J. O. Reigle Scholarship Recipients Announced

Regal Ware, Inc. has announced that Julaine Bier and Ralph Butz are the 1975 recipients of the J. O. Reigle Scholarship Awards. The awards, in the amount of \$2,000, are offered yearly to the graduating class of Kewaskum High School and will provide each of the recipients with \$500 per year over a full four-year college program.

Julaine, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Leroy C. Bier, R. 2, Kewaskum, has compiled an outstanding academic record during her four-year high school career, as evidenced by her honor roll standing and membership in the National Honor Society. In addition to her scholastic accomplishments, Julaine is active in a variety of extracurricular activities, including German Club, Ski Club, AFS, FTA, Band, Choir, Madrigal Singers, Spanish Club,

play productions and the newspaper and yearbook staffs. Her outside activities include the St. Lucas Young People's Society, church choir and 4-H. According to her tentative plans, Julaine will attend the UW-Washington County Campus for two years before transferring to UW-Oshkosh or UW-LaCrosse to pursue a major in mass communications or journalism.

Ralph Butz, son of Mr. and Mrs. Vernon Butz, 1325 Parkview Drive, Kewaskum, has also compiled an outstanding academic record at Kewaskum High School, finishing number one in his class. He is also a member of the National Honor Society, the Honor Roll, and North Central Evaluation Committee. Ralph was also a member of the Kewaskum High School "Who Knows" team

that won the 1974 Championship on the popular Channel 6 high school instant-recall game show. His other extracurricular activities include cross country, Chess Club, play productions and he was a representative to Badger Boy's State. His outside activities include Boy Scouts and the local Catholic Youth Organization. Ralph intends to enroll at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and pursue a major in chemical engineering.

The J. O. Reigle Scholarships, named in honor of Regal Ware's late Board Chairman and Founder, were established in 1963 to recognize the outstanding achievements of one or more students from each graduating class at Kewaskum High School, and to assist them in the pursuit of a meaningful college education.

School Board Decides Against Summer School; Add 1 Teacher

The Kewaskum Board of Education decided at its meeting Monday evening not to hold summer school this year, with the exception of the screening program and possibly classroom driver education. Behind-the-wheel will be offered. The uncertainty of the state budget situation relative to summer school was a major factor in the decision.

A motion to add back two Middle School teaching positions was defeated on a 3-2 vote, but a motion to add back one teacher was passed 7-0. Discussion was also held on the possibility of a Middle School graduation, but no motion was made for it, and the consensus of the Board was to not begin it this year but to consider it again for future years.

The question of allowing the Kewaskum baseball team to sell beer at its games was raised. No action was taken because the Village Board

had had no opportunity to act on the question. A building report was given. Work is proceeding on the high school addition, with bleachers and floor now being worked on.

May meeting dates were left as originally scheduled. These dates are May 12 and 26. The question was raised because May 26 is Memorial Day.

A parent contract was approved to transport a child for the remainder of the school year. Jerry Secor and Tom Gundrum will participate in graduation ceremonies this year.

The bus contract is up for renewal for next year. Byron Gessner and Jim Oelhafen will meet with Johnson Bus representatives to begin work on the question. The Board adjourned to executive session to discuss negotiations, salaries and personnel questions.

KHS Sends 32 Entries to State Music Contest

On Saturday, April 12, Kewaskum participated in a district solo and ensemble contest held at the high school in Germantown. The band and choir students did exceptionally well, receiving 34 firsts in class A, 2 not going to state, 44 seconds, and only 8 thirds.

There were 7 class B entries that received firsts, 20 seconds and 7 third ratings. In class C Kewaskum received 2 firsts, 4 seconds, and a third rating.

On Saturday, May 3, 32 of our Class A first entries will participate in State Solo and Ensemble at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh.
