KRAZY DAZE Tuesday to Be Bargain and Fun Time

The 13th annual Krazy Daze sidewalk sale and fun event sponsored by the Kewaskum Chamber of Commerce and participating businessmen will be held next Tuesday, July 22, from 9 a. m. to 9 p. m. with the merriment continuing well after that hour. Rain date is Wednesday, July 23.

Krazy is the word for it as merchants, clubs, churches, organizations, and individuals will set up and display their wares in booths and stands on the sidewalks and lots on the main streets of the village as well as offer discounts in their stores. This "day of daze" is the major sales promotion and fun day of the year in the village. Very special and unusual bargains galore will be offered by cooperating merchants.

Among the various wares and displays set up along the streets will be just about every type of merchandise available at reduced and ridiculous prices. Firemen's Picnic Is Huge Success

The Kewaskum Firemen's annual picnic Sunday was one of the most successful ever held with the gross receipts surpassing those of past years. The weather was fair during the daytime but cooled off considerably at night.

Thousands of people came to Kewaskum to participate in the festivities, lining the streets for another outstanding parade and enjoying the picnic throughout the remainder of the day. Spectators who witnessed the parade had nothing but praise for it and said it was easily the finest ever held. There must have been more than 100 units in the parade which lasted over one hour and 15 minutes. It featured numerous drum and bugle corps, bands, other musical organizations, beautiful floats, drill teams, baton twirlers, Tripoli Motorcycle Club of Milwaukee, race cars, clowns, Indians, comic entries, children's specialties, ancient automobiles, horseback riders, neighboring firemen, and many other units.

Following the parade the presentation of the official bicentennial flag to Kewaskum officials was made in the park, several drum and bugle corps performed and the Beaver Dam Music Center accordianists gave a concert. Music during the afternoon and evening from the

stage and in the beer garden was supplied by the Joe Karman and Ferd Buchel bands of Milwaukee. A rope pulling contest was held at 6 p. m. across the river with the losing team ending up in the water. At 6:30 the popular water fights were held. There was continuous entertainment.

The theme for floats in the parade this year was "Kewaskum's Heritage" and there were some excellent entries. Prize winners were: 1. Winnebago FS of Kewaskum, \$100; 2. Resurfacing of Hwy. 45 South of Village Starts

Road construction started this week on U.S.H. 45 from Greentree Road in Barton to the bridge just south of Kewaskum. This work will consist of resurfacing the existing pavement and the construction of right turn lanes at intersections with large turning movements. Also included in this project is the upgrading of the beam guard and the installation of thermoplastic centerline pavement marking.

The work will be performed by Payne & Dolan of Wisconsin, Inc., of Waukesha. The total cost of the contract is estimated at \$208,959.36. Financing will be shared on approximately a 70-30 percentage by Federal and State funds, respectively, provided primarily by gas taxes. Donald Kiefert of Rubicon will be the project engineer for the Wisconsin Division of Highways. The project is expected to be completed by mid-August.

This work will be done under traffic with both directions of traffic being routed over a single lane through the construction zone. Motorists are urged to be aware of the flagmen and use caution in the construction zone.

Laubenstein Lawn & Garden Mart to Expand

Laubenstein Lawn & Garden Mart, located on 8755 Prospect Drive just south of Kewaskum, announces a major expansion program.

The work involved will add a 42 x 96 addition to the existing building and when completed will enlarge the showroom and parts department, also a new 42 x 40 repair shop, with the remaining area to be used as a warehouse.

Also one existing building will be moved in order to allow for a 100 x 150 foot additional parking area.

A Grand Opening is being planned for late fall.

Parking during construction may be limited, however, Laubenstein's will remain open for business throughout the construction period.

Kewaskum Presented With Official Bicentennial Flag at Picnic

An added feature at the firemen's picnic Sunday was the presentation to Kewaskum officials with an official bicentennial flag, which was awarded by the American Revolution Bicentennial Association in Washington, D. C. since Kewaskum has been recognized as a Bicentennial Community for its role in celebrating the nation's 200th birthday.

The flag was presented by Professor Robert E. Gard of the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Prof. Gard, noted author on over 40 books on folklore in Wisconsin, rode in the Kewaskum parade, and afterwards spoke from the stage in the park and presented Kewaskum officials with an official bicentennial flag. Gard was a participant in the state centennial of 1948, and he is presently a member of Governor Lucey's Bicentennial Commission.

Receiving the flag for the village was L. N. Peterson, Kewaskum's bicentennial chairman. Village President Charles Miller, and Gilbert Sauer, chairman of the Washington County Bicentennial Committee. The flag was raised by Erv Bullette, commander of the Kewaskum American Legion Post. Mark Smucker, who is writing a history of the village, also participated in the ceremonies.

Kewaskum qualified for receiving the flag because of compliance with bicentennial recommendations for Heritage '76, Festivals '76 and Horizons '76.

Under the Heritage head-

ing Kewaskum has formed a new historical society, and Smucker's history of the village and a pledge to mark historical sites also come under this heading. Festivals '76 will include the promotion of flag flying, a worship week and a pageant sponsored by the Junior and Senior Women's Clubs. Under Horizons '76, the village is holding a contest for the design of an official Kewaskum flag, will place a new welcome sign at the village limits, and the historical society is offering prizes for restorations in the village. There are plans, too, for the construction of a building in the village's new park. School children will donate coins for bricks for the new building.

AFS Student Sends Letter From Iran

David Ayer, who is spending the summer in Tehran, Iran, as Kewaskum's AFS student, has written the following letter:

June 29, P. M.
Dear Mom and Dad,
I am now in Iran. The fatigue of the trip is still with me. Here follows an account, much abbreviated, of the JOURNEY.

June 24th, the trip from Milwaukee to N.Y. was uneventful for the most part. Arriving at LGA, we (there were about 12 of us on the flight!) picked up our baggage and - green sheets in hand - were joined by another dozen at JFK which, by the way, could hold two (2) Kewaskums with ease. After 1½ hours there, we went on to Post College several miles away. This was in the village section of N.Y., where hillsides of trees are still present. Here, we were broken up into countries to wait until 7:00 for orientation, which all took place on campus.

June 25th, more orientation, and we left the campus at 4:15, waited around a "few" hours, and left JFK at 7:45 via a 747. There were two (2) groups of us going to Iran. Our group consisted of 12. The other, of 13, was to leave on the 24th but the consulate in N.Y. had misplaced the passports and they had to wait one more day. Only one girl had a passport, and left alone. This hangup, because the flight was commercial, cost A.F.S. \$9,000! The trip to Amsterdam was 6½ hours, only 1½ of which were night. We could not sleep, and arrived at Amsterdam at 7:15 a. m. THEIR time on the 26th, to spend 5 hours inside the airport. Then we left for Athens, but stayed inside the place for one hour, and on to Beirut. We were there for one day, and saw much, but we were restricted to one area, for there was fighting in OTHER parts of the city. Beirut must be explained in person. At last, at 7:30 and two hours wait, we left for Tehran. We stayed one day at Maryon Pension (which would also take some explanation), and then, at 7:00 June 25th, we were picked up by our families. So, I am with them as I write this. Mother INSISTED that I write you immediately. They are wonderful! Afshin speaks English as well as he writes it, and he is now beginning to teach me Farsi. Maziar knows less English, but by a month I should be able to speak well with him. The house is spacious in its own way - 12 ft. ceilings, generous rooms. There is a family maid, who helps with cooking, washing, etc. The bathrooms . . . I will explain. As Afshin says, "There is a . . . difference!" I could go on forever, so allow me just a few sentences. First, it is very hot, but not humid at all, so it is livable. Second, the food is different, some VERY hard to adjust to, but the most amazing thing is the QUANTITY eaten (I will gain weight). Afshin tells me that to send you my first roll of film would take one month both ways so I won't.



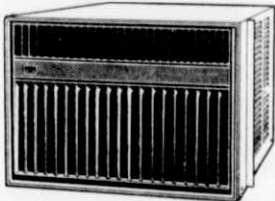

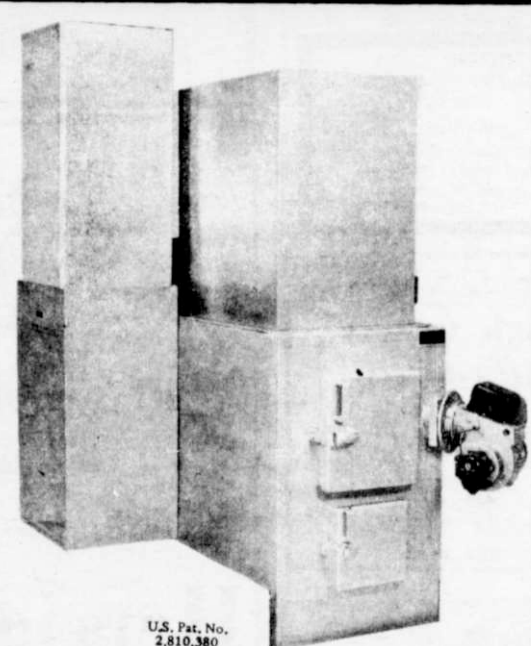
