20 Fire Departments Participate In Three-Evening Seminar Here

On Dec. 10, 11 and 12, a fire inspection seminar was conducted at the Kewaskum Fire Station, with three-hour sessions each evening.

This seminar was made available through Roy Esser, Kewaskum High School voag instructor, and William Langham of Moraine Park Technical Institute of Fond du Lac.

A total of 20 fire departments participated. They came from five counties—Washington, Sheboygan Fond du Lac, Dodge and Ozaukee. A total of 217 men participated on the three evenings.

Marvin Olson of Madison, who is Chief of Fire Prevention of the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations, was the instructor Dec. 10. This session was mainly on fire prevention and inspection of public places for fire hazards. On Dec. 11 a course on flammable liquids was given and all oil distributors and bulk oilmen were invited. This also dealt with the new O.S.H.A. regulations. The Dec. 12 session again dealt with inspection of public places.

Indians Stop Hartland With Big 2nd Quarter

Hartland Arrowhead, the team selected by most coaches to take the Scenic crown this year, was stopped by a hot Kewaskum five here Friday night, 79-75, before a large crowd. It was the second loss for Arrowhead, which lost their opener to leading Grafton, although they still have one of their aces, 6'5" Heier out of ac-The win brought the Indians' record to 3-1 and a 2nd place tie with Kettle Moraine, another of the four Class A schools in the conference, which also must be reckoned with as a strong contender.

The outcome was not as close as the final score indicates. Leading 20-16 after one quarter, Kewaskum broke the game wide open with a 28 point surge in the 2nd period, in which they outscored Arrowhead, 28-17. to take a commanding 15-point 48-33 halftime advantage. Hartland came back to outpoint the Indians in the third stanza, 21-15, and narrow the gap to 63-54. Then for the 3rd straight game, Kewaskum faded in the final quarter, in which Arrowhead came within 4 points with a late rally. The Indians blew a lead and lost to Grafton the week before in the last period and handed Horicon its first loss here last Tuesday by only 3 points after holding a 60-48 lead at the end of the 3rd quarter.

In Friday's contest between two conference contenders, Kewaskum got its fast break clicking in the 2nd period. The Indians put on a great display of shooting in this torrid quarter in which the winners hit 75 per cent of their shots (12 out of 16) to break open a tight game Don Gruber led Kewaskum's surge with 12 points in the period. The 6-2 senior, who is one of the 5 top scorers in the conference, finished with 22 points and 13 rebounds. Sharpshooting Randy Koepke equalled this output with 22

and Mike Koepke, who had been 7th in scoring, totaled 13. The conference's leading scorer, Keith Chapman, who scored 35 points against Slinger the week before, was held to 22, 9 of them in the 4th quarter, but still paced his team. He had averaged 25.7 points a game in his 1st 3 starts. Right behind him were Ferris with 20 and Karpinski with 16.

After their big 2nd quarter, Kewaskum salted the game away by outscoring Hartland 10-4 at the outset of the 3rd period. After that they held a safe lead until the final 31 seconds when Arrowhead scored 4 quick points on 2 "gimme" baskets

to narrow the gap to 4 points. It was free throws that helped put the game on ice for the Indians. They made 23 of 32 to Hartland's 9 of 15, 15 of them in the 2nd half. Randy Koepke sank 6 of 7 and Scott Koth and Gruber also had 6 apiece.

The Indians' shooting tapered off to 46 per cent in the 2nd half. But they held Hartland to 40 per cent. Arrowhead out-rebounded Kewaskum, 32-23.

In other Scenic action Friday, Grafton had to put down a late rally to remain unbeaten and squeeze out a 63-60 victory over surprising Mayville, Kettle Moraine thumped Slinger, 56-40, and Germantown edged last place Pewaukee, 79-75.

The Indians will resume action after the holidays with a home game against Slinger on Jan. 10.

County Declared Disaster Area For Crop Losses

Washington County is one of seven additional counties which has been declared a disaster area, making it eligible for special agricultural loans and programs, Governor Patrick J. Lucey announced.

Lucey requested the disaster area status from Agriculture Secretary Earl Butz on Nov. 20 because of crop losses caused by killing frosts on Sept. 21 and 22. Approximately 25,000 acres of corn, soybeans and peas were affected.

Butz's office told Lucey that farmers in the county can now apply to their Farmers Home Administration office for low-cost disaster loans. Farmers should contact the FmHA office in West Bend, tel. 414-334-7850.

"I am delighted the federal government has moved to provide disaster assistance to this area's farmers hit by one of the most difficult growing seasons in years," Lucey said.

"At a time when the world is becoming more and more concerned about an adequate food supply, we must work hard to insure the continued vitality of the foundation of our nation's agricultural community—the family farmer."

Lucey has requested disaster area status for 57 Wisconsin counties this year because of severe crop losses. Butz has granted 33 of those requests.






