L. Rosenheimer to Observe 100th Anniversary

The L. Rosenheimer Department Store, which has played a significant part in the development of Kewaskum, will observe the 100th anniversary of its founding next week.

Inside the vault in the familiar red brick building on Fond du Lac Avenue is the original ledger. On the first page, penned with a flourish, is recorded the first sale, dat-

Merchants to Hold Week Long Centennial Sale

In commemoration of L. Rosenheimer's 100 years in business, the merchants of Kewaskum, in cooperation with the Kewaskum Area Chamber of Commerce, are conducting a week long Centennial Sale Oct. 21-26. See their many ads on the inside pages of this issue.

ed Oct. 28, 1874, in the amount of 73 cents. Judging from the many names in the well-kept book, the store was well patronized.

The original store was a small building to the rear of the present structure. No pre-packaged foods, no ready to heat TV dinners, no selfservice and no cars outside in a parking lot-only hitched up horse-drawn wagons waited outside while the farmers were inside doing their trading.

And a great share of the business was trading-eggs and other farm products for

groceries. generally settle up their accounts once a year.

A historical sketch reveals that Lehman Rosenheimer was born in Dormitz, Bavaria, in 1820. Emigrating to America as a young man he found employment as a farm hand in the state of New York. He worked his way to Milwaukee and then to Schleisingerville (now Slinger) where, in 1855, he began a very successful business of buying grain and cattle from farmers for miles around. In return he sold the food, clothing and supplies they needed.

As his family and business continued to grow through the years, he sent his secondeldest son, Moritz, to Kewaskum to establish a like business. Adolph, a younger bro-

Farmers would ther, followed shortly, and thus L. Rosenheimer General Merchants began operations on Oct. 21, 1874, in the building shown at the top of the above sketch.

Able and industrious men, Moritz and Adolph expanded their business rapidly until it became imperative that the facilities be enlarged. And so, in 1903, the present store building shown at the bottom of the sketch, was erected. Through their efforts, Kewaskum had become a renowned market center by this time, with farmers com-ing from far and near to do their trading.

Their 50th anniversary celebration in 1924 was acclaimed throughout Wisconsin. During their major ex-

Joe Gruber Elected Executive Vice President of State AFL-CIO



Joseph Gruber, R. 2. Campbellsport, a member of AIW Local 849, which represents workers from Regal Ware Inc., Kewaskum, and a representative for Region 9 of the Allied Industrial Workers Union, has been elected new executive vice president of the state AFL-CIO at the group's convention in Green

He was president of Local 849 from 1962 through 1968, when he was appointed a full-time representative for Region 9. Gruber has been a leader in many COPE activities and was chairman of the sixth and ninth Congressional District COPE Committees for six years until 1973. He is an active member of the Democratic Party.

Born in 1931 in Kewaskum, Gruber, who worked as a Tool and Die Maker at the Regal cookware manufacturing firm, served four years in the Army Corps of Engineers.

In his new position he succeeds John Giacomo, Milwaukee, who retired at the October State AFL-CIO convention. The executive vice president has the responsibility of running the State AFL-CIO's Committee on Political Education (COPE) program.

Gruber outpolled Robert Durkin, vice president of the Milwaukee County Labor Council, 98,047 to 79,246 for the high labor post. John Schmitt, president, and Jack Reihl, secretary - treasurer, both incumbents, were reelected to their posts without opposition. Reihl is from West Bend.

Gruber won his post in a runoff election following the narrowing down of candidates from four to two. His four-year term begins immediately and his major role will be that of political education for the union, representing some 300,000 workers in Wisconsin.

Some 700 delegates of the union attended the convention held at the Brown County arena.



pansion years, the alert brothers found the need for a creamery, a malt house and banking facilities, all of which became successful operations. The creamery was later disposed of, and as the brothers' families expanded, it was decided in 1911 to divide their interests.

Adolph and his sons continued the banking and malting businesses, and Moritz, whose son Lehman and sonin-law David were well established in the business by this time, turned the general merchandise and product operations over to them and their able management.

David and Lehman carried on in the family tradition of industry and fair dealing, and weathered the great Depression of the 1930's, the advent of chain and discount store competition and the war years of the 1940's.During this period Henry and Lehman, sons of David and Lehman, had entered the family business, and in 1952 they purchased all interests from relatives and incorpor-

Indians, Minus Koth, Edged by Mayville, 15-14, for First Loss


Playing without their leading rusher, Scott Koth, who was out with an injury, Kewaskum lost a heartbreaker Friday night at Mayville, where they were shaded in the Cardinals' homecoming game 15-14. It was the Indians' first loss of the season after 5 victories.


Germantown's win over Slinger Saturday, 29-6, gave them the undisputed Scenic lead with a 4-0 mark. The Indians setback dropped them to a tie for 2nd with Mayville and Grafton. Mayville lost to the Warhawks the week before. Both are 3-1.

Koth ran for over 700 yards in the Indians' first 5 games and was also one of the top scorers in the conference. He fell short of 100 yard games only once. He did not play or carry the ball at all at Mayville but only handled the punting chores. He could have made the difference. Kewaskum also lost Mike Strigenz and John Sekeres early in the game with injuries, which also hurt. Mayville received a big assist in its victory from the officials on several questionable calls against the Indians.

It was a story of Kewaskum winning the 1st half and Mayville the 2nd half. The Indians, who entered the game as the state's 9th ranked Class B school by the Associated Press, scored twice in the 1st half for a 14-0 lead. However, Mayville, which had its own dream of an unbeaten season jolted at Germantown the previous Friday, 34-0, sccred twice in the 2nd half to win on a 2point conversion.

In the 1st half, Kewaskum looked like it was well on its way to its 6th straight win. Quarterback Randy Koepke scored on a 12-yard run after a 79 yard drive in the 1st quarter and later passed 40 yards to Mike Koepke for a touchdown. The Indians missed the extra point kick, which looked good but was ruled wide, after the 1st TD. This eventually proved to be





fatal. R. Koepke passed to M. Koepke for the 2-point conversion after the 2nd touchdown and it was 14-0.

The defense set up Mayville's 1st TD in the 2nd half. Nick Persha blocked a Kewaskum punt and Stipanovic wound up scoring on a 4-yard run. Stipanovic kicked the extra point. Bob Kanas intercepted a Kewaskum pass and returned it to the Indian 40-yard line to set up Mayville's 2nd touchdown. Stipanovic climaxed the ensuing drive with a 1-yard run. for a score. Joe Hesprich then ran the decisive 2-point conversion with 6:26 left in the game and the Cardinals hung on for their 4th win over rival Kewaskum in the last 5 years.

Kewaskum came back with a drive of its own after Dave Menzel broke loose with a 42 yard run. It looked like he would go all the way but a Mayville tackler caught up to him on the Cardinals' 24, But there the effort stalled as Mayville held.

The Indians outgained the Cardinals by 72 yards. M. Koepke led the effort with 7 catches for 96 yards. Hesprich led Mayville with 86 yards in 14 carries. Tom Biertzer, a 6-ft., 220-lb. senior, had 13 tackles for the winners.

In other games besides Mayville-Kewaskum & Germantown-Slinger, Hartland narrowly beat Kettle Moraine, 16-8, and Grafton beat Pewaukee.

This Friday Kewaskum will go for all the marbles when they host powerful, undefeated Germantown, which has had only 1 touchdown scored against it in conference. The game would be even more important were it not for the Indians' loss at Mayville. Kewaskum now must win this one to remain in contention for the title. Germantown is 4-0 in conference and 6-0 overall.
