New Owner of Local Malting Co. Questions Board on Sewer Charges

The Kewaskum Village Board meeting was held on July 21 at 8 p. m. Motion passed to accept minutes of the July 7 meeting, the adjourned meetings of July 8 and July 14.

John Kratz, new owner of Kewaskum Malting Company appeared before the board with several questions regarding sewer service charges. He stated there was a broken storm sewer between his building and the railroad tracks and contended that the broken sewer ran into the sanitary sewer and through the malt house meter. He said he has a Malting Company in West Bend and his water and sewage service bill for three months was lower than the one month bill he has received since taking over the business. The board temporarily adjourned to do an on the spot check of the troubled area. When back in session, Pete Albers, Village Engineer, explained to Kratz that since the village has built a new sewage plant under federal grant, the village is given the amount their service charge must be and includes more than just water and sewage and when Kratz explained he has checked with other surrounding Malting Companies and their bills aren't nearly as high, he was told when other communities go to new type plants, their sewage charges will be the same.

Gregor Nigh, a village trustee, also owner of Kewaskum Frozen Foods, stated he also thought village charges were out of line after he did some checking of other locker plants. Village President Charles Miller then stated charges could be open for revision. At that point, Kratz said he hoped this is true, because he would like to continue doing business in Kewaskum. After discussion it was decided the Malting Company will repair the broken storm sewer and check output from the plant.

Roger Schmitt appeared to inquire what was happening with the hay field in the Ideal Subdivision which lies behind his home and other homes in his neighborhood. The hay needs cutting and is being infested with mice which are now digging holes in the existing ground piles in the subdivision. The Village Clerk will check into the matter.

Augie Bilgo, on behalf of the Fire Department, requested action on the requisition of the new fire hose. He stated the department preferred 800 lb. test instead of 600 lb. test which would result in an increase of .03 cents per foot or a total of \$75.00. He stated the 800 lb. test has a tighter weave to the hose and would last longer. Motion by Dan Schmidt, seconded by Raynor Herriges to authorize the Equipment Committee of the Fire

Department to purchase 800 lb. test hose. Motion passed.

Discussion was held on two street lights on North Fond du Lac Ave. that have been inoperable for some time. A short in the electrical cable is the problem and the question was raised as to whose obligation it is for repair, village or Electric Company? Type of cable and if a local electrician can do repairs will be checked into.

Motion by Schmidt, seconded by Gregor Nigh to accept a building permit application from Building Associates of West Bend for a one family residence in Roseland Hills, Addition No. 2.

Plans and specification for curbing in Ideal Subdivision have been received from Arthur & Arthur Engineering Firm. Motion by Roger Strack, seconded by Herriges to authorize the village clerk to place ads advertising for bids for construction of curbing. Board will notify property owners in the area affected of curb charge.

Still no word from J. Roger Miller Associates of Sheboygan on soil test borings from the new park. Clerk William Martin will call and inquire as to the delay in receiving results. Trustee Elmer Yoost stated this should all be straightened out by the next meeting. As soon as results are in, digging for the pool could be started.

Village President Charles Miller requested the board to approve a resolution which will be sent to the Council General of Venezuela which in part would state that the Village of Kewaskum would request that John Andrade of Venezuela, who would be a student at Kewaskum High School this fall, also brother of Ivan Andrade, former AFS Student at Kewaskum, be allowed to use the remaining one year of a five year visa issued to Ivan. John was to come to the United States and to Kewaskum this week but his country will not issue a new visa. His brother Ivan has completed a four year college course at Carroll College in less than the usual four years, thus having a year left on his visa. Ivan is returning to Venezuela. John would be staying with the Benzschawel family of Beechwood. Herriges made the motion to approve the resolution and Strack seconded. Motion passed and resolution will be sent.

Trustee Schmidt stated he has received complaint of tree branches on the greenway next to the sidewalk being so low. People walking get hit with the branches. He requested board members to make a check of different areas of the village and bring a list of areas to the next meeting so a letter can be sent to property owners advising them to trim trees.

The Jamboree will be host-

Monty will spend July 29 to Aug. 7 at the Jamboree before beginning the Nordic tour.

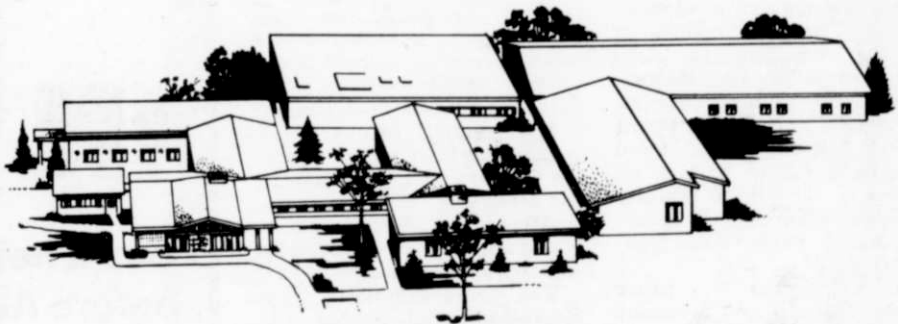
