Fire Department's New Ambulance Put Into Service

In 1951 under the direction of Marvin Martin the Kewaskum Rescue Squad was initiated. He and seven other members completed the necessary first aid course and thus became Kewaskum's first rescue squad. Their first call was made on August 23, 1951 with a 1937 Packard donated by Miller's, Inc. During the first year there was a total of 27 calls as compared to 113 calls the past year.

Over the past 20 years of

service to the community, the squad has had several vehicles. They have progressed from the first vehicle to the present 1974 Dodge van, which just recently was put into service. The new ambulance was in part financed through state funds. At present there are two rescue vehicles in service at all times to the community.

The Kewaskum rescue squad is an all voluntary organization of the Kewaskum

Volunteer Fire Department. At the present time it has 19 active members. Of these 19, five members are presently attending Emergency Medical Technician training. Upon completion of this course, which includes 26 three-hour sessions, plus many hours of studying, these members will be certified as Emergency Medical Technicians through the State of Wisconsin. Besides this special training,

the other members of the squad update their first aid knowledge through various courses.

The Kewaskum ambulance service would not be possible without the continuing support of the people. This support comes from the attendance at the annual picnic. This year's picnic is July 14 and will commence with a huge parade at 12:30 p. m. Hope to see you there.

Annual Firemen's Picnic and Parade Here Sunday, July 14

This year's annual Kewaskum Firemen's fund-raising picnic will be held in the village park on Sunday, July 14, and plans have been completed to make this year's event another outstanding one.

An excellent parade at 12:30 p. m. sharp will highlight the picnic and get festivities underway. The many musical units in the parade will feature such famous drum and bugle corps and bands as the Chordaliers of Milwaukee, Challengers of Milwaukee, Saberettes of Franklin, Marauders of Oshkosh, Patriots of West Bend, three Germantown bands, including the Senior High, Junior High and Grade School units, our own Kewaskum High School band, plus other musical organizations. Other units will include drill teams, beautiful floats, baton twirlers, majorettes, children's specialties, visiting firemen and equipment, Legionnaires, comic entries, ancient cars, riding horses, clubs, organizations and ma-

ny more.

Hundreds of persons will participate in the mammoth parade, which will last approximately one hour. The parade will form at the high school athletic field and parking lot, and adjacent streets, from where it will proceed to the park. All participants should be present to line up no later than noon. Persons wishing to enter the parade should contact Bob Staehler, parade chairman, or Dave Zehren. Theme of this year's parade will be "Back Home on the Farm." All area businessmen and others are invited to enter a float in the parade. It is recommended that the maximum height of any float entered be kept under 15 feet.

Prizes will be awarded for floats as follows: 1st place, \$100; 2nd, \$60; 3rd, \$40; 4th, \$20. There will be the children's specialties section for children 12 and under with prizes to be awarded as follows: 1st, \$12; 2nd, \$8; 3rd, \$6; 4th, \$4; 5th, \$2.

Immediately following the

parade there will be exhibitions by drum and bugle corps in the park. From then on there will be continuous music and entertainment throughout the afternoon and evening. Live music will be supplied on the park stage and in the popular beer garden by The Julida Boys, Bill Thull Orchestra and Bill Sackett's band. Admission will be free to the beer garden which has a blacktopped floor at the south end of the park.

Adding to the festivities there will be kiddie rides, concessions, games and a variety of refreshments and food, including those tasty brats and hamburgers. The popular water fights will again be held at 6:30 p. m. with neighboring fire departments competing.

Tickets are available for 89 valuable prizes which will be awarded in conjunction with the picnic. First prize will be a seven day trip to Hawaii for two. Winners will be announced at a later date.

Everyone is invited to come for a real good time and "gemuetlichkeit" at the annual Kewaskum picnic.

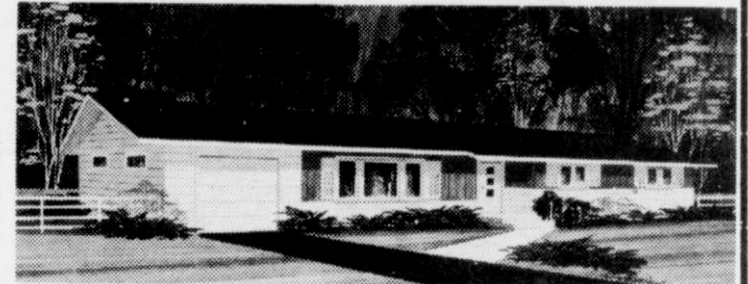
