessor. Clerk Camilla Butzke, Treasurer Elmer Krueger and Constable Donald Hammes are unopposed.

## Board Approves Building Specifications; 29 Firms Consider Submitting Bids

### Teachers Attend Driver Education State Conference

Earl Buswell, Howard Zemlicka and David Stradtman from Kewaskum Community High School attended the Eleventh Annual State Conference for Driver and Traffic Education at Stevens Point on March 23-24.

More than 350 high school driver and safety education teachers, school administrators, and school safety coordinators attended this conference. Over twenty national and state exhibits featuring new methods, equipment, and teaching aids were on display. This annual state conference is sponsored and coordinated by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction. The Wisconsin Driver and Traffic Safety Education Association assists annually in this largest state conference in the nation. I. Russell Hutter, Department Driver Education and Traffic Safety Consultant, was convention coordinator and served as master of ceremonies for the Friday evening banquet. William Richardson, WDTSEA president from Waupun High School, was chairman.

The theme for the 1973 conference was "Teaching for Emergency Situations." The "Dodge Safety Sheriff" Joe Higgins, Hollywood, Calif., was the Friday evening banquet speaker. His presentation was directed toward the communication gap with the youth, with special emphasis upon the youth and traffic safety. Higgins has progressed from what started out four years ago as a spoof of lawmen in a television commercial, into full time public service work in traffic safety and citizen-police relations. He now travels thousands of miles each year as the Dodge Safety Sheriff, speaking before high school assemblies, youth gatherings, civic organizations and police groups.

The Saturday morning keynote address was delivered by Richard Whitworth, GM Proving Grounds, Detroit. Whitworth's presentation, "Teaching for Emergency Situations," was very timely in light of the need for more emergency and defensive driving instruction. Teachers had an opportunity for discussion with Whitworth following the keynote address. The delegates were divided into three groups for panel discussion. (Continued on page 2)

Contracts were approved at the meeting for Mr. Mann, the school social worker, Mr. Votjik, the school psychologist, and for the four full-time administrative staff members, Mr. Brenholt, Mr. Erickson, Mr. Pearson and Mr. Zarling.

Approval was given to have the school attorney, Roger McKenna, review utility tax payments by the various municipalities to the Kewaskum Public Schools over the past few years. Mr. Brenholt had reviewed the payments and felt there was a possible question, particularly in the Town of Scott. Part of the questions arise as a result in changes in utility tax laws over the years.

A special meeting was set for Wednesday evening, April 4, at 7:30 p. m. to canvass results of the board election of April 3.

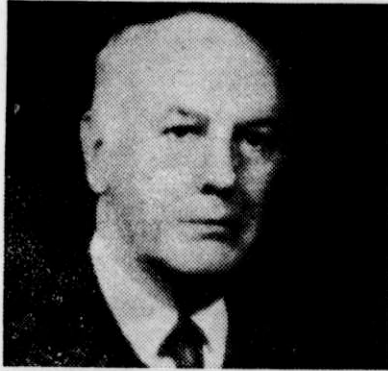

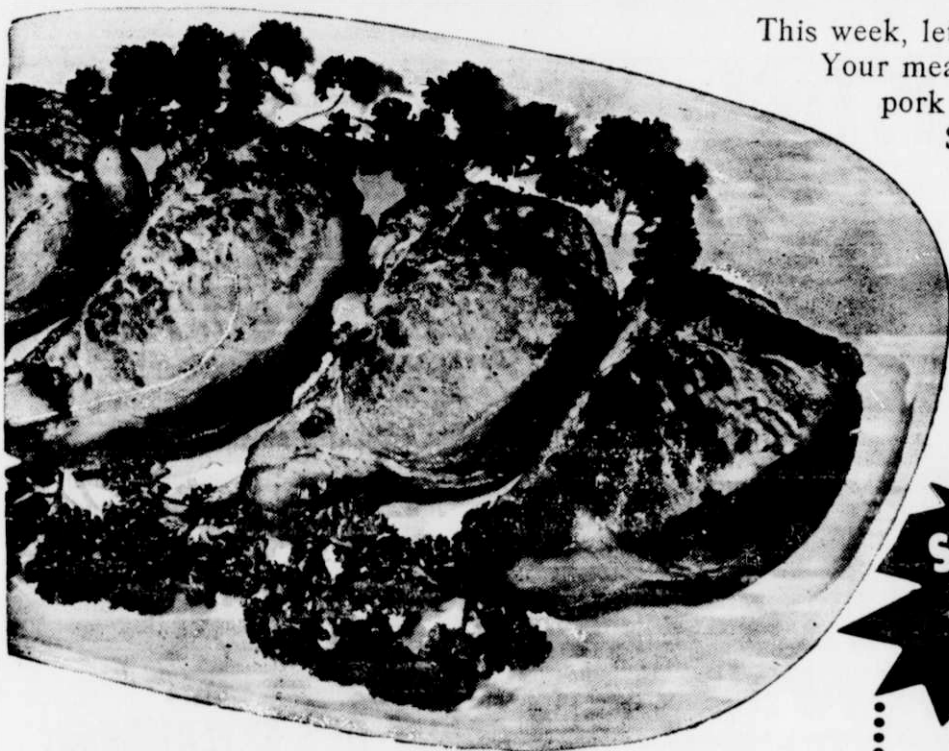

**DOG ORDINANCE**
