5 Firemen Complete Emergency Medical Training



Lately most news stories are about bad things that are happening, so we would like to tell about some of the good that's going on in the community.

Currently there are 18 members of the 45-member Kewaskum Fire Dept. on the rescue squad. Five members of the squad have completed the Emergency Medical Training and received their licenses at the department's recent banquet held at Hon-E-Kor Country Club. They are Lieutenant Don Ebnert, squad leader (lower center), Mike Fierke (upper right), Paul Behring (lower left), Oscar Knoeck (lower right) and Andy Pesch (upper left). This is a 25-week course with no chance of being ab-

sent. These classes were held at West Bend. If a class is missed it must be made up at some other class currently being held in the State of Wisconsin.

Presently, Ronald Sarauer, Larry Williams and Jim Staehler are also enrolled in the E.M.T. course.

The ten remaining men have taken Advanced First Aid Training and all have received their cards. As yet they have not quite arranged to fit the 25-week no-miss course into their present day busy schedule, but are nonetheless just as dedicated as the certified E.M.T.'s.

The squad, as a whole, has helped many people with injuries and has saved countless lives, which takes the ac-

tion of a concerned individual. All are volunteers.

The rescue squad has a fully equipped ambulance, including a radio-telephone communication with three hospitals — West Bend, Fond du Lac and Sheboygan. It also meets Paramedic specifications. They also have an older ambulance for back-up.

Many communities, mostly larger than Kewaskum, are striving to start a service such as this, which Kewaskum already has.

The rescue squad has been in existence since 1949.

Residents of the Kewaskum area are indeed fortunate in having this specialized emergency medical training available.

BUDGET ON SCHOOL MEETING AGENDA

The regular meeting of the Kewaskum Board of Education will be held Monday, Feb. 24, beginning at 8 p. m. Included on the agenda will be a presentation by Mr. Brenholt of an estimated budget for 1975-76, based on the Governor's state budget proposal. All Dogs Must Be Licensed by Feb. 28

All dogs in Washington County, over 5 months of age, must be licensed by Feb. 28. After this date, if no license is obtained, owners will be reported to the District Attorney. State Statute 174.10 provides for a maximum penalty of \$500.00 for harboring an unlicensed dog. Officers may enter the premises of the owner to seize an unlicensed dog. The license fee is \$1.00 for male and spayed female dogs and \$2.00 for female dogs. Some municipalities charge additional fees.

This dog license may be obtained from your local treasurer - the treasurer of the town, village or city in which you reside. Payment for the license can be made when real estate taxes are paid.

It is not necessary for local treasurers to remind dog owners that they must obtain a license. This is the responsibility of the dog owner.

The Indians broke even in two games on the road the past week. Injuries were a factor in the loss with Jim Bilgo still out of action with a hairline fracture and Mike Koenke having an injured knee. Therefore his 8 points were off of his 15 point average. The Indians hit just 3 of 16 from the field in the 1st quarter, their worst effort of the year.

In other Scenic games Friday Grafton kept its lead by barely beating a tough Mayville team, 50-45. Kettle Moraine won over Slinger, 63-59, in another close one, and Germantown edged last place Pewaukee, 67-66.

The Kewaskum JV's won their 6th in a row at Hartland, 53-49, with a big 4th quarter in which they scored 21 points. Leon Laatsch again played strong game and scored 18 points but top honors went to improving Ray Reindl with 19.
