June 3, 1974  
8:00 P. M.

The Village Board of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin, met in regular monthly session in the Council Room of the Municipal Building.

President Miller presided and all Board Members were present.

The minutes of the meetings of May 6 and May 13 were approved as presented upon motion by Trustee Hergiges, seconded by Trustee Schmidt. Unanimous vote.

A public hearing was held on the applications for renewal of the Tavern and Liquor Store licenses for the licensing period of July 1, 1974, to June 30, 1975. There were no objections to the applications as publicly read by the President. The public hearing was thereupon declared closed.

Sealed bids for the possible asphalt paving of the streets in Bel-Ric Acres were opened by President Miller, publicly read and were tabulated as follows:

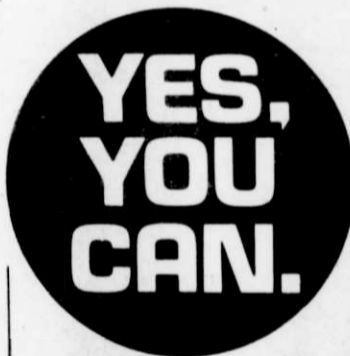
as District Attorney since March 12, 1973; when he was appointed by Gov. Lucey following the resignation of Robert A. Kauffman, a Republican.

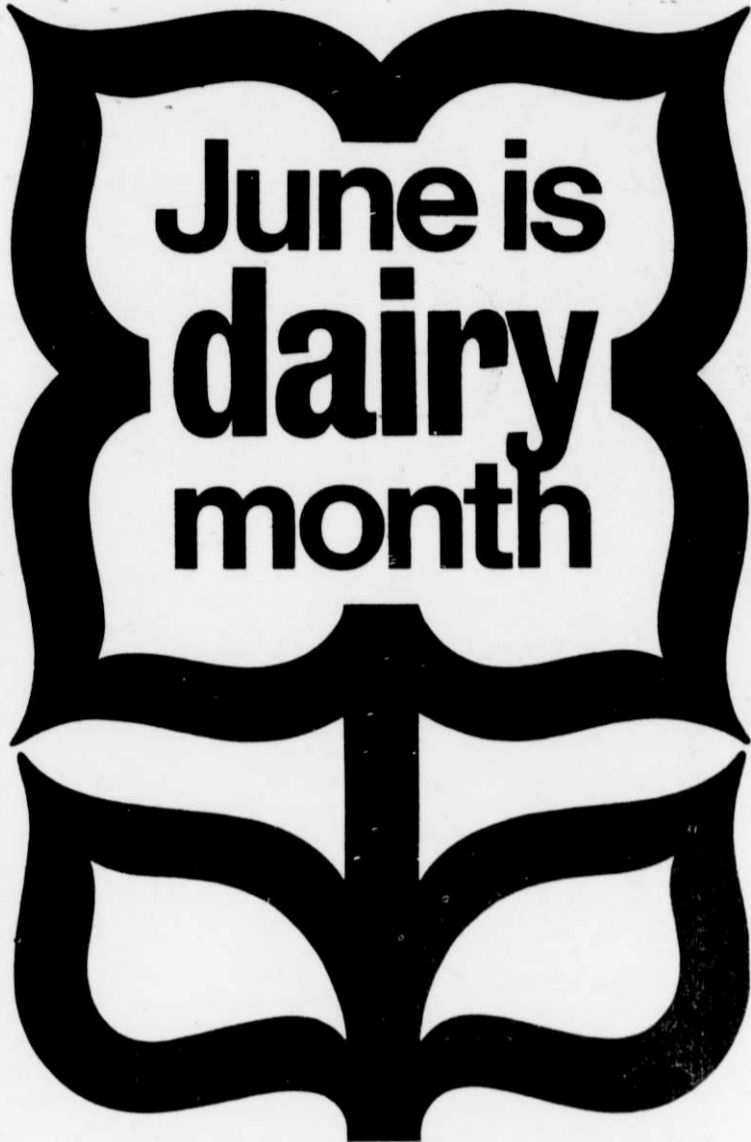
