. The Kewaskum Indians will open a nine-game football season on Friday night, Sept. 6, with a non-conference contest at Campbellsport. Game time is 7:30.

The Indians will play their home opener the following Friday night, Sept 13, with JFK Prep of St. Nazianz, a new opponent, in another no-loop game before facing Slinger here in the Scenic Moraine opener Sept 20. JFK Prep defeated Campbellsport last Saturday, 20-0.

Kewaskum scrimmaged against West Bend East there Friday. It was a fairly even scrimmage with the Indians coming on strong in the second half to get the better of it and leaving a few minor bumps and bruises on the Suns.

With 10 lettermen returning, the Indians could be a title contender this year, al-Germantown has though been tabbed as the pre-season favorite. Two all-conference players head the list of lettermen who will form the nucleus for the squad. They are seniors Scott Koth, defensive and offensive back, and Mike Koepke, offensive end and middle linebacker.

They will be joined by six other seniors and two juniors who earned letters in 1973. The senior lettermen are Randy Koepke, quarterback; John Kleinman, offensive and defensive back; Jim Ciha, guard; Don Gruber, cen-

ter; Doug Strack, end, and Tom Timblin, end, and juniors Dave Menzel, fullback, and Jack Westerman, guard. One other letterman, Dennis Bremser, underwent knee surgery and is possibly lost for the season. He was expected to be one of the best defensive backs.

The Indian varsity has close to 40 members, including 19 seniors, 2 sophomores and the balance juniors. The two sophs, Leon Laatsch and Gary Gavin, both have shots at starting positions. Both are 6 feet or better and go 190 lbs.

Coach Joe Harlow stresses that the offensive line has looked mighty tough, with Gruber, junior Keith Mueller and Timblin all looking good in pre-season workouts. On defense, in the backfield, Mike Strigenz may have won a starting job.
