School Board Approves Special Education Teacher, Two Bands

Approval was given at the Kewaskum School Board meeting Monday night for employing a teacher of students with learning problems related to emotional difficulties. The teacher will work with students in grades 7-9, since a program of this type is already operating at the elementary level.

Teachers of children with special educational needs has been a board topic for some time. The state law requires that districts serve children beginning at age three who have been diagnosed to have a special learning problem. By the same law, all licensed employees of a district are required to refer for diagnosis any students they feel may have a learning disability. The Kewaskum board has been discussing local needs with Mr. VandeVrede, the school psychologist in charge of Kewaskum special education programs. The new position was created for second semester if a good candidate is available. If not, the position may be filled next fall.

In other business, the board approved a contract with the Wisconsin Association of School Boards for a negotiator for this year. The rates are \$5 per hour more this year than last.

The second meeting in December was cancelled as has been true in most years in December.

A change was noted in secretary and aide salaries. No changes were made in hourly rates, but the categories of full-time school year secretaries and that of aides were combined. The change was made retroactive to the beginning of the school year.

Proposals made for changing the high school curriculum were approved. These would include dropping

Drafting III and Plastics II and Minorities and World Affairs. Additional classes to be offered are Music Theory, Psychology and a Building Trades Course. A requirement that all students take English 9 and 10 was approved, and approval also was given to having two high school bands next year rather than one. The number of students in band is increasing, and Mr. Ammel felt the group could be split.

Three parent transportation contracts were approved for transporting children to St. John's in Newburg.

The board voted to place Walt Bade at the Bachelor's plus 30 column of the salary schedule and Chet Czoschke at the Master's plus 10 level.

A closed session was held prior to the regular meeting to discuss a grievance and the secretary-aide salary schedule. The board also went into closed session following the meeting to discuss negotiations, a personnel question, and the annual board-superintendent evaluation session.

production for West Bend Mutual for the entire Wisconsin territory.

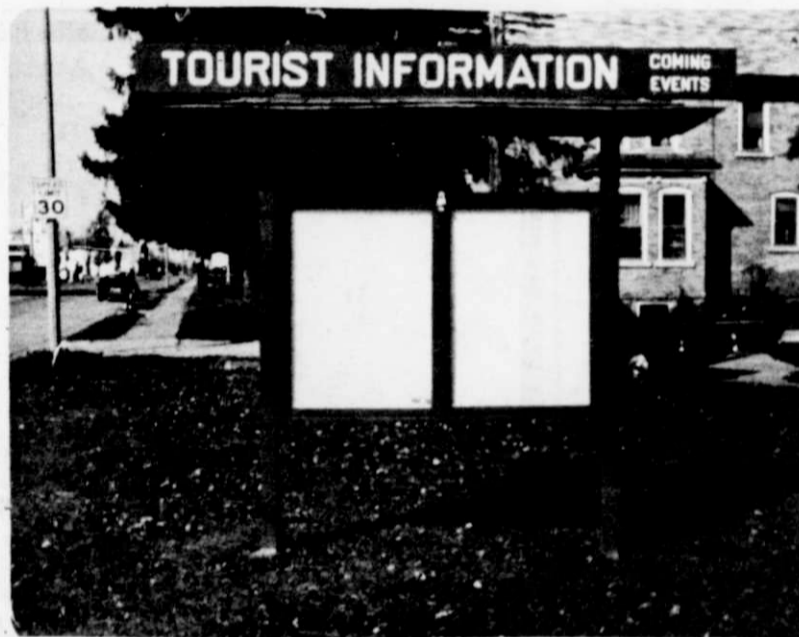

Town Kewaskum Tax Rate Set at \$18.80 Per \$1,000

The net rate of the Town of Kewaskum's tax bills will be \$18.80 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, compared to the 1974 net rate of \$17.46. The assessed valuation for 1975 is \$14,847,759.

The 1975 tax rate is .000215 for state taxes, .003334 for county taxes, .001000 for town taxes, and .015485 for Kewaskum schools, handicapped tuition and the technical school, less .001229 for state credits. The net rate amounts to .018805. State credit for personal property livestock and merchants' stock is 73% this year.

Confirm Bilgo As Chief; Table Reassessment

August Bilgo, Jr. was confirmed as Kewaskum's ninth fire chief replacing Armin Oppermann, whose death occurred in April, by the Kewaskum Village Board on Monday.

Bilgo has served as acting fire chief since that time, and is presently the superintendent of public works. He will serve as chief for five years, until the next election, and will be succeeded as assistant chief by Rick Boden.

In other action, a reassessment for the village, with the lowest bid being \$7,800 was tabled by a 6-1 vote, with trustee Dan Schmidt voting in favor. It was decided there was little that could be done this year, since no money was budgeted for the project.

A bid by Laubenstein's for a 19½ horsepower garden tractor with a 60" cutting area for \$2,135 plus trade was unanimously accepted.

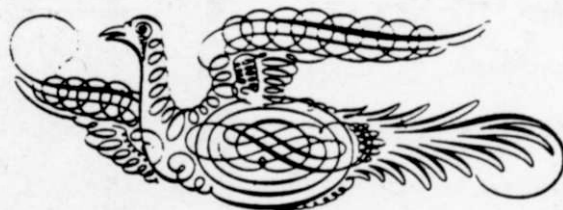

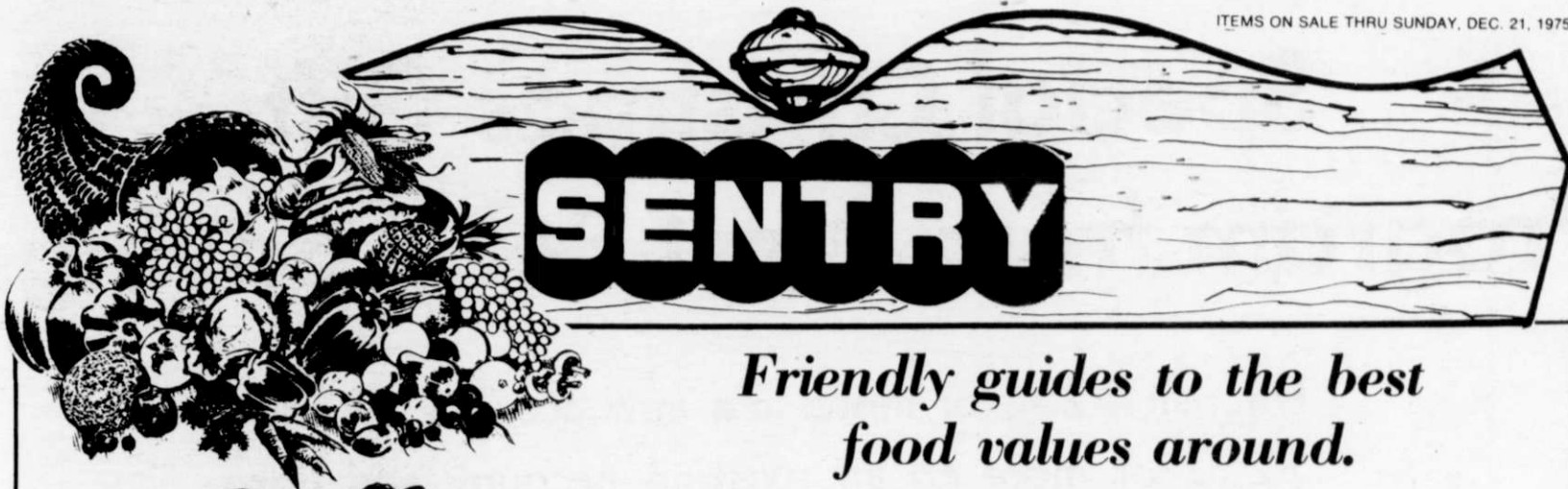
