Board Approves \$15,900 Firefighting Contract for Town of Kewaskum

A \$15,900 firefighting contract was approved between the Town and the Village of Kewaskum by the Kewaskum Village board on Monday.

The contract, which expires in December, is \$2,600 more than the one covering 1975. This cost covers 15 fires, after which an individual charge per fire is made. A firefighting agreement also exists with portions of the Town of Auburn, which does not expire until July 1.

Fire Chief August Bilgo examined the contract and found it to be identical to last year's except for the cost increase, which was caused by a rise in the increased valuation of the property in the township. The money received from these contracts goes into a fund which is used to help defray the cost of the new firehouse and fire engine purchased by the fire department.

The release of \$9,600 belonging to Ideal Land, Inc. which the village is holding in order to guarantee the work that they did in the Ideal Subdivision was proper, was tabled. A meeting between the subdividers and representatives of the village was scheduled for next week to settle the matter.

Both parties disagree on whether or not any village approval was ever granted, with the subdividers claiming that it must have been, or else building permits could not have been issued. Superintendent of Public Works August Bilgo was reported to be dissatisfied with the work that was done in the subdivi-

vision.

An anticipated \$17,000 in revenue sharing funds for next year were planned for use in the areas of public protection and recreation, as was done in the past. Ten thousand dollars will be budgeted in the area of public safety, with the remainder going to fund the summer recreation program.

The hiring of Ruben Oppermann as part time patrolman as requested by Chief Donald Hlavaty at a salary of \$3.50 per hour was also approved.

The board will hold its next meeting on Wednesday, May 19, so that they can attend a meeting of the League of Wisconsin Municipalities meeting on May 17, their regular meeting date.

May Apply for Dr. Edwards Scholarships

Applications for the first Dr. R. G. Edwards Memorial Scholarship Awards are available at Kewaskum High School now. These application forms will be accepted until May 15, 1976.

High school graduates who have a "B" grade average and live in the Kewaskum Community Schools District are eligible to apply if they are continuing their education in a health career area. Present plans call for two \$300 scholarships this year.

Many scholarships are awarded each year by Kewaskum clubs, organizations and industries.

Two KHS Girls Receive A's in State Forensics

Two Kewaskum High School girls received A ratings in the state forensics meet held at the University of Wisconsin in Madison.

Senior Julie LaFleur received an A for her reading of poetry while Gay Olson, a junior, duplicated the effort in the significant speech department.

Another student who had qualified for the meet, sophomore Renee Slegler, was awarded a B for her presentation in declamation.

It was Miss Olson's second straight A in the state meet, while the other two were making their first appearance.

Coaches of the Kewaskum team this year were William Carpenter and Mrs. Barbara York. Carpenter was well pleased with the season's results highlighted by the state A's and the team's second place in the Scenic Moraine conference. The three who competed in state were among some 800 other high school students in the meet.

Andre Wins Award in State Writers Contest

An Honorable Mention certificate was awarded to James Andre, 9375 Old Fond du Lac Rd., Kewaskum, at the spring conference of the Wisconsin Regional Writers Association in Madison May 1. Andre won the award for his entry in the 1976 YARNS OF YESTERYEAR Contest entitled "The Summer of '32". An honorable mention was also received by Arnold A. Wild, R. 3, Campbellsport, in the contest.

The contest, whose theme was OUR DOORYARD HISTORY, 1776-1976, was sponsored by the University of Wisconsin Extension Programs on Aging and the Wisconsin Regional Writers Association as a bicentennial event.

More than 600 senior citizens, ranging in age from 60 to 96 sent entries reminiscing about their early lives. They told of pioneer farming, "Penny Auctions" and "riding the rods" during the depression, pie socials and family medical remedies like the asafetida bag. Some submitted essays telling of the "Gift I Would Like to Give My Country on its 200th Birthday."

Judges for the contest were: Jill Dean, editor of Wisconsin Trails; Doris Platt, supervisor of museum education for the Wisconsin State Historical Society; Frank Custer, history buff and feature writer for the Capital Times; James Batt, executive director of the Wisconsin Academy of Sciences, Arts and Letters; and Clarice Dunn, free lance writer and former director of the YARNS OF YESTERYEAR contest.

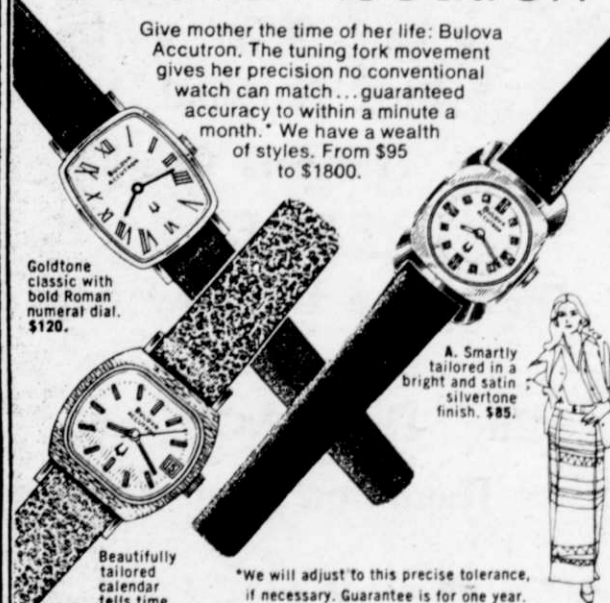

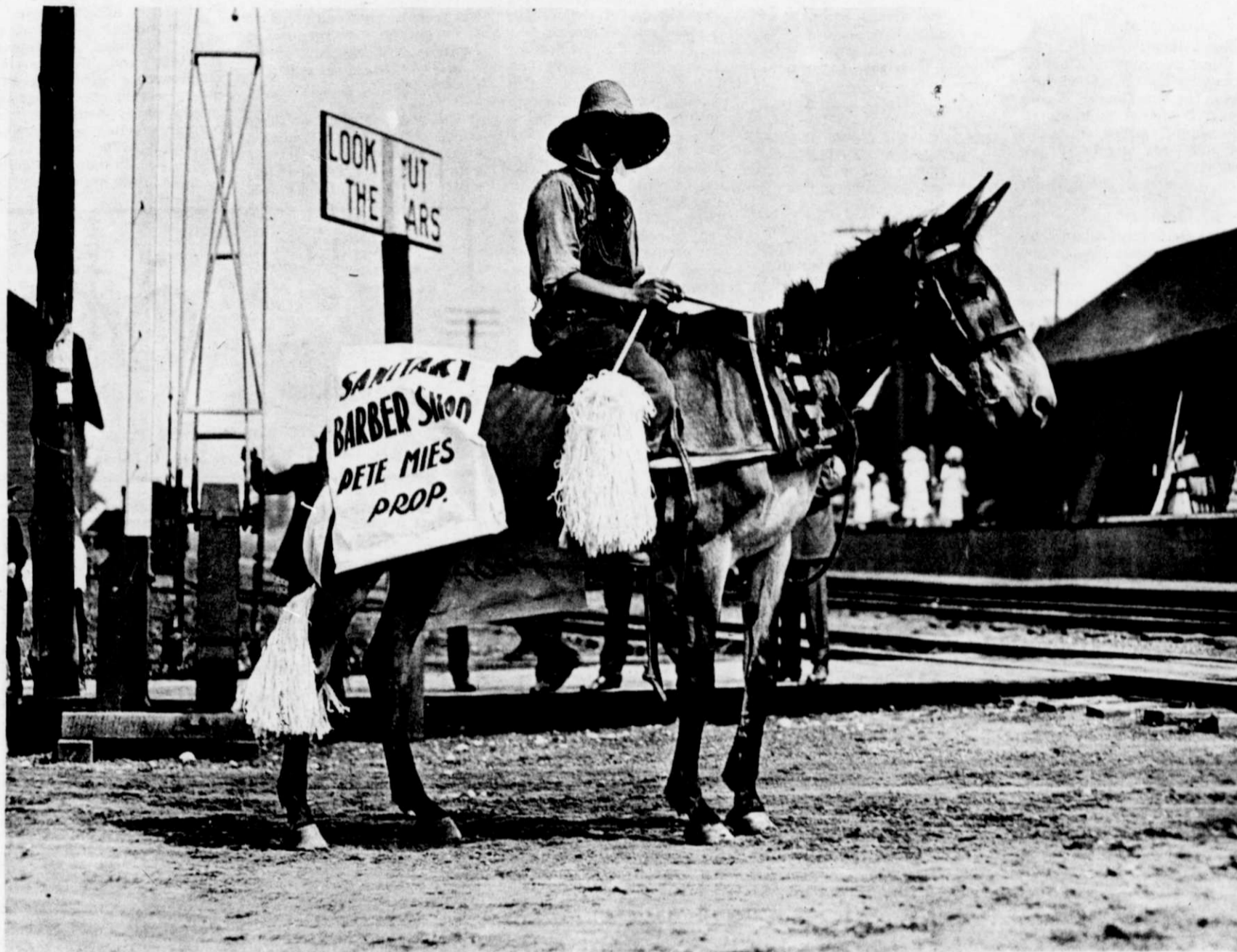

Adult Classes to Obtain High School Diploma Offered

Area adults wishing to obtain a high school equivalency diploma may enroll in the Moraine Park District Adult Basic Education classes now. Tuition is free.
