#### House Trailer Gutted by Fire



Kewaskum firemen were called out at 1:30 p. m. Saturday to extinguish a fire which gutted a 40-foot unoccupied house trailer on Ridge Road, about 2½ miles southwest of Kewaskum.

The trailer had been used for storage of hay by Richard LeFleur and Roy Swanson on property which used to be Kettle Park.

Firemen were at the scene for about two hours fighting the blaze and pulling hay from the trailer. The fire appeared to be electrical, according to Fire Chief Augie Bilgo, Jr., who reported it concentrated where wires led into the trailer.

Firemen were delayed a few minutes in getting to the scene of the fire by a long freight train which was passing through the village and prevented them from crossing the tracks. The firemen

were called in six degree weather with high winds, blowing snow and slippery

The firemen were called back to the scene early Sunday morning when some of the removed hay apparently began to flare up again.

## Three Properties Annexed by Village Board, Another Tabled

Annexation petitions for property totalling about four acres just south of the present village limits were approved unanimously by the Kewaskum Village Board on Monday.

The petitions were submitted by Roger Strack, for a gas station, Joseph Butschlick for his home, and Howard Laubenstein for his lawn and garden center and home. After a waiting period of forty days, the board may pass the ordinance needed to make the annexation official.

A petition filed by Drs. Cesar and Aurora Sison to annex 4.5 acres east of Highway 45, just south of the village limits was tabled since several property owners near the property have not yet decided whether or not to join in as well.

Three of the properties would be completely surrounded by village land if the Sison property is annexed, forming an "island." State statutes give the village the right to force this land to be annexed, but this is not being done. Instead, those three owners and three other families living nearby were given the option to join the village if they wished.

Two citizens involved by the annexation appeared before the board to ask what would be gained by joining the village. Various replies received included faster police protection, sewer and water, and garbage collection. The matter should be consid-

ered again in two weeks, at the next village board meet-

Commissioner William Martin announced that bids will be opened for the new firehouse on February 4, 1976, instead of January 15 as previously announced. The date was changed because plans necessary to submit bids which were to be prevared by the architects, were not completed in time.

Building permits were granted to St. Lucas Lutheran Church to remodel the parsonage, to Larry Meyer, and Kewaskum Frozen Foods.

#### Water Main Breaks In Cold Weather

Village workmen were called out in zero weather early Sunday morning, about 12:30 a.m., when a water main broke at Hillside and Brooklane Drives on the west side of the village.

Water flowed down Brooklane Dr. for several blocks from the bursted main before the crews arrived to shut off the flow of water. The water froze, leaving icy streets, and a number of area residents were without water temporarily. By Sunday noon the problem was repaired.

It was reported this was the sixth water main break in the village recently.

The weatherman predicted temperatures of 5 to 15 degrees below zero for Wednesday night following Tuesday's snow.

# School Board to Meet Monday

The regular meeting of the Kewaskum Board of Education will be held on Monday, January 12, 1976 at 8 p.m. in the administrative office.

Included on the agenda will be a policy on sex discrimination which includes a grievance procedure and a district designee to handle complaints or questions. This is a requirement under Federal law.

Other agenda items are consideration of a request by Sharon Miller to be allowed to graduate at the end of her junior year, a letter of resignation from Mrs. Loberger and a report from Clark Pearson on preparations for the visit of the North Central committee and board participation. A newly enacted charge by Honeck Chevrolet of \$1.00 per day per car for driver education vehicles will be considered.

A special meeting will be set to certify candidates for the board election. The deadline for filing a declaration of candidacy is 5 p.m. Tuesday, January 13.

A committee on wages of classified employees will be appointed. Miscellaneous items which arise will also be considered.

In executive session following the regular meeting, the board will discuss negotiations, salary of the superintendent and consideration of individual personnel matters.

#### Esser Presented State Award



Roy J. Esser, a Vocational Agricultural teacher in the Kewaskum school system, has been recognized by the Wisconsin Chapter. Soil Conservation Society of America, for outstanding contributions to the science and art of good land use.

The award will be presented during the annual meeting of the Wisconsin Chapter on Friday, January 9, at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point.

Esser has had an outstanding record in promoting the art of good land use. He has been extremely active in the promotion and supervision of soil and water conservation projects.

During his 23 teaching years, he has informed the students that the soil unit in

the curriculum is the most important contribution if you are a potential farmer or an urban citizen. He has trained and worked with state soil judging teams and has served as chairman of the State Soil Judging Committee.

Over 1,000 soil and water conservation district cooperators were either directly or indirectly stimulated to participate in the program through adult classes, students in school, or by personal contact.

Roy's conservation accomplishments are extensive and involve many areas of interest such as: (1) promoted wildlife plantings on farms, (2) chaperoned 13 different groups to Trees for Tomorrow, (3) worked with women's groups in planting shade trees, (4) involved with planting over one-half million trees in Wisconsin, (5) presented special minicourses on ecology and agriculture, and (6) initiated and worked on the development of an outdoor classroom.

Roy is an outstanding educator and continues to foster his future goals of conservation and good land use.





West Bend's Lithias handed Kewaskum its first defeat with a 127-124 victory in Badger School gym. Kewaskum still leads the division with a 3-1 while West Bend is tied with Slinger, both 2-2. The Falls Stingers were beaten by the Menomonee Falls Badgers, 118-106, but are still tied for first with them and Sussex with 3-1 in the A loop.
