All participants in the parade are asked to be at the high school no later than 8:45 o'clock. All Legion members please participate in the parade.

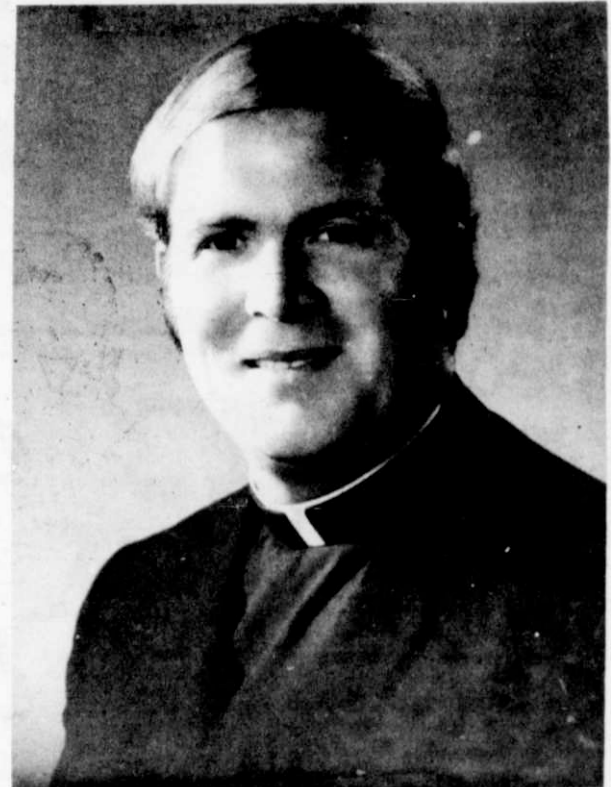
## BOARD OF EDUCATION WILL MEET MONDAY
