## Village Tax Bills to Be Higher by \$2.85 Per \$1,000

The tax bills to be received by village taxpayers later this month will be higher than those of last year, by about \$2.85 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation.

Village trustees have adopted a 1975 budget totaling \$1,170,455.51 that calls for a tax levy of \$826,627.21 and a tax rate of \$39.67 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation.

However, from the \$39.67 will be deducted the state tax credit estimated at \$5.48 bringing the net rate to \$34.19, which based on those figures, means the net rate will be \$2.85 higher for each \$1,000 of assessed valuation over last year. For the owner of a property assessed at \$20,000 it will mean \$57 more in taxes. The budget is based on an assessed valuation of \$20,841,825. Removed from local tax base was \$1.6 million when the state took over the assessing of manufacturing and equipment.

The 1975 budget is up \$125,471.31 over last year's; the estimated state tax credit is down by 71 cents.

Of the \$39.67 tax rate, 30 cents is apportioned for state taxes; \$4.64 for county taxes; \$22.38 for school taxes; \$1.71 for vocational taxes;

and \$10.64 for village taxes, including debt retirement and interest.

The budget was adopted following a public hearing on Dec. 2. Only two persons attended and neither made any comments. Taxpayers may pay their tax bill in a lump sum or they make it in two payments, the first of which must be paid at the municipal building before Feb. 28, 1975.

During their board meeting, village officials said they were not satisfied with the recent repair job on the north half of the Main Street railroad crossing by the Chi- (Continued on Page 2)

## Rev. Dan Schowalter Resigns As Pastor of Peace Church

The Rev. Daniel Schowalter, who has been pastor of Peace United Church of Christ here for the past ten years, has tendered his resignation to the congregation, effective Jan. 30, 1975.

He has accepted a call to become senior pastor of Zion United Church of Christ, Milwaukee. This parish is one church on two locations; one is at 3301 S. 76th St., the other at 1418 W. Greenfield Ave.

The family came here in June of 1964 from southwestern Wisconsin where Rev. Dan served a double pastorate at Peace UCC in Browntown and at St. Paul UCC, South Wayne. Before that he served Faith E & R Church, Erdman, near Sheboygan, first as student pastor while he attended Mission House College and Seminary (now Lakeland College) and as regular pastor following his graduation from the seminary in 1954.

He was ordained on June 6, 1954 in his home church of St. Peter's UCC, Jackson. He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Schowalter. He was honored here in June by members of Peace Church, and past and present friends, on the occasion of the 20th anniversary of his ordination.

Rev. Dan was instrumental in organizing the senior citizens' group here some five years ago. He has been active within and outside his professional domain not only in Kewaskum but in Washington County as well.

The Schowalter family consists of wife Laura, and four children, Debbie, Mary, Barbara and Jim.

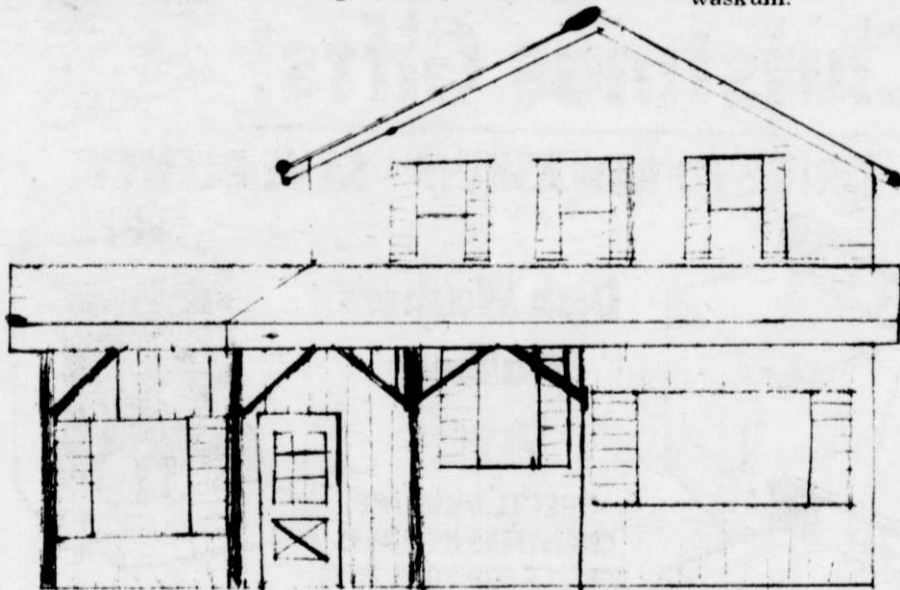
Chief Armin Oppermann, who is appointed by the Village Board, holds over in of-

## Floral Shop Getting New Look

The Tom Herman family is in the process of giving their Kewaskum Floral Shop a new look. And when the project is completed—hopefully by Mother's Day—the new look will include a completely new front, entrance and display window; a 13 by 24 foot workroom will be added at the rear; the entire interior will be redecorated and a greenhouse will be added to the east.

The front of the shop will be extended. The new entrance will be on the east side. A roofed porch will lead from the front entrance to the greenhouse. Inside the shop, the rear wall will be torn out to make one large workroom area.

The 13½ by 38 foot greenhouse will be strictly a display area in a changing garden scene geared to the changing seasons. Amongst the potted plants, there will be a waterfall, rock garden and a garden walk complete with tables and chairs for the enjoyment of their customers.

Though there will be new construction on three sides, the Hermans will retain the antique look to the building. New areas will be covered with siding in a stained brown shade.

Like their floral business, the new look package is a family project. They planned and designed it. And they are doing most of the work themselves. Assisting Tom

and Millie in the business are their children Laurie who works full time; plus Patty, Jane (Merkel), Glen and Gary. Also employed in the shop are Athleen Butzke and Kathy Kougl.

The Herman business started in a small way at their rural home. Their first shop was at 219 Main St., then moved to the Koch building down the street which was destroyed by fire. Following their complete loss, the Hermans opened up again in their present location. Earlier this year they bought the property from Mrs. Stachia Swan, who formerly owned and operated what is now the Busy B's, next door.

## KHS Wins TV's 'Who Knows' Title



The Kewaskum High School "Who Knows" team has become the 16th undefeated champion by defeating South Milwaukee High School in the popular Milwaukee Channel 6 TV series. In a hard fought final round match Sunday, Kewaskum emerged victorious by the close score of 181-179. KHS has participated twice before in the show, each time being defeated in the semi-finals.

The Kewaskum team consisted of Capt. Tom Degnitz, senior, son of Mr. and Mrs. Willard Degnitz, R. 1, Kewaskum. Ralph Butz, senior, son of Mr. and Mrs. Vernon Butz, Kewaskum, and Dale Secor, senior, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Secor, R. 1, Kewaskum. Alternates were Mark Smucker, junior, and Mike Koepke, senior. Their advisor is George Allman, an English instructor at the high school. South Milwaukee's advisor is Mona Mer-

tes, a well known former Kewaskum resident.

Kewaskum received a check for \$200 from Sher-kow's Formal Wear, the show's sponsor, as well as the first place trophy. South Milwaukee received \$100 for their efforts. Each team had received \$150 prior to this time for their victories up to that time. Kewaskum defeated Franklin High School, the returning champions, by a very close margin, then returned to beat Jefferson High School in the quarter-finals, and Grafton High in the semi-finals before their latest victory.

The show was taped on Sunday, Dec. 8, and will be aired on Sunday, Dec. 22, on WITI-TV 6, Milwaukee, at 3 p. m. Kewaskum's victory assures them of being invited to participate in the 18th round of competition, which will begin next fall.

 cago & Northwestern Railway crew and noted that the re-surfacing material has already begun to flake off. Village Commissioner Bill Martin was instructed to send a letter of complaint, asking that the north half be redone.

Board members voted unanimously to exercise the village option with Mrs. Viola Spoerl for the purchase of approximately 35 acres of land at the west village limits for park purposes. Purchase price is \$2,200 per acre with the total cost figure to be determined after a land survey. The village recently received \$77,000 from the Kewaskum Kiwanis Club toward park costs. It will be known as Kewaskum Kiwanis Community Park.

In addition, the application by the village for a state grant has been approved by the Department of Natural Resources and \$29,000 has been pledged through the state Outdoor Recreation Act Program (ORAP-200).

Purchases authorized include a rebuilt IBM electric typewriter for \$290; a Ford truck chassis with heavy duty dump box from Stocker Ford, West Bend, for \$9,991 which includes altering the wheel base; a new boiler for the waste water treatment plant from Frank Krueger for \$2,275 which includes installation costs.

Bob Kirst, chairman of the

Lions Club paper recycling project told the board he feels their monthly curbside pick-ups are not getting as much paper as they should. He said that they are getting little or no paper from apartment dwellers and that perhaps they are not aware of the pick-ups on the third Saturday of each month. He also said pick-ups from other residences are scattered. Armin Opperman, supt. of public works said "quite a bit" is still being placed in garbage cans.

Looking for help on how to spread the word of the monthly pick-ups, it was decided to place a notice in The Statesman and have an announcement made on Station WBKV, before each pick-up. Kirst said that even though paper has dropped from \$20 to \$10 per ton, the Lions will not abandon the project. They realized only \$23 from the November pick-up, he said, but some \$500 has been earned by the Lions since the project began last spring.

A building permit was approved for Kirst for a one-family dwelling to be built on the corner of Highway H and Bel-Ric Drive. It will be a Wausau Home.

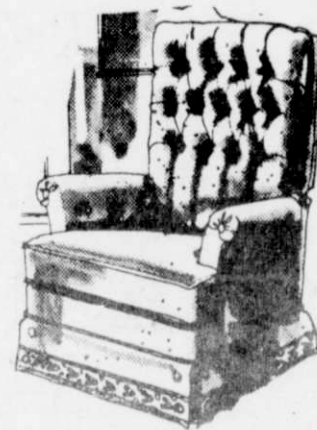

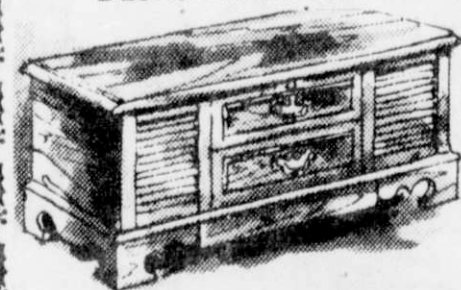

The Village Board of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin, met in adjourned session in the Council Room of the Municipal Building.

President Miller and Commissioner Martin were authorized to execute with Schulz Homes, Inc. of West Bend the agreement of compliance and the agreement of deposit with reference to the approval of the final plat of Roseland Hills Addition No. 2, these documents being dated October 7, 1974 and October 11, 1974 respectively. ORDINANCE NO. 74-2  
AN ORDINANCE AMEND-

**ING THE ZONING MAP DATED OCTOBER, 1972, OF THE VILLAGE OF KEWASKUM, WISCONSIN.**

The Village Board of the Village of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

**PART I**

Rezone the following described real estate from R-1 Residential District to R-3 and R-4 Residential District to correspond with the real estate which is east and adjacent to said real estate:

Lot Four (4) of Block Two (2) in ASSESSOR'S PLAT of the Village of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin, EXCEPTING THEREFROM that portion thereof lying Easterly of a line described as follows: Commencing at a point on the north line of said Lot 4, being North 88 degrees 40 minutes West, 207.60 feet of the westerly line of Fond du Lac Road; thence South 20 degrees 23 minutes East, 105.00 feet; thence South 49 degrees 43 minutes East, 165.72 feet to the northwesterly corner of Lot 2 in Block 2 of the Assessor's Plat and the point of ending of said line, and also EXCEPTING THEREFROM that portion lying within the plat of IDEAL SUBDIVISION NO. 1.

**PART II**

Change the Zoning District of certain lots located east of Fond du Lac Avenue

and north of 2nd Street from M-1 Light Manufacturing District to B-3 Central Community Retail Business & Services District, which real estate is described as follows:

Lots 1, 2, 3 & 4 of Block 22 and also Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of Block 23 of the ASSESSOR'S PLAT, Village of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin.

**PART III**

**1. PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION**

The Plan Commission of the Village of Kewaskum recommended the adoption of Part I of this Ordinance on the 27th day of August, 1974, and of Part II of this Ordinance on the 25th day of June, 1974.

**2. PUBLIC HEARINGS**

The Kewaskum Village Board held a public hearing on this proposed Ordinance on the 30th day of September, 1974.

**3. VILLAGE BOARD APPROVAL**

The Village Board concurred with the recommendation of the Plan Commission and proceeded to adopt the Zoning Ordinance Revision by a vote at a meeting held on the 11th day of October, 1974.

## Indians Dump Germantown, 86-75, Run Wild Over Pewaukee, 99-51

The Kewaskum Indians are getting football out of their systems and really starting to jell on the basketball court as demonstrated by two impressive victories the past week. At Germantown Friday they knocked off the defending co-champs, 86-75, and in doing so ran up their highest point total in about 3 years. This mark didn't stand up long as Tuesday they ran up 99 points in bombing Pewaukee in a mismatch here, 99-51, a margin of 48 points, and the highest point total in many years.

Wins in their first 2 conference games (4-1 overall) give the Indians a 1st place tie with Grafton. Coaches and writers have picked Hartland as the favorite to win the title but we've gone along with Grafton as a leading contender all along, even more so after the Blackhawks defeated Plymouth (which shaded Kewaskum in a ragged opener) and both West Bend teams. Kewaskum faces Grafton headon there this Friday.

At Germantown, after a close first half, Kewaskum opened the 2nd half with a press that broke the game open as the Indians outscored the Warhawks in the 3rd quarter, 25-18, to take a 64-52 lead. It was a loosely played game with plenty of turnovers and fouls. In fact a total of 56 personals were called. The Indians missed 17 free throws or they would have run their score even higher. They sank 22 to Germantown's 23.

The Indians led at the half by 5 points, 39-34, after the Warhawks had led momentarily in the 2nd quarter for

the only time. Kewaskum's press in the 2nd half gave Germantown trouble in getting off a shot and at one time Kewaskum led by 20 points, 58-38, never being in trouble after that.

The Indians' height helped them control the game as they out-rebounded their opponents, 37-30. Mike Koepke had 12 boards and Don Gruber 11. Koepke also had a game high 19 points and his cousin Randy was next with 16. Gruber and Jim Bilgo each scored 15. Brian Krueger paced Germantown with 18. Kewaskum shot close to 50% from the floor on 32 out of 65, while the Warhawks were 26 out of 62.

In other Scenic games Friday Grafton surprised Hartland right off the bat, 74-62. Kettle Moraine edged Mayville, 44-42, and Slinger barely won over Pewaukee, 82-77.

The Indians put on quite an offensive show in Tuesday's breather here as they ran wild over Pewaukee, 99-51. The Pirates had given Slinger a close battle Friday. But the outcome was already decided in the 2nd quarter and Coach Westphal began bringing in substitutes. The regulars played a short time in the 2nd half but most of the time 2nd and 3rd stringers were in the game as all 14 players suited for the squad (one is out with an injury) broke into the scoring column. The subs continued to add to the margin over Pewaukee. When the score got into the 90's fans yelled for 100 and the scrappy subs came close to making it. Dennis Eremser got the 99th point on a free throw but missed the try for 100.

With the score tied at 8-8, Scott Koth made 6 straight points and Kewaskum was off to the races. The Pirates had trouble getting shots against the tough Indian zone defense. In the 2nd quarter big Mike Koepke and Don Gruber led the scoring and by halftime the Indians were out of reach, 45-24.

As at Germantown, the Indians again had balanced scoring with 4 players in double figures. M. Koepke was high with 17 points, Koth and Gruber each had 16 and Bilgo 10. Jensen was high for the losers with 11 and Dunne got 10. Gruber led in rebounds with 11 and the starters didn't play that much.

The Indian JV's lost their 2nd game, 51-47. L. Laatsch was the top scorer with 20 for the losers.

In remaining Scenic contests Tuesday Hartland barely shaded Kettle Moraine in overtime, 72-71, Germantown beat Mayville, 60-48, and Grafton just squeezed by Slinger, 76-74, on a disputed basket at the buzzer in which one official overruled the other.

Friday the Indians travel to Grafton for an early showdown with the Blackhawks, who have not yet been defeated this year. This game will also settle the first place tie.
