During the year, the club carried on a safety education program. They had a member of the Kewaskum rescue squad demonstrate health procedures and showed their rescue vehicle. During the course of the year, the members of the club made posters on safety. The year long program resulted in a greater awareness by the members of their own health and how to deal with accidents.

The special 4-H club safety recognition program is sponsored by the Milwaukee Journal. It is intended to provide encouragement to 4-H clubs to carry on safety education activities. The membership adopted two programs; one calling for a study of the food stamp program and its outreach effort, and the second for a "know your community" study of certain areas in Washington County.

The state positions were arrived at by a consensus of views from the local chapters.

They include both establishing minimum standards for operating county jails and minimum training requirements for jail personnel. The league also believes jails should be operated separately from Sheriffs' departments.

The LWV also endorsed decriminalizing non-commercial sex between consenting adults, as well as decriminalizing possession of small amounts of marihuana.

This is the first notice of possible tornadoes. The size of the area in which tornado spawning conditions prevail is usually 140 miles wide and 200-300 miles long. This notice means "keep alert."

Tornado Warning

Once such a storm has been sighted and/or reported by the public moving at an indicated speed in a specific direction and verified by radar this warning is given to public officials. It means they should notify their local media and put into play any warning systems that may exist in a community. To the public this "warning" means take cover, usually in the southwest corner of the basement.



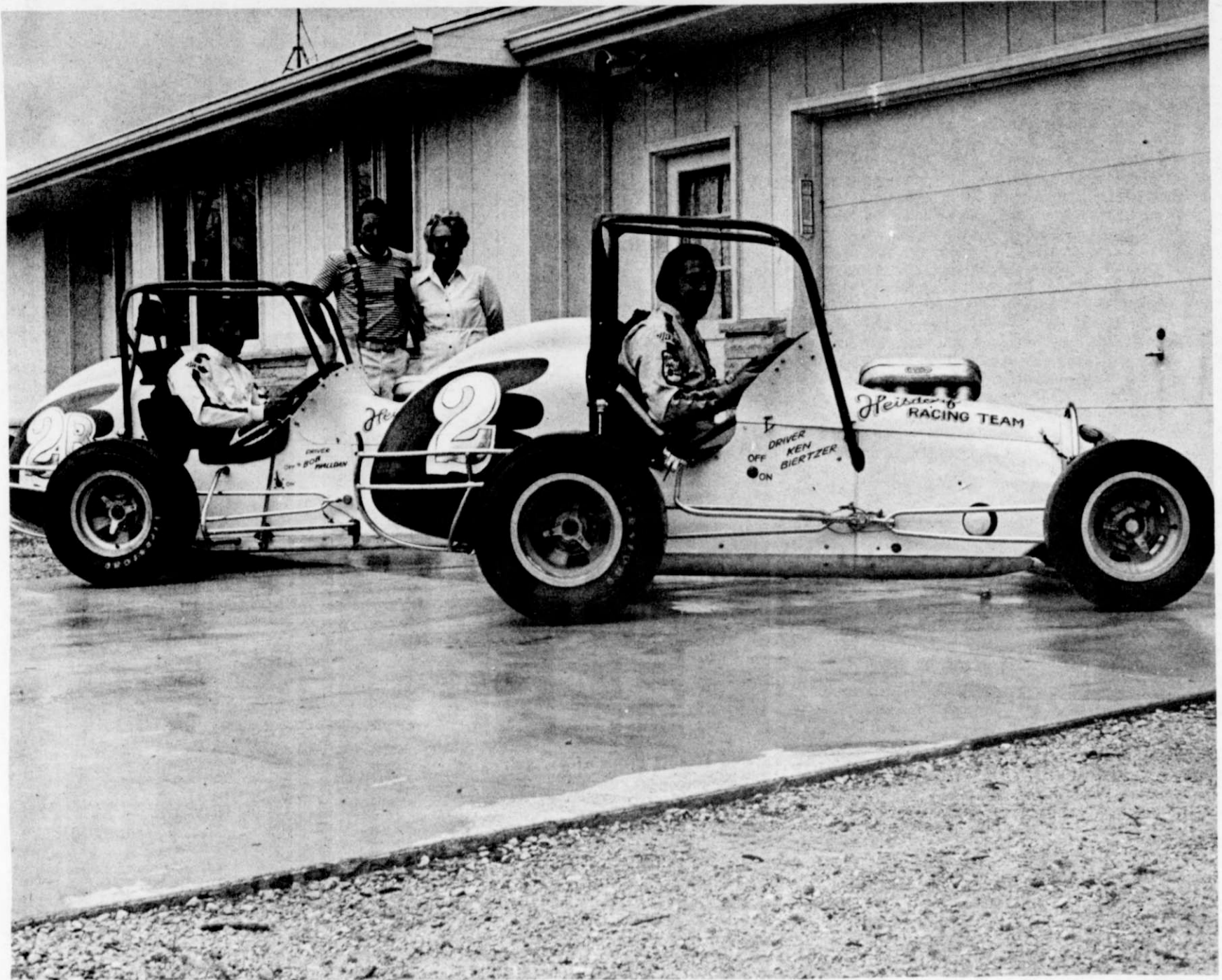
