## Grand Opening of Kewaskum Museum Is Largely Attended

(Due to a film development problem, we were unable to publish the museum opening photos this week).

"I'm very happy about the whole thing. The attendance has been great," commented Dan Schmidt, president of the Kewaskum Historical Society, following the grand opening of the society's museum, located at 1202 Parkview Drive, on Saturday.

Following a speech by president Schmidt, "Mayor" Charles Miller added a few words of his own and then cut the ribbon officially opening the museum at 10 a. m. In addition to the society's members, about 75 people were on hand for the ceremony, including Jan Koch, representing the Kewaskum Bicentennial Committee, and Margaret Hawig, representing the Washington County Historical Society.

Speaking for County Bicentennial Committee Chairman Gilbert Sauer, Mrs. Koch offered her congratulations on a job well done, and praised all the "marvelous donors" which helped make the museum complete. She also advised the society that it would receive a certificate of recognition for its work.

About 325 people visited

the former village garage on Saturday, with 240 more on Sunday, and 250 on Monday for a grand total of 815 for the three day grand opening.

There are eight different displays upstairs, and a floor space measuring 26 feet by 48 feet, including an office and post office furnished mostly with donations by the Harry Koch family, a schoolroom with desks in the old Boltonville school and blackboard donated by Gerald Stoffel, a parlor with an antique piano donated by Marvin Johann, a kitchen complete

with woodburning stove and crank telephone, and a bedroom which has a rope bed, donated by Jim Paul, a hand-made quilt, and an old wedding dress and tuxedo.

The general store has many smaller items in it, including an old fashioned set of scales. In it, visitors can purchase the society's two membership buttons, the book on Kewaskum's history, and toys being sold by the Kewaskum Bicentennial Committee. In addition, the museum even has an outdoor privy, donated by Merv Thompson. There is also a firehouse display which can boast of having Kewaskum's first piece of fire equipment, an 1884 Rimmel hand pumper on loan from the Kewaskum Fire Department.

The downstairs contains a farm display, which includes some plows, hand tools, and even a still, donated by the Ron Markus family.

Some of the other major items on display include a rolltop desk provided by the village, a loom donated by Mrs. "Chesty" Ramthun that is owned by Otto Backus, a fanning mill and miscellaneous tools provided by Syl Kedinger, a "Never Tip Bobled" provided by Weasler Manufacturing, and some cabinetmaking tools provided by Miller's of Kewaskum.

relay team that included former Olympian and present Illinois Congressman, Ralph Metcalf. The team won three national A.A.U. championships and set a world's record.

An ardent conservationist, Sengpiel has developed a private wildlife refuge on his property, located near Kewaskum. During the past six years, he has built homes for local wildlife, put in over 16,000 feet of hedgerows for wildlife cover, constructed three wildlife ponds and over 450 feet of ditches for ducks, raised and released over 100 pheasants a year and planted 100,000 trees. In 1973, Sengpiel was awarded the Washington County Kiwanis Wildlife and Conservation Award for his work in this area. In the past, Sengpiel has also

been active in Boy Scouts for over 30 years and was awarded the Silver Beaver for his service and contributions to scouting. As a dog breeder and exhibitor, his Bloodhounds, Rottweilers and Great Danes won 15 American Kennel Club championships.

Sengpiel and his wife, Geraldine, have three children and four grandchildren.

## Ms. Kempf, Mueller, Bremser Qualify for State Track Meet

In the boys' and girls' track Sectional at Mayville Friday afternoon, several Kewaskum performers qualified for this week's two-day state meet at the Madison Memorial Track.

Kewaskum's Carrie Kempf was one of the Sectional's outstanding individuals, winning the 100 in 11.5 and the 220 in 26.1 and placing second in the long jump. Her 16 foot, seven inch long jump was one-quarter inch away from giving her a triple win and it was 8-10 inches shorter than her usual 17-foot plus effort. However, she will be returning to state in all three events. Last year Carrie took second in the 100 as a sophomore.
