## Wins Clifford M. Rose Memorial Scholarship

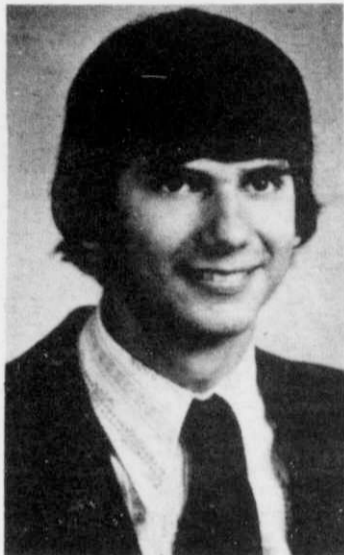

Carolyn Falk, Kewaskum, has been named Sales Service Supervisor for The West Bend Company's North Central region with headquarters in Milwaukee.

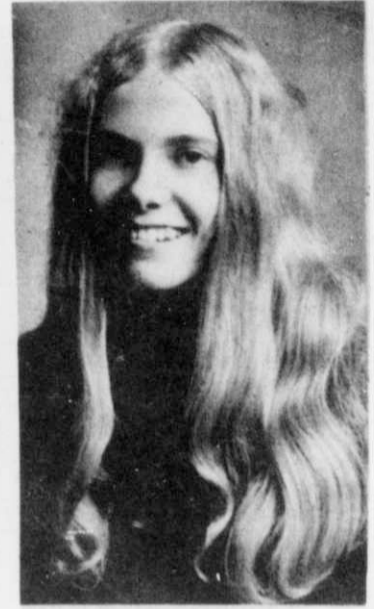
